

Atlantic County Tees Up: Celebrate National Golf Month on Shore Greens

August is National Golf Month - a time when communities across the country celebrate the game's traditions, fresh courses, and growing local culture. Here in Atlantic County, golf is more than a summer pastime - it's woven into the region's identity. From century-old greens to seaside layouts and seaside-inspired legends, each fairway tells a story - and offers a fresh way to explore the Shore.


The story begins in Northfield, just inland from Atlantic City, at the historic Atlantic City Country Club, founded in 1897. The phrase "birdie" - one under par - was born here in 1903 after a player hit what locals called a "bird of a shot." The course also produced history on the men's side: in 1911 John J. McDermott, the club's pro and a local youth, became the first American-born champion of the U.S. Open - and defended his title in 1912. Legends like Babe Didrikson Zaharias and Sam Snead later claimed U.S. Women's Open and PGA Senior Tour titles on these grounds. Leo and Sonny Fraser - a father-son duo with deep ties to both the club and PGA leadership - cemented Atlantic County's role in shaping modern competitive golf.



McDermott's impact on golf went beyond his victories. At just 19 years old, he stunned the sport's establishment, which had been dominated by British-born pros. He remains one of the youngest U.S. Open champions in history. Tragically, McDermott's career was cut short due to mental health struggles, but his early success paved the way for American golfers on the global stage. Another key figure tied to the area is Leo Fraser, who managed the Atlantic City Country Club for decades and served as president of the PGA of America in the 1960s. Fraser was a champion of bringing more accessibility to the sport and helped guide it through the early years of televised coverage and sponsorship deals that shaped the modern tour.

Just a few miles north in Galloway Township, the Seaview Bay Course at Seaview Resort was originally sketched in 1914 by Hugh Wilson and finished by Donald Ross - a coastal layout that has played host to major championships, including a dramatic 1942 PGA Championship where Sam Snead holed a dramatic chip to win his first major. The resort housed the LPGA's ShopRite LPGA Classic for years, bringing stars like Annika Sörenstam, Betsy King, and Nancy Lopez to Shore tees.





Donald Ross's involvement is especially notable - his hand in shaping Seaview's Bay Course connects Atlantic County to the broader architectural tradition of American golf. Ross, best known for Pinehurst No. 2 and dozens of elite courses nationwide, left his signature here in the form of naturalistic bunkers, run-off areas, and green complexes designed to harness the wind coming off Reed's Bay. Seaview's fairways may be walkable and scenic, but they were built to challenge. And like Ross himself, the course rewards precision and creativity over brute strength - making it a favorite for both professionals and low-handicap locals.

For modern players, Atlantic County offers a range of landscapes and experiences. Ballamor Golf Club, Scotland Run, and Brigantine Golf Links each blend links-style bunkers, coastal marsh views, and resident reviews from local golfers who call these some of the Shore's top-rated public layouts. Brigantine's historic layout, designed in 1927 to echo Scottish coast courses, has welcomed generations of players seeking quiet views and wind-swept challenge.

During National Golf Month, players of all levels can enjoy tee times without long waitlists or hefty green fees. Atlantic County offers a welcoming mix of resort courses, semi-private layouts, and public-access fairways. PGA-certified instructors and local pros, often based at these clubs, offer lessons and clinics geared toward beginners, juniors, and weekend warriors.

Blend your round with some history: head to ACCC and find the memorial rock marking where "birdie" was coined, or walk the same dunes where early pros tested new tees, trolleying in from the Boardwalk just over a century ago. At Seaview, imagine Snead sinking that chip shot with marshland all around before he would dominate professional golf for decades.

Want to discover your own Shore green? Tee off where the wind draws sea fescue across rolling links, shadow the old trolley routes that once brought PGA stars in ties and spats, and pause at quiet coastal courses where the day ends with the scent of saltgrass on the breeze.

National Golf Month is the perfect moment to take a fresh swing at Atlantic County's storied past and present - all without ever leaving the Shore.

Phillies Weekly Recap & What's Next

Last week brought its share of drama: the Phillies split a three-game series in Chicago and now return home to begin a week-long stand at Citizens Bank Park. The defining moment came Tuesday night as Jesús Luzardo delivered a much-needed bounce-back performance. In seven smooth innings, he allowed just two hits, walked one, and struck out four, anchoring a 6-3 win over the division-rival White Sox and evening the series at one game apiece.

On the offensive side, the Phils showed power and patience. Kyle Schwarber launched his 37th homer of the season, while Brandon Marsh added a two-run shot of his own. All told, the Phillies built early momentum with small-ball in the second inning, then extended it with a three-run third. Despite a late rally from Chicago, Philadelphia held firm - thanks to Luzardo and timely hitting from Trea Turner and Marsh.

That snapshot contrasts with the series opener, where the Phillies dropped a 6-2 decision. Rookie standouts Colson Montgomery and Luís Robert Jr. sparked a Chicago comeback, combining for clutch hits - including a go-ahead homer off Cristopher Sánchez, who had been solid in previous outings.

With those results in, the Phillies sit at 61–46, trailing the Mets by just half a game in the National League East. Looking ahead, they welcome a four-game homestand including a weekend series against Detroit and mid-week games versus Baltimore.

Looking Ahead: Keys to Next Week

Philadelphia enters the first week of August with opportunity and optimism. The home slate begins Friday against Detroit, with a Friday evening opener followed by after-noon games on Saturday and Sunday. Expect strong crowds during Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, when legends including Jimmy Rollins, Greg Luzinski, and Darren Daulton return to the ballpark for appearances and in-game celebrations.

Pitching depth is the question mark, Manager Rob Thomson continues to express confidence in the existing bullpen corps, even as the July 31 trade deadline looms, With David Robertson back and starting pitchers like Cristopher Sanchez and Michael Lorenzen optioned for relief, the Phils think they can toe the stretch without a major deadline deal - but staying sharp out of the pen will be crucial.

Offensively, Bryce Harper and Kyle Schwarber carry the load. Schwarber continues to lead the team in home runs, RBIs, and OPS, while Harper hasn't slowed at the plate. If Detroit pitchers can't contain that duo, Philadelphia is well-positioned to seize control of the division.

Fans heading to Citizens Bank Park this weekend won't just catch a pivotal series -they'll also step into the heart of Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, running August 1 through 3. Friday night kicks things off with a Wall of Fame induction honoring franchise great Jimmy Rollins and former GM Ed Wade. On Saturday, the club pays tribute to late slugger Dick Allen, recently inducted into the Hall of Fame. Sunday's matinee celebrates the 75th anniversary of the 1950 NL Pennant with a special on-field tribute and a new documentary about Rollins. Throughout the weekend, alumni like Ryan Howard, Chase Utley, Cole Hamels, and Larry Bowa will make appearances, participate in in-game ceremonies, and swap bases mid-inning. Limited-edition Rollins and Allen merchandise will be available at team stores, and a signed memorabilia auction will run through August 11. With legends on the field and a packed homestand ahead, this weekend offers more than baseball - it's a full-circle celebration of Philadelphia Phillies history and pride.

Final Word

The Phillies' win in Chicago felt like a reset - and a reminder that even in a down-to-the-wire division race, this team can deliver when it counts. With healthy bats, improving pitching, and legends returning to the park for Alumni Weekend, August could be the turning point in a push toward October. Next week at home, the stage is set - and Phillies fans can feel the shift.

Stay Safe in the Surf: A Guide to Water Safety at the Jersey Shore

The Jersey Shore is synonymous with summer fun—sunny beach days, refreshing ocean dips, and thrilling surf. But as inviting as the Atlantic Ocean, bays, and inlets may seem, these waters demand respect. Each year, thousands of visitors flock to Atlantic and Cape May Counties to enjoy the shore, and knowing how to stay safe can mean the difference between a great day and a dangerous one.

Respect the Ocean's Power

The ocean at the Jersey Shore can change quickly, with shifting tides, sudden drop-offs, and powerful currents. Rip currents, in particular, pose a significant hazard. Often invisible from shore, these narrow channels of fast-moving water can pull swimmers out beyond the breaking waves. If caught in one, stay calm—don't try to swim directly back to shore. Instead, swim parallel to the beach until you're free of the current, then angle back toward land.

When possible, swim only at guarded beaches. Lifeguards are trained to spot hazards, assist swimmers in distress, and respond quickly in emergencies. Many Jersey Shore towns, including Ocean City, Wildwood, Cape May, Atlantic City, and Brigantine, staff their beaches with lifeguards daily during peak season, typically from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Know the Conditions

Before heading out, check the day's surf and weather reports. Local news, beach patrol websites, and flag systems provide updates on tide times, rip current risks, jellyfish sightings, and storm advisories. Be especially cautious after storms, when surf conditions can remain rough even if skies are clear.

Additionally, always be aware of boat traffic in bays and inlets, where swimmers, kayakers, and paddleboarders share the water with motorized

vessels. Wearing a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket is essential for boating and recommended for inexperienced swimmers in deeper waters.

Supervise Children Closely

Even on calm days, waves can knock over small children or carry them farther out than expected. Stay within arm's reach of young swimmers, and consider outfitting them with brightly colored swimwear or rash guards for visibility. Teach children to recognize lifeguards and seek help if they feel unsafe.

Smart Shore Habits

- Stay sober while swimming or boating. Alcohol impairs judgment, balance, and reaction times.
- Obey posted signs and lifeguard instructions. Many towns prohibit swimming after hours, when no lifeguards are present.
- Don't overestimate your abilities. The ocean is not a pool. If you're not a strong swimmer, stay in shallower water where you can touch bottom.


















YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK -Downward Facing Dog (Adho Mukha Svanasana)

Just because you've heard of Downward Facing Dog doesn't mean it's easy.

Beginners often lean too far forward in this posture, making it more like a plank. Instead, keep your weight mostly in your legs and reach your hips high with your heels stretching toward the floor (they do not need to touch the floor).

Soften your knees to facilitate the move if you have tight hamstrings. Keep feet parallel.

Surf, Art, and Local Pride Collide at Ocean City's Art of Surfing Festival



Now in its 24th year, Ocean City's Art of Surfing Festival returns to the Music Pier this week with three days of surf-inspired creativity, craftsmanship, and community. What began as a humble gallery showcase in the early 2000s has evolved into a full-fledged celebration of the Jersey Shore's unique surf culture. The festival opens Thursday, July 31, from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., and continues Friday and Saturday, August 1 and 2, from noon to 8 p.m. Admission is free, and the vibes - like the tide - are high.

The origins of the festival can be traced back to Asbury Avenue's Sagemore Gallery, where artists Phil DeAngelo and Steve Miller first curated an exhibit focused solely on surf-themed art. As the event grew in popularity, it found a permanent home at the Ocean City Music Pier, where it continues to thrive under the creative leadership of Aaron "Bogy" Bogushefsky. In recent years, Bogy has been joined by co-organizers Caitlin Peck, Jason Carlisi, and Elizabeth Kirk - who also designed this year's poster. Together, they've expanded the festival to include live surfboard shaping demonstrations, book signings, surf films, and nightly performances by local bands.



More than two dozen artists will display original works this year, ranging from ocean photography and wood carvings to hand-painted surfboards and wearable pieces. Among the newcomers are Jules Gaupp, known for her hand-painted beach accessories, and Kristina Young, co-founder of Peace of Wood. On-site shaping demos by Brian Wynn, Tony Palaia, and Trevor Kennedy offer a rare chance to see the craft of board-building up close, while musicians like Head High, L+J Band, Polaroid Fade, and The Customers provide the soundtrack to the longboard lifestyle.

The cultural significance of the festival is amplified by Ocean City's deep-rooted surfing legacy. Surfers were paddling out here as early as the 1920s, including the Cropper brothers and Hawaiian-born Watts Smith, who was stationed in the area during his time in the military and brought with him the traditions of Hawaiian wave-riding. Boards were crafted from solid mahogany or pine, and lugging one to the water was a commitment only the most passionate pioneers undertook. The scene grew through the decades, eventually leading to the establishment of the Ocean City Surfing Association in the 1960s by John Carey and Don Pileggi - one of the first competitive surfing groups on the East Coast. By the 1970s, thanks to advocates like Richard Parolski and city liaison Harold "Chip" Gordy, Ocean City officially designated surf beaches and began working with the surfing community rather than against it.

That legacy is still riding strong today, not just through the local lineup, but in the schools and surf culture that define modern Ocean City. The high school surf team remains one of the most dominant in the state, with multiple NSSA state championships under their belt and a reputation for producing tough, talented riders who thrive in Mid-Atlantic conditions. The next generation starts even younger, thanks to the Ocean City Intermediate School Surf Club. Each fall, students from the club paddle out after school and surf until the water gets too cold, often well into November. It's a hands-on education in both the sport and the lifestyle, passed down from board to board.


One of the most visible products of that homegrown pride is Rob Kelly, a longtime Ocean City resident and widely respected voice in East Coast surfing. Though largely retired from formal competition, Kelly continues to make an impact through big-wave performances in winter swells, surf documentaries, and tireless promotion of NJ breaks. He's known for his cold-water barrel riding, but also for helping to shift the spotlight onto the Mid-Atlantic scene - showing the world that elite surfing doesn't stop at the California coast.



Earlier this year, Kelly parted ways with longtime sponsor Billabong and joined Jetty, the Manahawkin-based surf and outdoor brand known for its commitment to East Coast culture. "Jetty's always been about East Coast pride and grassroots support," Kelly said in a recent interview. "This partnership lets me represent where I'm from - and that means everything." While not officially on the festival lineup, Kelly's presence is a familiar one along the Boardwalk and in the local lineup, where his influence continues to shape the surf scene that raised him.

The Music Pier is located at 8th Street and the Boardwalk, and there's ample parking available in the nearby municipal lots at 9th and 10th Streets, as well as metered parking throughout the area. Because the festival coincides with peak summer beach days and other boardwalk events, arriving early - especially in the afternoon - is highly recommended.

As the salty air mingles with the scent of board wax and acrylic paint, the Art of Surfing Festival continues to do what it's always done best - celebrate the intersection of local culture, coastal creativity, and a community that rides the waves in more ways than one.

responders. The event is family-focused and well attended, with free parking available near the complex.

The Ventnor City Police Department, Fire Department, and Beach Patrol all participate. Street parking is available nearby, and guests are encouraged to bring chairs or blankets for comfort.





Name of venue: Noyes Art Garage

Where are you located? We are located at 2200 Fairmount Avenue in Atlantic City.

What are your hours of operation? We are open Wednesdays through Sundays from 11 am to 6 pm

Parking tips: There is free parking in the Wave Garage with purchase of \$40+

Tell us a little about yourself: The Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University is the cornerstone of the Arts District in Atlantic City with a mission to promote education, provide resources for emerging artists, and enrich the community.

What does your venue specialize in? The Arts Garage houses artist studios, galleries, shops, a flexible workshop/classroom, and hosts special events throughout the year. It includes a 1,200 square ft. satellite gallery of The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University and the African American Heritage Museum of Southern New Jersey. At the Arts Garage, you will find individual artists working in their studio/shop spaces. Each artist focuses on a different medium including painting, pastels, photography, illustration, sculpture and more. Visitors are invited to watch the artists at work, ask questions about their creative process, and purchase original artwork. Stroll through the galleries and shops and enjoy convenient parking in the heart of Atlantic City adjacent to Tanger Outlets, the Convention Center, Boardwalk Hall and Dante Hall Theater.



What makes your essential for Atlantic County? The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University offers several locations in Southern New Jersey, providing access and support to the arts and artists of the region and beyond. A source of inspiration and enjoyment for enthusiasts of the arts, from residents of the community, students and faculty of the university to visitors to the shore and Pine Barrens, the Noyes Museum serves the entire South Jersey area. In 2010, the Noyes partnership with Stockton University began as a natural extension of Stockton's commitment to the area's cultural scene. The Noyes Museum formally became a part of Stockton University in 2016. Through Communications Studies, Historical Studies, Language and Culture Studies, Literature and Philosophy, Stockton is serving the arts and humanities in southern New Jersey.

Tell us a little about your history. Fred and Ethel Noyes are best known as the developers of the Historic Smithville Inn and the Towne of Historic Smithville. The Noyes established the Mr. and Mrs. Fred Winslow Noyes Foundation on June 8, 1973, with the intention of forming a museum that would reflect their interests in fine art and folk art. Upon the sale of the Towne of Historic Smithville to the American Broadcasting Company in the summer of 1974, the Noyes began planning for the museum. Those plans were delayed by Mrs. Noyes' untimely death in January 1979. Mr. Noyes and the remaining trustees of the foundation saw to the completion of the museum building and its inaugural exhibitions in June 1983. Mr. Noyes continued to oversee the operation of the museum until his passing in 1987. Art was the heartbeat of Fred Noyes, and he painted until he could no longer hold a paintbrush. His paintings reveal the joy he found in life and the delight he took in the natural landscapes of southern New Jersey. No matter what other demands there were in his life, he found the time to paint. His legacy is a body of work and an art museum that continue to inspire us to this day.





Do you offer tours at the Art Garage? Guided, group tours of the Noyes Museum's galleries in Hammonton and Atlantic City as well as hands-on workshops can be arranged for groups of ten or more. The Noyes' knowledgeable museum guides will lead your group on an informative stroll through the galleries, providing background on the exhibiting artists and analyses of the artistic techniques and subject matter they employ. Customized, regional tour packages are also available. Arrangements for a sit-down lunch time can be coordinated. It is advised to make your group tour reservations at least one month in advance of your visit.

Is there any other important information we should know? While we offer special events for every month of the year, and currently running art camp through the summer, we are excited to be hosting the Garden State Film Festival Best of Fest on August 14, with a Sips and Treats reception at 6:30 pm and a viewing starting at 7 pm, featuring an array of award-winning short films from around the globe. 

Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.

Since we remain busy with work and family for most of the year, everyone needs a vacation once in a while to relieve themselves from the daily stress of life. Adventure and travel encourage creativity, endurance, fun, and play within yourself and your travel companion. August is the perfect month to plan your next vacation adventure. Take some time off, enjoy the outdoors, and see for yourself what America has to offer.

Travel isn't only just a way of having fun — it broadens your perspectives, challenges you to try something new, and also makes you appreciate your own culture and people. You don't always have to spend a lot of money or travel to a new country to explore new territory. If you cannot get away to see a different part of America, you can still do something fun and adventurous in your own town. August marks the last chance to get away before the end of the summer, thus making it the perfect time to seek excitement, a quiet space, or to simply learn something new.

How To Celebrate American Adventures Month

- Explore the waters If you live near an ocean, river, or lake, you could try some sort of water sport during American Adventures Month. You could go kayaking, surfing, boating, canoeing, or even fishing.
- Visit a national park America is home to over 400 national parks and forests. Chances are that you have one nearby, too. So why not celebrate American Adventures Month by going hiking, camping, and exploring a national park near you.
- Go on a road trip If adventures aren't really your thing, you could go on a road trip with your friends and family. Drive around, spend quality time with your loved ones, and explore areas you haven't seen before.



Atlantic County, Your Backyard Adventureland

August is American Adventures Month - a national reminder that you don't need to climb peaks or cross state lines to find wonder. In Atlantic County, adventure is just minutes from home: salt marsh trails, guided beach walks, horseback rides through pine forests, and water sports for every curiosity.

Take a walk through Estell Manor Park, where over 27 miles of dirt and boardwalk trails wind through cedar swamps, hardwood forests, and the haunting remains of a World War I munitions plant. At the edge of the park, the Warren E. Fox Nature Center offers maps, wildlife exhibits, and occasional educational programs that make every hike feel like a discovery. Canoe and kayak launches connect paddlers to Stephens Creek and the South River, where guiet bends invite lingering and wildlife sightings are common.

For deeper woodland exploration, Riverbend Park in Mays Landing spans more than 700 acres along the Great Egg Harbor River. Its sandy trails are ideal for both mountain bikers and bird watchers, with quiet, shaded corners perfect for spotting migrating songbirds, salamanders, or even a bald eagle if you're lucky.

Prefer a smoother route? The Somers Point Bike Path stretches from Pleasantville to Somers Point, passing through Linwood and Northfield along a paved, tree-lined corridor. You'll cruise past parks, playgrounds, fishing spots, and the occasional café patio just steps from the trail. The Atlantic County Bikeway offers a longer ride - 7.5 miles from the Shore Mall area out to Hamilton Township - following a former rail line that feels removed from traffic but not from civilization.

For those itching to get off-road entirely, Wharton State Forest offers thousands of acres of Pine Barrens to explore, including multi-use trails ideal for hiking, cycling, and horseback riding. The historic village of Batsto makes a worthy stop for history buffs, while paddlers can launch canoes or kayaks onto the Mullica River for a shaded trip through the forest's heart. Local stables in the Pine Barrens host trail rides for beginners and experienced riders alike, and guides are often available for small-group or seasonal themed excursions.

Water lovers have options beyond the bay. Designated surf beaches in Atlantic City - like Delaware Avenue and Downtown Beach - offer decent breaks and reliable rental options for visitors without their own gear. Surf schools operate throughout the summer, providing lessons for beginners and returning riders alike. On calmer days, paddleboards, kayaks, and windsurfing boards dot the shoreline at Jackson Avenue Beach. Further inland, lakes in Estell Manor and Lake Lenape Park welcome non-motorized boaters with easy launches and cool, shaded stretches that feel miles away from the boardwalk.

For a bit more thrill, parasailing boats launch from Gardner's Basin in Atlantic City, sending adventurous types hundreds of feet above the back bay for sweeping views of the shoreline, inlet, and skyline. Outings typically last under two hours, require no experience, and offer an unbeatable photo op for anyone bold enough to go up.

Back bay rentals are also available throughout Margate and Ventnor, where several launch spots let you slip into the calm morning waters for a solo paddle, guided eco tour, or family float. Look for outfitters near Amherst Avenue and Dorset Avenue, where equipment rentals are available by the hour and most docks are steps from nearby coffee shops or food spots.

Guided beach walks, sunset paddles, and nature hikes are also offered through various local programs and park offices throughout the year. Many are free or donation-based, and include themes like "Moonlight in the Marsh," "Pine Barrens Plant Life," or "Wildlife Along the Water." Schedules change with the season, but county websites and library boards often post upcoming offerings a few weeks out.

If your idea of adventure includes land, water, and sky, Atlantic County has you covered. Whether you're paddling past cedar roots, trotting horseback through shaded pines, or sailing high above the surf with your feet dangling and heart racing, this is your month to embrace it all. You don't need a passport, a long weekend, or a perfect plan. Just a little time and a willingness to say yes - to trails, tidepools, or wherever the breeze leads. American Adventures Month starts right here - and your backyard is ready.

The two-day event celebrates the achievements of Atlantic County youth through hands-on learning, public exhibitions, and old-fashioned family fun - with free admission and \$5 parking on site.

Held annually since 1949, the Atlantic County 4-H Fair remains one of the longest-running community events in the region. It brings together more than 250 local 4-H members from clubs across the county, who spend the year exploring topics like agriculture, animal science, engineering, arts, and civic engagement. The fair is their moment to share what they've learned through interactive booths, judged competitions, and public demonstrations.

Inside the main building, visitors will find a showcase of club projects - ranging from food preservation and photography to model trains, Lego engineering, and robotics. Outdoors, the barns and pavilions come alive with animal shows, equine displays, and crowd favorites like the goat obstacle course and rabbit agility course. Saturday features the Baby Parade, Pet Parade, and Pie Eating Contest, which always draw a crowd.


The fairgrounds are also home to amusement rides, hands-on activity tents, and live music throughout both days. Multiple food vendors and snack stands will offer family-friendly fare, with shaded seating areas available near the entertainment tent. Kids can earn a prize by completing the annual 4-H Passport scavenger hunt, which encourages them to explore every corner of the fairgrounds.

The site itself - named for the late David C. Wood, a local agricultural leader and advocate for 4-H - is located just north of downtown Mays Landing, with parking accessible from Route 50. Overflow parking is typically available along Park Road and adjoining fields, with signage and fair volunteers guiding vehicles. The location is ADA accessible, and restrooms, shaded areas, and first aid services are available on site.

Visitors curious about 4-H's history will find a timeline of Atlantic County's program near the front entrance. Exhibits trace its evolution from rural farm clubs in the early 1900s to today's diverse programs in STEM, sustainability, and leadership. The fair also honors longtime volunteers and club leaders - many of whom were once members themselves.

Cantaloupe, Cucumber & Lime Salad with Tajín

- 1 ripe cantaloupe, peeled and cubed
- 1 English cucumber, thinly
- Juice and zest of 1 lime
- 1 tsp Tajín seasoning (or chili-lime salt)
- A handful of fresh mint or basil, chopped

Toss the melon and cucumber in a bowl. Drizzle with lime juice and zest. Sprinkle generously with Tajín and gently fold in the herbs. Chill for 10-15 minutes before serving. Texture is crunchy, taste is sweet-tart with a little kick. Leftovers keep up to 3 days in the fridge.

Chilled Cantaloupe Soup with Lemon Zest

- 1 large ripe cantaloupe, washed, seeded, cubed
- Zest of ½ lemon
- 1–2 Tbsp honey (optional, depending on sweetness)
- ½ to 1 cup whole milk (or Greek yogurt for tang)
- Pinch sea salt and white pepper (optional)
- Fresh mint leaves for garnish

Blend the cantaloupe until smooth in a blender or food processor. Stir in honey, lemon zest, and milk/yogurt until creamy. Season lightly if desired. Chill overnight for best flavor melding. Serve cold, garnished with mint. Refreshing as an appetizer or dessert.





Sizzling Thrillers and Chilling Reads to Last All Month Long

Never Flinch by Stephen King

Time has nothing on Stephen King. A half century after he staked his claim to the horror genre, he's still at it with no signs of letting up. To that point, his latest Never Flinch never wavers in its commitment to relentless entertainment and pitch-perfect pacing.

Imagine a madman, a true human monster, promising to kill fourteen people, thirteen of them random innocents, is a twisted act of vengeful comeuppance. Fortunately, the local cop who receives the letter promising just that is acquainted with Holly Gibney, paranormal and crime fiction's most unique detective. We've seen Holly before but never quite like this, as she brings her unique and hardly traditional talents to multiple, potentially interconnected cases. Ever since her debut in Mr. Mercedes, she has evolved from a one-off eccentric to a fully realized character capable of driving a book. King's evolution as a writer has been a wonder to behold. He has replaced the blistering originality of the early titles that launched him with a savvy, seasoned expansion across multiple genres and different brands of monsters. His legacy will not just be as the greatest American horror writer ever, but one of the great novelists period in our literary history.

Fever Beach by Carl Hiaasen

Carl Hiaasen swings for the fences and hits a literary homerun with his latest Florida-based romp Fever Beach, a scathingly satirical take on the American condition of today. This time out, amid the cast of detestable misfits and deplorable miscreants, are right-wing crusader Dale Figgo and typically lecherous congressman Clure Boyette (Yup, that's his name.). To counter their lunacy, Hiaasen serves up pair of stiff-spined normals in Viva Morales and Twilly Spree. Viva happens to work for a clueless elderly couple fond of building whatever they can display their name on. Twilly, meanwhile, reads like a younger version of Hiaasen's wondrous Skink, taking up the mantel of violent action against environmental despoilers in the tradition of the reclusive former Florida governor. That Viva and Twilly are destined to join forces to run Figgo and Boyette's plans off the rails is never in doubt, the only question being how much laughter we'll be treated to in the process. On top of his last effort, Squeeze Me, with

Fever Beach, Hiaasen reclaims the mojo from early classics like Skin Tight and Tourist Season. He's always great but the crazed turn our politics has taken seems to have set his creative juices afire to the point that his thinly veiled commentary serves as a side-splitting escape from the news cycle. Hiaasen's keen eye and sharp is destined to make him the best social satirist not just now, but ever.

King of Ashes by S.A. Crosby

S.A. Crosby has rocketed to literary fame on the backs of edgy, gritty tales that have set the bar for contemporary crime novels. But his latest, King of Ashes, takes him to even greater heights. Roman Carruthers has no choice but to return home after his father's car accident imperils the family's mortuary business. Roman much prefers crunching numbers to embalming corpses, and his well-off clients to those lying on a slab. That's a tough enough lifestyle change on its own, even before Roman has to take responsibility for his ne'er-do-well little brother Dante, who's run afoul of local gangsters in their sleepy, backwater Virginia hometown. Never mind the fact that those gangsters were responsible for putting his father in the hospital in the first place as a harbinger of worse things to come. King of Ashes cements Crosby's status as the undisputed modern master of crime noir. His dialogue crackles with authenticity and his staccato prose is a wonder to behold. There will never be a successor to the throne of Elmore Leonard, but Crosby is as close as we'll ever get.

Her First Mistake by Kendra Elliot

Cold cases inevitably provide great fodder for crime thrillers, and Kendra Elliot proves remarkably adept at mining that trope with her latest sizzler of a story, Her First Mistake. Noelle Marshall is lucky to be alive, considering she survived the same home invasion that claimed her husband and local politico Derrick Bell's life. A dozen years later, new evidence emerges that leads the FBI to reopen the case in the hope of identifying the killer at long last. Lo and behold, there are skeletons in Noelle's closet dating back to the night of that murder in the form of long-buried secrets. Those secrets bubble back up to the surface after the cold case gets hot again, apparently placing her life in jeopardy. Her First Mistake is a psychological thriller extraordinaire. Your only mistake is not picking it up.

Eagles Training Camp 2025: New Faces, Rising Stars, and Super Bowl Ambition



Few things are routine in this camp. Seasoned center Cam Jurgens continues at the point of the offensive line, but he's joined by young guards Tyler Steen and Kenyon Green who are battling for rotational snaps after strong early stands. Lane Johnson and Jordan Mailata keep their iron grip on the tackle spots - the former's consistency and the latter's dominance make them frontrunners for the NFL's Protector of the Year award. Their goal is clear: create lanes for Saquon Barkley to run, and pass-block with surgical precision.

On the defensive side, Vic Fangio's unit blends emerging talent with proven veteran presence. Fangio - whose résumé includes eight top-5 defenses in the NFL over 13 seasons - is nurturing a young core that's hungry to prove itself atop the league once again. The return of Pro Bowl tackle Jalen Carter marked a turning point. Showing no rust from his shoulder recovery, Carter delivered pressure and tackles among the best of any lineman during the first week.

Elsewhere, Zack Baun, coming off a 2024 All-Pro season that included a Super Bowl interception, continues to anchor linebacker play. His pairing with rookie Jihaad Campbell, who's already rotated with the first team, offers both reliability and explosive upside. In one drill, Baun executed a textbook linebacker blitz, while Campbell timed a gap-fill to perfection - both earning praise from Fangio for their football IQ and instincts.

Campbell, a 6'3", 230-pound linebacker out of Alabama, was the Eagles' second-round pick this year and comes with a national championship pedigree. At Alabama, he recorded 96 tackles, 3 sacks, and was known for sideline-to-sideline pursuit. "He has the burst and vision to adjust on the fly," said Sirianni. "But more importantly, he wants to be coached. He's a sponge."

On the back end, the cornerback position is an early highlight. Rookie Quinyon Mitchell, the team's first-round draft pick from Toledo, showcased his ability to shadow A.J. Brown without hesitation - earning praise from coaches as a player who's not just holding his own, but leading the depth chart. Behind him, Cooper DeJean, a highly-touted defensive back from lowa, looks increasingly safe-ready, while Kelee Ringo and Adoree' Jackson rotate in nickel looks with no clear edge yet. Jackson, Fangio quipped, might not have been signed if decisions came solely from the coaching staff; that's how competitive things are.



The youth movement doesn't stop there - elbow-high receiver Elijah Cooks continues to make noise in 1-on-1 drills with physical grabs and boundary catches, earning comparisons to late bearers like DeVonta Smith. At running back, Will Shipley, the versatile speedster out of Clemson, flashed reliable hands during a touchdown drill, reinforcing that the offense offers multiple threats beyond Barkley. Shipley totaled over 2,800 yards from scrimmage in college and was widely praised for his vision and receiving abilities.

Practice buffers aren't about scoring; they're about building. Offensive Coordinator Kevin Patullo, in his first year calling plays, has introduced pre-snap motion packages and formation shifts designed to keep defenses off balance. Jalen Hurts, who delivered a borderline MVP season during Super Bowl LIX, now faces a secondary loaded with speed and unpredictability - making camp reps essential for developing timing and trust.



Camp has also seen its share of setbacks. Nakobe Dean and Andrew Mukuba remain on the injury list, while DeVonta Smith missed reps with back tightness. Yet GM Howie Roseman and staff have emphasized depth - the belief that team-building isn't loyalty to veterans, but readiness of everyone kept on the roster.

Looking ahead, a public practice is scheduled for Sunday, August 10 at Lincoln Financial Field - a rare opportunity for fans to witness the growth firsthand and support the Eagles Autism Foundation. Gates open at 5PM, with on-field warmups beginning around 6:30PM and team drills under the lights starting just after 7PM. Tickets are \$10 and must be purchased in advance through Ticketmaster or the Eagles' official website. Proceeds benefit the Eagles Autism Foundation. Parking in stadium lots is included with the ticket and opens at 3PM, with tailgating permitted in designated zones.



Fans are encouraged to arrive early for giveaways, family-friendly games, and appearances by Eagles alumni and cheerleaders. Food trucks will be stationed along the Headhouse Plaza, and the Pro Shop will offer exclusive training camp gear. In years past, more than 30,000 fans have attended the open practice - making it one of the most spirited training events in the NFL.

Projected rosters suggest nearly half the starting lineup may be 28 or younger, indicating that Philadelphia isn't just planning for this season - it's cultivating the core for the next era. As Sirianni said during Monday's press briefing, "This isn't about polishing what worked. It's about discovering who we can become."
