

Week in Review: Phillies Show Power and Pitching Depth

ATLANTIC COUNTY

Last week brought a mix of sharp pitching, big bats, and one stumble as the Phillies went 5–1 from August 6–11. On Wednesday, August 6th, Taijuan Walker delivered a commanding six-inning shutout of the Orioles, allowing just one walk and striking out four. The offense was relentless, with Max Kepler smacking a two-run homer and Brandon Marsh adding a solo shot. Philadelphia racked up 10 hits, including multi-hit games from Kepler, Marsh, and Bryson Stott, and sealed a 5–0 win with three scoreless innings from the bullpen.

The momentum didn't carry into Thursday, August 7th, when the Orioles roared back in the series finale. A four-run fourth inning broke the game open, highlighted by a three-run homer from Coby Mayo. Ranger Suárez struggled, allowing five earned runs over six and a third innings, and despite Trea Turner's three hits, the Phillies fell 5–1.

The weekend series in Texas proved to be a statement. On Saturday, August 9th, Cristopher Sanchez locked down six innings of one-run ball with six strikeouts, improving to 11–3 on the season. The bats erupted in a 9–1 victory behind home runs from Kyle Schwarber, Brandon Marsh, and Turner. Marsh tallied four hits, Turner drove in five runs, and a five-run ninth inning put the game out of reach. The Phillies followed with two more wins to complete the sweep, riding a balanced combination of pitching depth and consistent offense.

Across the week, Brandon Marsh was the sparkplug, collecting seven hits in 15 plate appearances, including three doubles and two home runs. Bryson Stott matched that pace with seven hits in 16 appearances, adding two doubles and a triple. In the bullpen, Jhoan Duran provided stability with two saves, while Nick Castellanos and Bryce Harper both endured quiet weeks at the plate. Suarez, meanwhile, showed signs of fatigue, giving up 15 runs over his last 23½ innings.

The strong stretch has the Phillies sitting atop the NL East with a 51/2-game lead over the Mets, who have stumbled as Philadelphia finds its rhythm.

Looking Ahead: Keys to This Week

The Phillies began their three-game road series against the Astros on Tuesday, August 12th, looking to carry over the momentum from their Texas sweep into another AL West matchup. The opener pitted Ranger Suarez against Houston's Framber Valdez, a test for a Phillies lineup that has thrived on early scoring, Philadelphia's approach against Houston's pitching staff will be critical, as the Astros rank among the league's stingiest in walks allowed. The middle of the series is set to feature Cristopher Sanchez, who has been one of the team's most consistent arms this season, against right-hander Hunter Brown. Taijuan Walker is expected to close out the set, giving the Phillies a steady veteran presence before they return home.

Back at Citizens Bank Park on Friday, August 15th, the Phillies open a three-game weekend series against the Cincinnati Reds. That matchup wlll bring plenty of intrigue: Cincinnati has been streaky but dangerous, with Elly De La Cruz anchoring a lineup that can change a game in one swing or on the basepaths. Philadelphia will counter with a mix of power hitting and aggressive baserunning of its own, led by Kyle Schwarber's historic home run pace and Trea Turner's ability to create runs in multiple ways. With the Mets slipping and the Braves not far behind in the Wild Card picture, this stretch against the Astros and Reds could prove pivotal in giving the Phillies breathing room atop the NL East heading into the final six weeks of the season.

Final Word

The week's dominance over Texas, paired with Walker's gem against Baltimore, has Philadelphia playing like a team ready for October. Stay Safe in the Surf: A Guide to Water Safety at the Jersey Shore

The Jersey Shore is synonymous with summer fun—sunny beach days, refreshing ocean dips, and thrilling surf. But as inviting as the Atlantic Ocean, bays, and inlets may seem, these waters demand respect. Each year, thousands of visitors flock to Atlantic and Cape May Counties to enjoy the shore, and knowing how to stay safe can mean the difference between a great day and a dangerous one.

Respect the Ocean's Power

The ocean at the Jersey Shore can change quickly, with shifting tides, sudden drop-offs, and powerful currents. Rip currents, in particular, pose a significant hazard. Often invisible from shore, these narrow channels of fast-moving water can pull swimmers out beyond the breaking waves. If caught in one, stay calm—don't try to swim directly back to shore. Instead, swim parallel to the beach until you're free of the current, then angle back toward land.

When possible, swim only at guarded beaches. Lifeguards are trained to spot hazards, assist swimmers in distress, and respond quickly in emergencies. Many Jersey Shore towns, including Ocean City, Wildwood, Cape May, Atlantic City, and Brigantine, staff their beaches with lifeguards daily during peak season, typically from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Know the Conditions

Before heading out, check the day's surf and weather reports. Local news, beach patrol websites, and flag systems provide updates on tide times, rip current risks, jellyfish sightings, and storm advisories. Be especially cautious after storms, when surf conditions can remain rough even if skies are clear.

Additionally, always be aware of boat traffic in bays and inlets, where swimmers, kayakers, and paddleboarders share the water with motorized

vessels. Wearing a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket is essential for boating and recommended for inexperienced swimmers in deeper waters.

Supervise Children Closely

Even on calm days, waves can knock over small children or carry them farther out than expected. Stay within arm's reach of young swimmers, and consider outfitting them with brightly colored swimwear or rash guards for visibility. Teach children to recognize lifeguards and seek help if they feel unsafe.

Smart Shore Habits

- Stay sober while swimming or boating. Alcohol impairs judgment, balance, and reaction times.
- Obey posted signs and lifeguard instructions. Many towns prohibit swimming after hours, when no lifeguards are present.
- Don't overestimate your abilities. The ocean is not a pool. If you're not a strong swimmer, stay in shallower water where you can touch bottom.

Enjoy the Water, Respect the Risks

The Jersey Shore's waters offer unforgettable fun but a safe beach day starts with smart choices. By understanding the ocean's power, heeding local guidance, and watching out for one another, visitors can make the most of their time at the shore keeping memories joyful and worry-free.



History of World Honey Bee Day



Celebrate the Bees: Atlantic County Edition

World Honey Bee Day on Saturday, August 16, 2025 is a chance to spotlight the pollinators that keep our gardens blooming and our food supply thriving. In Atlantic County, honey bee conservation ties directly into local agriculture, from backyard gardens to roadside farm stands. Several area farmers markets carry jars of raw, locally harvested honey, often sold by the same growers who rely on bees to pollinate fruits, vegetables, and flowers. Buying these products not only supports local producers but also sustains the pollination networks that make those crops possible.

Pollinator health is also a focus for ongoing research and outreach through Rutsess Cooperative Extension, which offers guidance on bee-friendly planting, habitat creation, and reducing pesticide impact. USDA programs in the region encourage landowners to establish pollinator strips, hedgerows, and wildflower plantings—steps that benefit both managed hives and native bee species.

Fun fact: while honey bees get most of the attention, New Jersey is home to more finan 300 species of wild bees, many of them solitary and non-stinging. These unsung pollinators thrive in diverse habitats, from coastal dunes to suburban backyards, and play a key role in keeping ecosystems healthy.

Final Thought

Whether you pick up a jar of local honey at a weekend market, plant a few native flowers, or simply take a moment to watch bees at work, August 16 is a reminder that healthy pollinators mean a healthy Atlantic County. Protecting them is sweet business for us all.

Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.

BAYFRONT BITES & BEACHFRONT FUN: THE DOWNBEACH SEAFOOD FESTIVAL RETURNS

As summer begins its slow slide toward autumn, the Jersey Shore gets one last big taste of the season - literally. The Downbeach Seafood Festival, returning to Ventnor City's Ski Beach on Saturday and Sunday, September 13–14, 2025, is the kind of event that reminds you why the shore isn't just about sand and surf. It's about the people, the flavors, and the way a bay breeze can turn an ordinary afternoon into something unforgettable.

Ski Beach, perched at Dorset and Burke Avenues, is a gem of a setting for a food festival. The wide grassy areas overlook the Intracoastal Waterway, dotted with kayaks, paddle-boards, and the occasional sailboat. The view alone is worth the trip, but once the tents go up and the grills start sizzling, the air becomes thick with the scent of garlic butter, smoky crab cakes, and fresh-shucked oysters. Vendors from across South Jersey will be dishing up everything from classic lobster rolls and fried shrimp baskets to creative seafood-inspired specials you won't find on a typical menu.

One of the festival's most anticipated highlights is the Chowder Cook-Off, running from noon to 4 p.m. each day. For \$10, you get a wristband and a mission: taste every chowder you can and vote for your favorite. It's a battle of creamy New England versus tangy Manhattan, with plenty of surprises in between. In 2024, festivalgoers' appetite for competition translated into a \$5,000 donation to the Community Food Bank of New Jersey enough to provide about \$100,000 worth of meals to families in need. This year's field promises to be just as spirited, and the bragging rights last far longer than the weekend.



For those who prefer their seafood raw and briny, the Oyster Tour of the Shore is a must. Local aquaculture is on proud display, with Cape May Salts, Sloop Point Oyster Co., McGee's Shellfish, and other purveyors serving up ice-cold beauties straight from the water. It's a crash course in just how much variety New Jersey waters have to offer, with each farm bringing its own flavor profile, texture, and story.

The perfect pairing for oysters? A cold beer, of course. The Great Brews of NJ Tasting Tent brings together a dozen of the state's top breweries for a mini beer festival within the festival. Ten tasting tickets cost \$10, and with pours starting at noon, you can sip your way through a diverse lineup - bright IPAs, smooth lagers, and maybe even a seafood-friendly saison.

If eating is your competitive sport, the Crab Cake Eating Contest, sponsored by Jay's Crab Shack, might be calling your name. This lighthearted showdown is open to non-professionals, with sign-ups happening on site. Space is limited, so those serious about their speed-eating skills should arrive early. Even if you don't compete, it's worth stopping by to cheer on the brave souls who do.



Entertainment runs throughout both days, weaving music, movement, and artistry into the mix. The South Pacific Island Dancers bring a burst of color and energy with authentic Polynesian performances, while local sculptor Matt Deibert - better known as "The Sandman" - crafts intricate sand art live on site, turning a simple pile of sand into a detailed, photo-worthy sculpture before your eyes. Under the eat-in tent, cooking demonstrations give attendees the chance to watch chefs prepare seafood dishes from start to finish, sharing tips you can take home to your own kitchen.

Logistics are as smooth as the oyster shells being passed across the counters. Free parking is available at 4800 Wellington Avenue, with a complimentary shuttle ferrying guests directly to Ski Beach. The site is also accessible by water - non-motorized vessels can use the boat ramp for a truly bayside arrival. The layout makes it easy to wander without missing a thing, and with plenty of space to sit, eat, and soak in the views, it's as family-friendly as it is food-focused.

The Downbeach Seafood Festival isn't just about indulging - it's about celebrating the shore's culinary and cultural identity. Many of the participating restaurants and vendors are small, family-run operations that have weathered storms both literal and economic. For them, the festival is a chance to connect with locals and visitors face-to-face, to put a name and a smile behind the flavors they're proud to serve. For the community, it's a reminder that food can bring people together in a way few things can.

And while it's easy to get lost in the abundance of fried, grilled, steamed, and raw delights, the event offers more than just what's on the plate. It's an end-of-summer tradition for many - an excuse to gather friends, make new ones, and send the season off with a full stomach and happy heart. Whether you're a chowder fanatic, an oyster purist, a craft beer enthusiast, or simply someone who enjoys a good waterfront view, there's something here for you.

So come hungry, come curious, and come ready to linger. The Downbeach Seafood Festival only happens once a year, but the memories - and maybe even the recipes - you take home can last far longer.

Creepy, Clever and Wickedly Charming Books

A Deadly Education by Naomi Novik

Picture a school that wants you dead. The Scholomance isn't about house points or friendly ghosts, it's a brutal survival test where magic is earned through grit and where monsters are part of the curriculum. El isn't here to make friends — she's angry, awkward, and armed with enough magical firepower to level the place, though she'd rather not use it. Her voice is razor-sharp, her humor even sharper, and watching her try to survive both the school and herself is wickedly satisfying.

Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children by Ransom Riggs

This one practically screams Wednesday-core. After a family tragedy, Jacob stumbles upon a crumbling orphanage on a remote island and discovers a group of peculiar children, each with unsettling abilities and frozen in time. There's an eerie, old-photograph aesthetic that's both creepy and beautiful. Not to mention, the plot slowly unfurls like a ghost story told in flickering candlelight.

The Grimrose Girls by Laura Pohl

A mysterious elite boarding school. Dead girls. A cast of prickly, brilliant misfits. Sound familiar? When one of their classmates dies under suspicious circumstances, four girls band together to investigate — and discover that their lives mirror twisted versions of fairy tales. It's queer, sharp-edged and full of secrets. The perfect fix if you loved the unraveling mystery of Nevermore Academy.

Undead Girl Gang by Lily Anderson

A witchy teen accidentally raises her dead best friend, along with two other recently murdered girls, from the grave ... And together they hunt down their killer. Yes, you read that right. Mila's dry humor, outsider status and fierce loyalty make her feel like Wednesday's long-lost cousin. There's murder, mayhem and just enough magic to keep it weird in the best way.

Wicked Saints by Emily A. Duncan

This one's for the goth girls who want their magic bloody, their romance dangerous and their heroines morally gray. In a frozen, warring world, Nadya is a cleric who hears the voices of gods and she's thrust into an uneasy alliance with a prince and a heretic. The tone is bleak and beautiful, like frost on a cathedral window, while the plot is full of betrayal, secrets and unholy power. Delicious!

The Raven Boys by Maggie Stiefvater

Blue Sargent lives in a house full of psychics, but she's always been the odd one out, until she meets four private school boys on a quest to find a dead Welsh king. This book is magic in slow motion. The friendships are magnetic, the mystery unfolds like a puzzle box and the vibe is steeped in folklore, ghosts and dream logic. Atmospheric and strange, it's an essential read if you liked Wednesday's quiet supernatural undercurrents.

The Naturals by Jennifer Lynn Barnes

Think Criminal Minds meets teen drama, but with a killer on the loose and a secret FBI program for gifted teens. Cassie has an uncanny knack for profiling people, which lands her in the middle of a high-stakes investigation. Twisty, addictive and full of smart teens with dangerous skills, this series is a binge-read waiting to happen!

How to Hang a Witch by Adriana Mather

Samantha Mather moves to Salem and quickly becomes the town pariah because of her family's witch trial history. When ghosts, curses and a blood-soaked mystery rear their heads, she has to figure out who — or what — is targeting her. This book reads like a supernatural Mean Girls meets The Crucible, with a strong female lead who doesn't back down.





Jersey Fresh Tomato & Corn Summer Salad

- 3 large ripe tomatoes (heirloom or slicing), cut into bite-size pieces
- 2 ears sweet corn, shucked
- ½ small red onion, thinly sliced
- ¼ cup fresh basil leaves, chopped
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar or apple cider vinegar
- · Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Slice kernels from each ear of corn into a large bowl. Add the chopped tomatoes, sliced red onion, and chopped basil. Drizzle with olive oil and vinegar, then season with salt and pepper. Toss gently to combine, being careful not to break up the tomatoes. Let the salad rest for 5–10 minutes before serving to allow flavors to meld.

Grilled Peach & **Zucchini Skewers** with Basil-Honey Drizzle

- · 3 firm-ripe peaches, cut into 8 wedges each
- 2 medium zucchini, sliced into 14-inch thick rounds
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons local honey
- ¼ cup fresh basil leaves, torn
- · Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
- 8 wooden or metal skewers

If using wooden skewers, soak them in water for at least 30 minutes before grilling. Thread peach wedges and zucchini slices alternately onto skewers. Brush lightly with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Grill over medium heat for 2-3 minutes per side, until grill marks appear and the peaches soften slightly. Remove from the grill, drizzle with honey, and sprinkle with fresh basil before serving.


TALES FROM THE SEEING EYE


"The book is written from the dogs' standpoint. I feel like I understand dogs very well, and cats too. Dogs talk to me, and these dogs talk through me," Marina said.

BEATING THE HEAT: FOUR TIPS TO KEEP YOUR DOG SAFE DURING THE SUMMER!

The Seeing Eye hopes you and your pups are having fun and staying cool in this warm weather.

If you're looking for fun activities to beat the heat, you may consider taking your pups swimming. Some like to swim in the pool or on a leash/line in a lake or the ocean!


But please consider the following four tips when taking your dogs to any of these spots:

- Prolonged exposure to the sun can cause a dog's skin to burn (just like humans!). And hot sand can burn their pads, so avoid long walks on the beach and always provide a shady spot for them to rest.
- Salt, chlorine, and algae can irritate a pup's coat and make them sick if ingested. Please discourage them from drinking the water and monitor for signs of itchiness, Gl upset, and/or disorientation.
- Always rinse off/bathe your pup after it is done swimming. Remember to dry the fur and ears thoroughly. Use an ear cleaner with a drying agent so they don't develop an ear infection. Watch for hot spots or skin irritations that may develop under moist fur.
- Provide the pup with plenty of fresh, clean water and give them time to chill out and observe what's going on around them. It's a great exposure opportunity; think of it like TV for dogs!





For Locals Who've Been Working Nonstop

You don't need a week off to enjoy what's left - just a little planning and a willingness to jump in when the chance comes. Keep your swimsuit under your work clothes and a towel in your trunk so you can hit the beach the second you clock out. That 5 p.m. swim - when the crowds have thinned and the water's still warm from the day - can feel like a vacation crammed into 30 minutes.

If you've been putting off "the big stuff," stop waiting. Take that sailing or surfing lesson you've been eyeing since June. Rent a kayak and drift through the back bays while the marsh grass glows in the late light. Book a charter and go fishing or crabbing with friends. Sign up for that sunrise beach bootcamp or yoga class, even if it's just once. You'll never regret doing it, but you'll kick yourself if you put it off until next year.

Not every moment has to be a production. Grab dinner to go and eat it on the seawall with your toes dangling above the water. Walk the boardwalk at night with no agenda but to follow the smell of funnel cake. Invite a coworker for a spontaneous ice cream run after a long shift. These bite-size adventures can turn a regular workday into one that actually feels like summer.



For Visitors and Seasonal Regulars

If you've been here since Memorial Day, the end of summer is your cue to switch things up. Skip your usual routine and go after the experiences that give the season its signature. See a movie on the beach with the waves as your soundtrack. Catch a free concert under the stars with your feet in the sand. Climb Lucy the Elephant and take in the view when the sky turns gold over the bay.

Make a New Tradition

Some end-of-summer memories happen without planning; others are worth locking in. Maybe you throw a "summer send-off" cookout every Labor Day weekend. Maybe you host a beach picnic on the last Friday night of August. My family always has breakfast for dinner on the last night of summer before school starts - it started as a joke and turned into a tradition that signals the official close of the season.

Your tradition could be anything: an annual group photo at your favorite spot, a night swim with friends, a boardwalk crawl where you hit all your must-have snacks in one night, or even painting seashells with kind messages and hiding them along the shore for strangers to find. The point is to make something so fun and memorable that when summer's end rolls around next year, it's non-negotiable.



Last Call

The season's still alive - the music, the heat, the hum of the rides, the smell of salt in the air - but the finish line is in sight. Don't coast toward it. Make these final weeks count by going after the things you've been talking about all summer, trying something you've never done before, or finally chasing a goal you set for yourself months ago.

Whether it's learning to sail, finding the best taco on the island, spotting a dolphin in the wild, climbing to the highest view in the county, or just sitting still and watching a perfect sunset, now is the time. The days are hot, the nights are cool, and you've still got the chance to make this summer go out in style - with stories, laughs, and maybe a brand-new tradition you'll keep alive for years.









CAUSES OF HOT SPOTS AND TREATMENT IN DOGS

Hot spots, or acute moist dermatitis, can occur at any time of the year but are most common in the summer months. Hot spots are inflamed painful skin sores or lesions that usually look moist, and are caused by continuous, excessive scratching, licking, or chewing in the same area, breaking the skin's protective barrier thereby allowing bacteria and extra yeast to enter the dermis. Underlying issues could be flea related (usually affecting the top base of the tail), allergies (food, grass, medications, airborne allergens), anxiety or boredom. When exposed to an allergen like pollen, the body releases chemicals which cause itching and inflammation. Also, dogs that swim, and usually those with drop ears, can develop hot spots from scratching under the ears.

Dogs that have heavy coats that do not dry thoroughly after exposure to water, even rain, can develop mats that will result in irritation and hot spots. Towel drying will suffice with short-haired dogs, but longer haired dogs and double-coated dogs will need brushing and blow drying. Anal gland discomfort can cause your dog to lick or chew in that area, so check under your dog's tail for possible signs of irritation at least once a week. If your dog gets groomed, by you or at a shop, always check for undetected mats, scrapes, cuts, or clipper burns as these can result in excessive scratching, licking, or biting and can cause inflammation.

Zoey is prone to licking her paws out of boredom. She never breaks the skin. If I catch her doing it, I tell her to stop, or I put her Lamb Chop toy in front of her and she licks that, or I spray her paws with a good paw spray like Scout, or Dr. Richard's Organic Skin Spray, which is also good for hot Spots. I also recommend Allercaine-with Lidocaine, and Bittran III which discourages chewing.

If you want to keep your dog from getting to the area while it is healing, use an inflated soft "donut" collar, or wrap the area with bitter wrap, (available at the Wagging Tail), or any self-adhering wrap that you can spray with an anti-chew product or wipe with a mixture of water and cayenne pepper. After you wash the lesion gently with mild, hypoallergenic soap like Cetaphil, clip or carefully shave around the area to keep hair from mixing with oozing from the sore and to help with medication.

I have mentioned a few items which will help in the healing, but you can also use a first aid CREAM (not an ointment) like Neosporin. Dogs that are in good health can handle the use of a generic 1% hydrocortisone cream as well, applying 3-4 times a day. For dogs that cannot be given any type of steroid, products that contain pramoxine will suffice. Refrain from peeling a scab that may form. If you miss a lesion that might be more than 24 hours old, you may be facing an infection, so start treatment immediately, and if there is little or no improvement consult your veterinarian for an antibiotic.
