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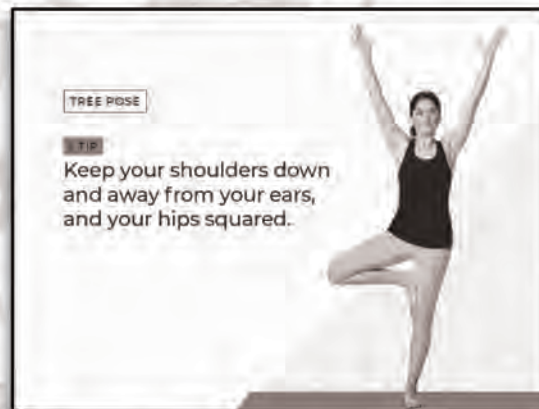

YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK - Tree Pose (Vrksasana)

Tree pose is an excellent introduction to balancing postures. If you feel yourself beginning to topple, step out easily. Avoid counterbalances by jutting your hip to the side of your standing leg.

Focus your gaze on the floor and try varying foot positions to see what works for you: Heel resting low on the ankle, on a block, or above or below the knee.

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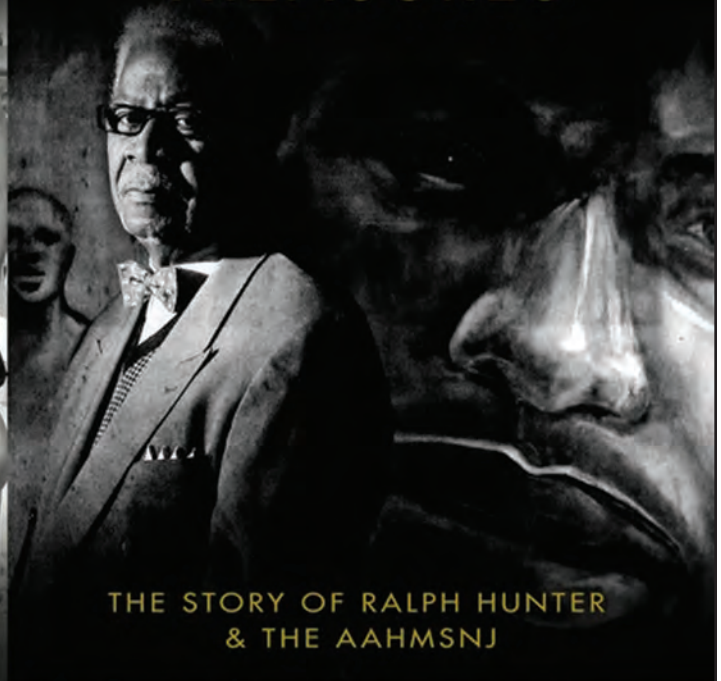

SJI, an energy infrastructure holding company, and OPAL Fuels, a leader in the production, marketing, and distribution of renewable and compressed natural gas (RNG and CNG), celebrated the ribbon cutting of their Atlantic County Utilities Authority's (ACUA) Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Project in Egg Harbor Township, N.J.

The RNG facility will capture and process landfill gas into RNG, providing a renewable, lower-carbon fuel alternative to diesel and conventional natural gas. The project marks a significant milestone for SJI, as it will be the first to deliver RNG into the pipeline system of South Jersey Gas, a subsidiary of SJI. The milestone event was attended by local and state elected officials, and company leadership.

"We are thrilled to cut the ribbon on this project, which signifies another milestone for SJI," said Chet Benham, President, SJI Renewable Energy Ventures. "This project underscores our commitment to innovation and continuing efforts in renewable energy solutions."

The RNG produced at the ACUA plant is planned to be used as transportation fuel and directly injected into the South Jersey Gas pipelines, offering RNG for the first time to supply energy to homes and businesses in the South Jersey Gas territory.

The facility is anticipated to have a nameplate capacity of 2,500 SCFM of landfill gas and is expected to produce more than 650,000 MMBtu, which is equivalent to nearly 4.6 million gallons of gas, per year of RNG.

"ACUA has consistently demonstrated its commitment to exploring and implementing technologies that transform waste into a resource and improve our environment," said ACUA President Matthew DeNafo. "This project embodies that commitment, and we're happy to celebrate its opening alongside our wonderful partners OPAL and SJI."

SJI and OPAL Fuels Celebrate Landmark Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Project with Atlantic County Utilities Authority



Once operational, the RNG produced at the ACUA's solid waste landfill is also expected to reduce methane emissions from the landfill and avoid over 346,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide (CO₂) per year.

"The opening of this facility marks an important milestone in OPAL Fuels' mission of turning waste into clean, domestic energy," said Adam Comora, Co-Chief Executive Officer of OPAL Fuels. "This project reduces emissions, improves local air quality, creates jobs, and strengthens American energy independence. As we drive forward with a focus on strategic growth and operational excellence, this project serves as an example of how landfills can benefit from producing RNG by generating financial value, cutting methane emissions, and displacing diesel to decarbonize transportation."

The process is expected to reduce the volume of methane gas combusted at the facility, resulting in a reduction in on-site emissions. The RNG project represents the first collaboration between SJI and OPAL Fuels as part of their previously announced 50/50 joint venture to develop, construct, own and operate RNG facilities.

Her accomplishments have been recognized in esteemed publications like Marquis' Who's Who of American Women, Who's Who of the World, The Social Directory, and the National Biographical Society. Fast forward to 2015, Ms. Papa achieved a remarkable milestone by being inducted into the Hall of Fame of the American Repertory Ballet. Samhain, which begins at nightfall on October 31 and continues until sunset on November 1 every year, is considered one of the most important festivals of the ancient Celtic religion. Samhain is considered to be the time when gods become visible to humankind, and they tend to play tricks on their worshipers. This day used to be a day of fear and danger. Sacrifices were one of the vital rites of the festival as Celts believed they were essential to prevail over the perils before them that the deities could have laid down.

History of Samhain

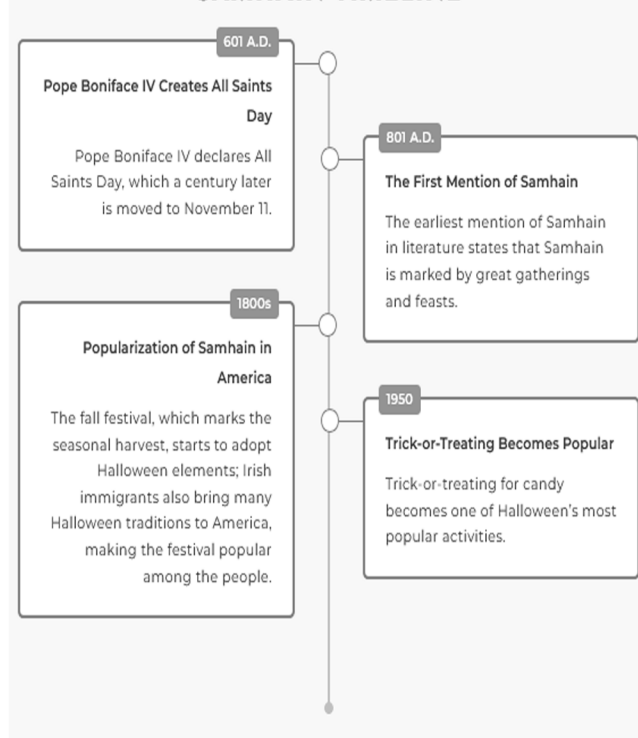
For the ancient Celts, Samhain was an agricultural festival that marked the time when summer ended, and people took stock of the food before winter. With the end of the harvest season, it was also considered a time of supernatural intensity when the forces of darkness walked on Earth.

Ancient Celtic people used to build large bonfires, hoping to please the gods who would safeguard their livestock and harvest in return. It is also a festival of separation between summer and winter, the light and the dark. It was believed that the normal order of the universe is suspended during Samhain. The barrier between the physical world and the spirit world ceased to exist during this day, which allowed for communication between humans and spirits.

To avoid the spirits, Celts disguised themselves in costumes that consisted of animal heads, skins, and horns so that spirits would consider them fellow supernatural beings and not humans. Animals were sacrificed to please the Celtic deities, and people used to take coals from the central fire of bonfires to light their hearths.

In the 7th century, Pope Boniface IV created All Saints Day, which a century later was moved to November 11 — it acted as a Christian substitute to Samhain. Before the saintly celebration was observed on the day of All Hallows Eve or Halloween. From Celtic regions, the holiday started to spread to other places. By the 1800s, the fall festival which marked the seasonal harvest started to have Halloween elements and Irish immigrants, who were escaping the Potato Famine, brought many Halloween traditions to America, which popularized this festival.

Samhain Activities

- Honor nature - Samhain is a celebration of the changing seasons and the end of the harvest season. Honor nature on this day by appreciating its cycle.
- Put on a fancy costume - Wear an exotic costume and host or attend a party. Don't be afraid to try on something different and enjoy the day with loved ones.
- Understand the meaning behind the festival - Research the origins as well as the evolution of the festival. Learn about its significance to believers and society at large.

5 Interesting Facts About Samhain

- 1 - Samhain created zombies - During Samhain, people told stories about the dead man returning from the underworld to burn people to death.
- 2 - Human heads were used as decorations - Irish people used to carve demonic faces into turnips to scare away evil spirits, but before turnips, Celtic warriors used to behead enemies and mount their heads in villages to protect people from evil.
- 3 - Costumes were worn for protection - Ancient Irish people wore costumes and masks, disguised as spirits, to protect themselves from supernatural attacks.
- 4 - Children could've been sacrificed - According to the "Book of Invasions," people used to sacrifice two-thirds of their children, corn, and milk to supernatural forces during Samhain.
- 5 - The forerunners of trick-or-treaters - In the 1500s, people in Ireland, Scotland, and Wales used to disguise themselves as demonic beings and went from door to door to collect food for the feast.

Why We Love Samhain

- It is a celebration of nature - Samhain is a harvest festival with pagan origins. It celebrates the end of the harvest season and the arrival of winter and is about halfway between the autumn equinox and winter solstice.
- It brings the community together - The rituals of Samhain are communal in nature. On this day, people make merry by wearing costumes and trick-or-treating.
- It has a rich history - Samhain has an ancient Celtic history and is connected with several significant events in Irish mythology. The festival changed as it reached different nations, which makes it an even more interesting event.



Spirits of the Season in Atlantic County

As October draws to a close and the veil between autumn and winter begins to thin, Atlantic County carries forward the ancient rhythms that Samhain once honored - celebrations of harvest, reflection, and the mystery of what lies beyond. Here, the traditions live on not through bonfires on Irish hillsides, but through the flicker of porch lights, the scent of cider, and the gatherings that mark the changing season.

Across the county, harvest festivals and haunted tours bring people together in ways that would feel familiar to Samhain's earliest celebrants. In Mays Landing, the annual Ghost Walk winds through the historic downtown, where costumed storytellers share the tales of spirits said to linger from centuries past. At local farms from Egg Harbor Township to Hammonton, families pick pumpkins, sip hot chocolate, and wander corn mazes that echo the old Celtic idea of honoring both nature's bounty and its mystery.

Even Atlantic City finds its own rhythm in the season, where boardwalk bonfires, art nights, and costumed festivities turn the shoreline into a place of revelry and remembrance. It's a time when past and present blur - when the county's history, from shipwreck legends to colonial spirits, whispers through the salt air.

Samhain reminds us that every ending is also a beginning. Whether it's a night spent under the stars, a lantern glowing on a doorstep, or a walk through autumn leaves, Atlantic County keeps that ancient balance alive - between light and dark, harvest and rest, memory and renewal.

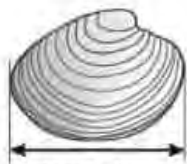

Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njfw/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Graveling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.

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BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP

Ingredients :

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 1 medium carrot, chopped
- 2 medium potatoes, cubed
- 1 medium butternut squash - peeled, seeded, and cubed
- 1 (32 fluid ounce) container chicken stock
- salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

5. Serve hot and enjoy!



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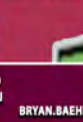
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Atlantic County High School Football: Week 9 Roundup

Week 9 closed the regular season with separation and statement wins across Atlantic County. St. Joseph finished in full stride with a career day from its quarterback, St. Augustine fell just short in a state-ranked duel, and Mainland flexed late-season dominance in a shutout over Delsea. Pleasantville kept rolling, Cedar Creek finally blinked, and several programs - from Absegami to Oakcrest - went down swinging in games that showcased how far they've come since August.

Absegami's offense stayed lively but couldn't overcome Cumberland's second-half surge, falling 13-10 in a defensive struggle. Dameir Burke again anchored the ground game, topping 100 yards, while the Braves' defense kept the Colts out of the end zone until the closing minutes. The loss dropped Absegami to 3-6 and ended their bid for back-to-back wins, but the late-season fight reflected a group that's regained its offensive identity under pressure.

Atlantic County Institute of Technology closed strong, snapping a five-game skid with a 33-7 win over Egg Harbor Township. Quarterback Joseph Handle threw for 134 yards and three touchdowns - a career best - while Nasir Macon rushed for 102 and a score. The RedHawks' defense forced multiple turnovers and limited EHT to a single late touchdown. For the Eagles, now 1-8, Jordan Smith's 45-yard run in the third quarter was a rare bright spot in an otherwise uphill season.



Mainland delivered one of the county's cleanest efforts of the fall, shutting out Delsea 35-0 behind a balanced offense and a defense that swarmed from start to finish. Jake Eckman and Chris Marino each grabbed interceptions, while Sean Carey rushed for two touchdowns as the Mustangs improved to 5-4. The win gave Mainland momentum heading into the playoff brackets, where their size and experience up front could make them a dangerous mid-seed draw in Group 4.



Cedar Creek's seven-game win streak came to an end in a 20-17 loss at Ocean City. The Pirates got 142 yards and a touchdown from Aamir Dunbar, but a late Raider field goal proved the difference. Justus Peyton added his third interception in as many games, while Gyan King blocked a punt to briefly give Cedar Creek life. At 7-2, the Pirates remain among South Jersey's most complete teams and will likely enter the Group 3 playoffs as one of the top four seeds - a position that keeps the road to the sectional title running through Egg Harbor City.

St. Augustine Prep battled toe-to-toe with powerhouse Millville before falling 28-21 in a game that lived up to its billing. The Hermits held the lead into the fourth quarter before the Thunderbolts surged late behind Lotzeir Brooks, whose two touchdowns swung momentum. Matt Reed threw for a pair of scores and kept Prep within reach until the final possession. Now 6-2, the Hermits host Holy Spirit Friday in a matchup that could determine home-field advantage for the opening round of the Non-Public A bracket.

Holy Spirit, meanwhile, enters that game scorching hot after consecutive 40-plus-point performances. Their most recent win - a 48-0 rout of Ocean City - featured dominant line play and three touchdown passes from Derek Healy. Rested and balanced, the Spartans (4-3) are trending toward a mid-seed placement in the same bracket as Prep, setting up the possibility of a high-stakes rematch in November.

St. Joseph looked untouchable in a 41-0 blowout of Middle Township, a performance highlighted by a record-setting night from quarterback Anthony Salamone, who threw for 304 yards and five touchdowns while adding another on the ground. Cole Brubaker hauled in two scores as the Wildcats (7-1) extended their win streak to four, outscoring opponents 164-40 in that stretch. St. Joe's dominance should secure a top-two seed in Non-Public B and guarantee a home start when the playoff brackets drop.



Pleasantville quietly kept its hot streak alive, topping Gloucester City 34-23 for its fifth win in six games. Keon Jefferson again led the way offensively, while the defense forced three turnovers and held late. The Greyhounds (6-3) are peaking at the right time and are projected to make the Group 2 playoffs for the first time since 2021 - a reward for a defense that has allowed just 12 points per game over the past month.

Atlantic City (7-1) was idle this week but sits securely in the upper tier of the Group 5 South bracket, likely earning a top-three seed behind a defense that's given up single-digit points in five straight outings. The Vikings' balanced attack led by Marvin Burroughs Jr. and DonTaye Thompson makes them one of the most dangerous playoff matchups in the state's largest classification.



Oakcrest showed grit despite a 28-20 loss at Lower Cape May, getting 141 rushing yards from Donovan Linthicum and 49 receiving yards from Jaden Harvey. Freshman quarterback Zane Forest threw a touchdown and continues to show poise beyond his years, giving the Falcons reasons for optimism heading into the offseason at 2-7.

Hammonton's season woes continued with a 21-0 loss at Shawnee, their eighth straight defeat. Sophomore standout Cole Anderson ran for 158 yards and two scores for the Renegades, while Hammonton's defense battled through 30 minutes of field-position pressure before fatigue took over. The Blue Devils will finish at Lacey Township on Wednesday looking to salvage pride and momentum for 2026.

Week 9 made the picture clear. Atlantic City, St. Joe's, Cedar Creek, Mainland, and Prep are in prime playoff form; Holy Spirit and Pleasantville have surged into the conversation; and the rest of the county's programs can see the blueprint for what works. For some, November means game plans and brackets. For others, it's reflection and rebuilding. Either way, Atlantic County football closes the regular season with proof of progress - and a postseason field stacked with teams ready to make noise when the lights stay on.

The Beauty in Breaking by Michele Harper

After the collapse of her marriage, Michele Harper finds herself starting again in an unfamiliar city, treating patients whose pain mirrors her own. Medicine had taught her precision and control, but not surrender - not the slow, humbling process of personal healing. Through each encounter in the hospital, she rediscovers empathy and the quiet art of being present, her story unfolding like a meditation on the shared fragility that binds us all.

Live A Little Better by John Beyer

Growing up in the chaos of LeFrak City, John Beyer learned early how to survive, but not yet how to thrive. His adulthood mirrored that turbulence: fast success, hard falls and a fight with addiction that nearly took everything. Through recovery, fatherhood and the quiet grace of second chances, he discovered a new way to move through life. Through moments of discomfort, heartbreak and single fatherhood, he learns that clarity comes when you stop running and start making space for your real values. 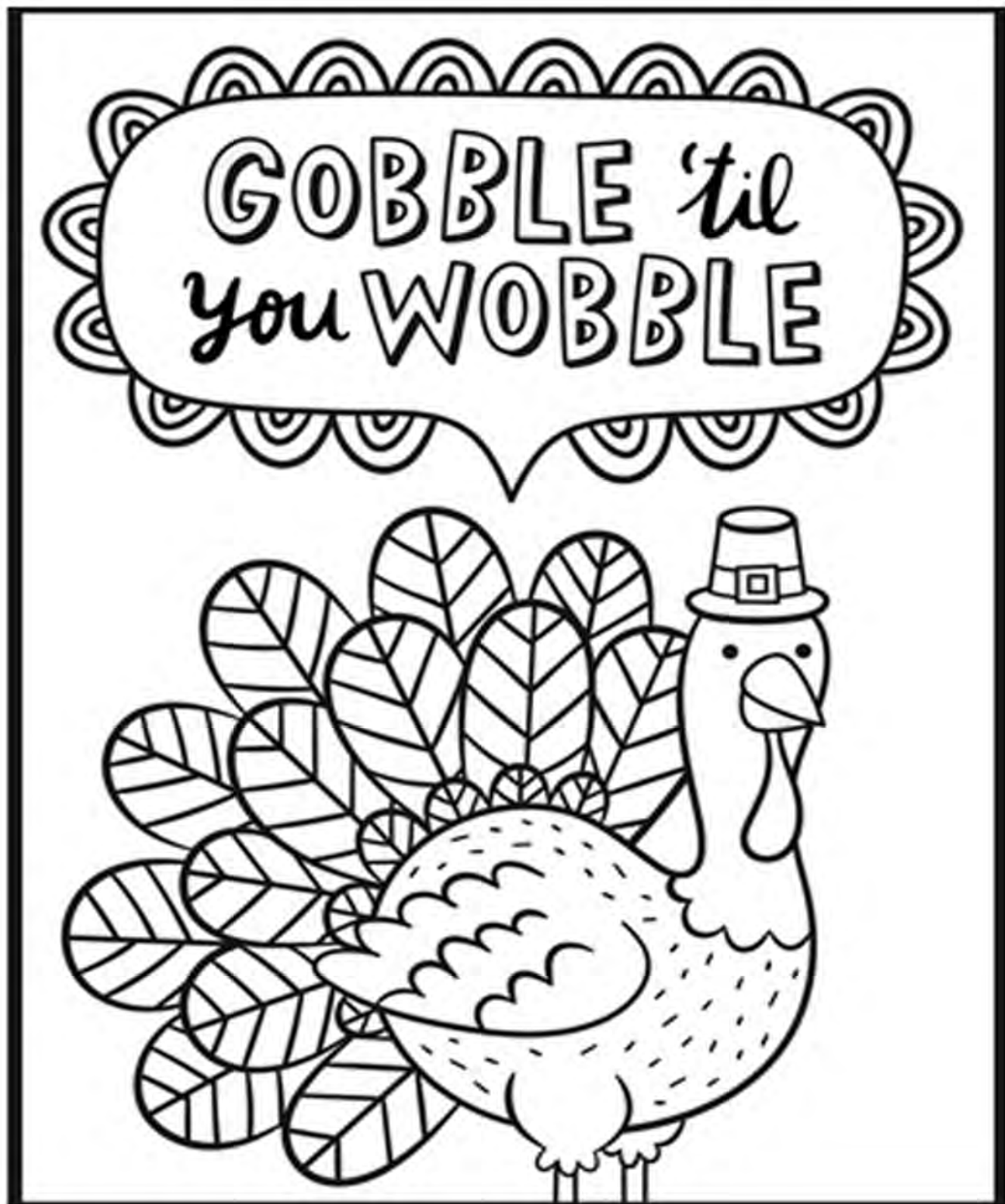

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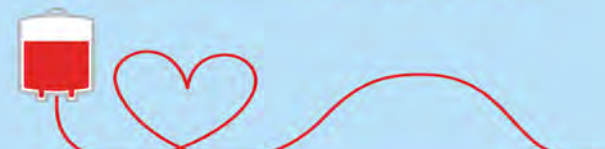

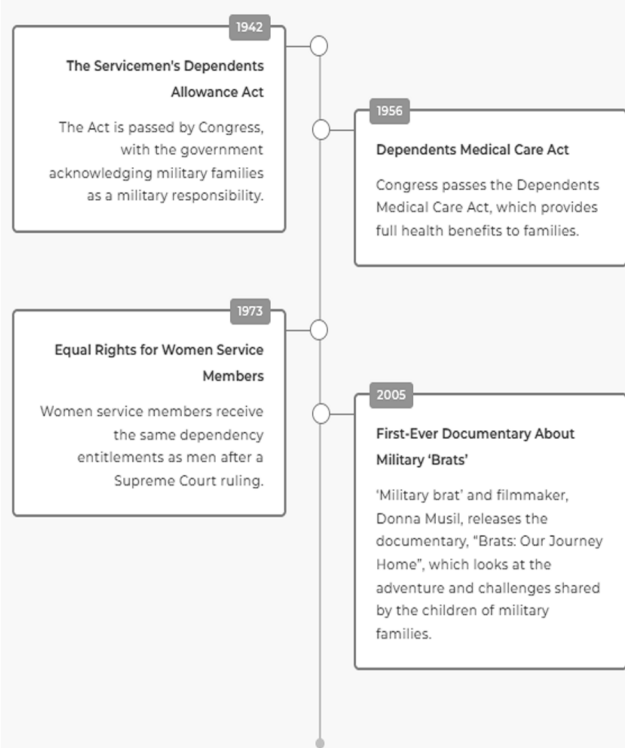
History of Military Family Month

5 Facts About Military Families

- 1 - There are 84,000 military personnel couples - These couples get deployed at the same time, leaving their young children in the care of their extended families.
- 2 - Service members divorce less frequently - The military divorce rate was 3.1% in 2014, compared to a 3.6% civilian divorce rate.
- 3 - Service members start families early - Service members are more likely to get married and have children at a younger age, as compared to civilians.
- 4 - Male military spouses - Only 5% of military family members that stay behind are men.
- 5 - Relocation rate very high - Military families relocate every two or three years, which is 10 times more often than civilian families.

Why is Military Family Month Important

- Military families are our unsung heroes - The dedication and contributions of military families often go unnoticed. Without their contributions, the military won't be able to survive, which is why this month honors all the members of their families.
- They deserve to be honored - Families of service members face constant stress and obstacles when their spouses or parents are deployed. Taking care of everything single-handedly, while worrying about their spouse's safety, can be physically and psychologically overwhelming. A little show of appreciation is the least we can do to honor them.
- Appreciation events are held - Events are organized all month long to honor the military families. Many organizations host dinners, webinars, and educational opportunities to thank the families of our service members.

Honoring Military Families in Atlantic County

In Atlantic County, the spirit of Military Family Month runs deep. From the flight lines of the 177th Fighter Wing at the Atlantic City International Airport to the Coast Guard Air Station at the FAA's William J. Hughes Technical Center in Egg Harbor Township, military service has long been a part of the region's fabric. The 177th Fighter Wing of the New Jersey Air National Guard has operated from this base since 1958, flying F-16C Fighting Falcons and serving in missions around the world, including Operations Noble Eagle and Iraqi Freedom. Just a few miles away, the Coast Guard Air Station Atlantic City patrols the Mid-Atlantic coast, performing search and rescue missions and protecting our waters year-round.

Beyond the bases, the support network for service members and their families continues throughout the county. The Atlantic County Office of Veterans Services in Northfield connects veterans and their loved ones with benefits, legal guidance, and wellness resources, while the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Office at the Atlantic City Armory assists with claims, family programs, and transition services. At ACCC, the Veterans Services Office helps military-connected students and spouses access education benefits and campus support. Together, these programs ensure that the families behind every uniform have a community standing beside them.

Atlantic County also honors its heroes in lasting ways. The Atlantic County Veterans Museum and the Richard E. Squires Veterans Cemetery in Estell Manor serve as both memorials and gathering places - sites where ceremonies, tributes, and quiet reflection remind us that sacrifice endures beyond service. Whether it's a wreath placed in November, a scholarship awarded to a veteran's child, or a neighbor lending a hand during deployment, the county's appreciation is constant. This Military Family Month, we celebrate not only those who serve, but also the families who make that service possible - keeping home strong while their loved ones defend it.

Philadelphia's momentum feels electric again. The Eagles hit their stride just before the bye, the Sixers opened their new season with a fresh sense of purpose, the Flyers are showing life and energy under early-season pressure, and the Union are tightening the final bolts before their postseason run. Every corner of the city is buzzing, and for once, it feels like all four teams are pulling in the same direction.

Eagles: Power and Proof

The Eagles reasserted themselves in dominant fashion, rolling past the Giants 38-20 in a game that reestablished both rhythm and confidence. Saquon Barkley broke free for a 65-yard touchdown on the first snap and finished with 150 yards rushing before leaving with a minor groin strain - his biggest outing of the year and a reminder of how dynamic this offense becomes when he's healthy. Jalen Hurts threw four touchdown passes, spreading them among Dallas Goedert, Jahan Dotson, and Barkley, with the kind of precision that makes defenses look helpless.

The ground game set the tone, amassing nearly 300 yards behind a rejuvenated offensive line. Rookie Tank Bigsby broke the century mark in relief, and the play-calling of first-year coordinator Kevin Patullo - once the subject of scrutiny - has clicked at last. The balance between tempo and power finally feels right, and the unit's confidence is unmistakable.

Defensively, the Eagles flexed their depth. Jalyx Hunt and the front four sacked Giants quarterback Jaxson Dart five times, while Quinyon Mitchell's steady coverage helped close down the perimeter. Even missing A.J. Brown and Brandon Graham, the team looked cohesive, controlled, and confident from start to finish.

At 6-2 heading into the bye, the Eagles sit in prime position. The injuries are minor, the rhythm is back, and the road ahead feels wide open. For all the early-season anxiety, this looks once again like a team built for January.

Sixers: Structure Over Speculation

The Sixers' preseason experiments are over, and the results have been immediate. Back from Abu Dhabi, Nick Nurse's squad opened its home slate with sharper passing, steadier spacing, and a team-wide buy-in that hasn't been felt in years. Tyrese Maxey has taken ownership of the tempo, while Joel Embiid looks rejuvenated as the offensive fulcrum - operating more from the high post, moving the ball with purpose, and trusting the rhythm around him.

Nurse's influence is visible in every possession. The team's decision speed - how fast they move the ball, rotate on defense, and identify mismatches - has dramatically improved. Jared McCain's near return will deepen the rotation even more, but the emphasis right now is chemistry: establishing who closes games, who anchors the wings, and how to maintain intensity on both ends without draining Embiid early.

Off the court, the energy is light and focused. Gone are the whispers and distractions that once shadowed this roster. What remains is a group that seems ready to let its work do the talking. If the early sample holds, the Sixers' new era under Nurse could prove more substance than speculation.

Flyers: Early Spark, Growing Grit

The Flyers' first two weeks have been a mix of flash and fortitude, and that's exactly what coach John Tortorella wanted. Sean Couturier continues to lead by example, pacing the offense and stabilizing a locker room full of emerging talent. Trevor Zegras's creative spark has ignited the attack - his behind-the-net assist and open-ice reads have drawn attention leaguewide - while Travis Sanheim's play on the blue line has been quietly excellent.

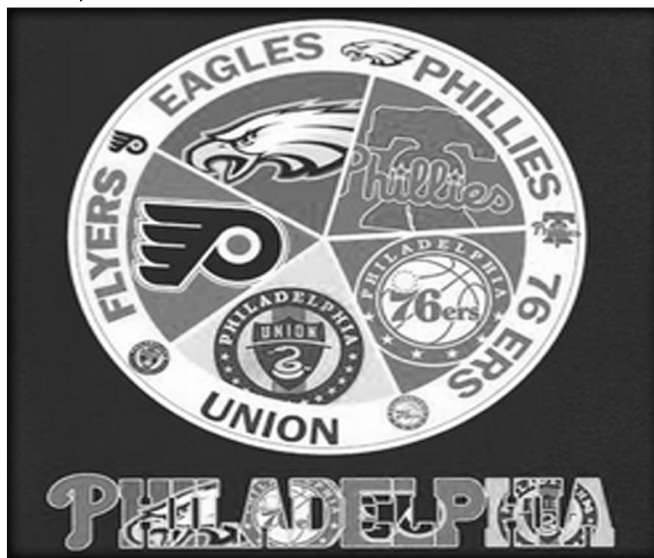
The 5-2 opening win over Florida showed what this roster can do at full throttle, but follow-ups against Winnipeg and Toronto revealed the work still ahead. Defensive lapses and turnovers in the neutral zone cost momentum, yet the team's energy never wavered. They skate hard, forecheck harder, and refuse to fold late in games - a change in DNA that hasn't gone unnoticed by fans.

In goal, Dan Vladar has been steady through heavy workloads, giving the team a chance even when the defensive structure frays. The Flyers' next stretch will be a proving ground: a road-heavy schedule that will test depth, discipline, and endurance. For now, the city's youngest roster is earning something every contender needs first - belief.

Union: Calm Before the Climb

The Union's playoff readiness isn't about spectacle; it's about control. Bruno Damiani continues to deliver in key moments, and Andrew Rick's reliability in net anchors a team that values structure above all else. They've spent recent matches managing legs, fine-tuning spacing, and rehearsing the tempo that wins in knockout play.

With Subaru Park set to host their postseason opener, the focus is sharp: set pieces, substitution patterns, and transitions from defense to counterattack. It's quiet confidence, not caution, that defines them now - and that's exactly how they like it.



Looking Ahead: The City in Sync

The Eagles look like themselves again, the Sixers are starting to look like something new, the Flyers are proving they're more than a rebuild, and the Union are ready for the grind that counts. For once, every Philadelphia team feels aligned - focused, confident, and climbing at the same time. In a city that thrives on momentum, this is the kind that could last well into winter.

NFL Europe

Questions:

- 1) A developmental football league for the NFL, which brought American football to international markets, NFL Europe (prior to its name change in 1995) operated under what name from 1991-92?
