Atlantic County is bursting with fun for the whole family! Want to kick things off? The Steel Pier is a must-see—it's a classic boardwalk spot with rides, games, and the third biggest observation wheel in the country! Just a short walk away, Island Waterpark at Showboat is the ultimate all-weather adventure for families. With slides, splash zones, relaxing cabanas, and a lazy river, it's perfect for all ages. Check out even more family-friendly spots in Atlantic City below.

For outdoor fun, Storybook Land is a great choice. This 20-acre family amusement park in Egg Harbor Township has been around since 1955, thanks to John and Esther Fricano. It's located on U.S. Rte 322, about 2 miles west of exit 37 on the Garden State Parkway, and it's sure to be a memorable experience.



If you're looking for indoor fun, the Island Waterpark and Lucky Snake Arcade at the Showboat in Atlantic City are perfect. Island Waterpark is the world's largest indoor beachfront water park, with 11 waterslides, a 500-foot lazy river, and a retractable glass roof for year-round tropical fun. Lucky Snake Arcade is a massive, family-friendly indoor entertainment center, also inside the Showboat Hotel. It's one of the largest arcades on the East Coast, covering over 85,000 to 100,000 square feet.



Want a bit of nature? Check out Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge, or stroll through Historic Smithville Village, where you can explore unique shops and boutiques while enjoying some small-town magic. If you're looking for some fun for the kids, Lake Lenape Park in Mays Landing is perfect! It's a 2,000-acre wilderness area and reservoir known for its special cedar water, divided into two parts. Lake Lenape East has boat ramps, a boathouse, and the historic Lake Lenape Lighthouse. Lake Lenape West has playgrounds, pavilions, camping spots, and mountain biking trails.



Feeling like a friendly challenge? Try your hand at Atlantic City Miniature Golf, where the waterfalls add a magical touch, or swing over to North Beach Mini Golf & Bike Rentals for a game with amazing views of the Absecon Lighthouse. For a tech-savvy twist, Ocean's 18 Mini-Golf & Bar at Ocean Casino Resort offers interactive games that the whole family can enjoy, no matter the weather!



Don't forget to visit the famous Absecon Lighthouse, New Jersey's tallest, for stunning views and great photo opportunities. For families who love the ocean, take a ride on Atlantic City Cruises to see dolphins or soar over the coastline with Atlantic City Parasail for an unforgettable view.



The fun doesn't end there! You absolutely have to check out the Arcade at Harrah's Resort, which is all neon lights and huge games to play. Then, over at Tropicana Atlantic City, Escape AC has several rooms for a super fun and intense 60 minutes for the whole family. THAI CHICKEN COCONUT SOUP

12 ounces of chicken breast boneless skinless fat removed
1 cup coconut milk
1 1/2 cups chicken stock or low sodium broth
5 slices of ginger, fresh and peeled
One cup of white mushrooms, quartered
1 teaspoon of Thai chili paste
4 green onions, sliced (green part reserved for garnish)
1 fresh lemon
1 tablespoon of basil shredded
Pinch of white pepper

Place the chicken breasts in a small sauce pan. Cover completely with cold water and place over moderate heat. Bring water to 180°, just before the water starts to bubble. Poach chicken for 15 minutes or until cooked to 165°. While chicken is poaching, place coconut milk into a sauce pan over moderate heat. Bring to a simmer. Add chili paste and simmer for 10 minutes. Once chicken is cooked and cooled slightly, cut into 1 inch cubes. Add to soup. Finish soup with basil, pepper, and lemon juice to taste. Garnish with chopped green onion.

ATLANTIC CITY - Lifeguards on duty, showers, changing rooms, food permitted, free admission. Visit atlanticcitybeachpatrol.org



BRIGANTINE - Brigantine Beach offers lifeguards on duty, surfing beaches, showers, changing rooms and food permitted. Seasonal tags are \$20 through May 31 and \$25 during regular season. Daily tags are \$10 and weekly tags are \$15. Seniors 65 and older receive a free tag with identification, and there is also a preseason senior rate of \$10 for ages 60 to 64. Active military members receive free tags, with up to four free per family, and veterans receive a free tag for themselves. Visit brigantinebeach.org

EGG HARBOR CITY - Lake Park, 2300 Philadelphia Ave. Lifeguards and restrooms are available. Pre-season seasonal badges are \$15 for ages 5 and up through May 22. Senior citizens age 65 and older and active-duty military badges are \$5 with identification, and that rate remains in effect all season. Pre-season badges are sold at the Tax Office at City Hall, 500 London Ave., Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Cash only. The lake opens Saturday, May 23. Visit eggharborcity.org

HAMILTON TOWNSHIP - Cove Beach at Lake Lenape. Lifeguards on duty, open Thursday through Monday from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. from June 20 through Sept. 7. Daily wristbands are \$10 on weekdays and \$15 on weekends and holidays. Season tags are \$30 if purchased on or after May 1, and a Family Four Pack is \$100. Children 11 and younger are free. Amelia Earhart Day - July 24, 2026

Amelia Earhart Day honors the legendary aviator every July 24, marking her birth in 1897. Celebrate her pioneering flights, her advocacy for women in aviation, and her enduring spirit of adventure. Explore her remarkable contributions and find ways to be inspired by her courage today.

History of Amelia Earhart Day

Amelia Earhart Day celebrates the inspiring life of famous American pilot, Amelia Earhart. July 24 was chosen in honor of her birthday but no other details of how the holiday came about are known.

Amelia Earhart's love of flying began in December 1920, with her first flight in California with World War II pilot, Frank Hawks. Soon after this life-changing experience, in January 1921, Earhart started flight lessons under female pilot Neta Snook. Later that year, she bought her first plane, a yellow Kinner Airster, which she named 'The Canary.'

She received her National Aeronautics Association license in December 1921, just one year after her own first flight and, from there, the sky was her limit! Throughout her life, she achieved many records, the first one in 1922 when she became the first female pilot to fly solo at 14,000 feet.

Earhart was the first female to fly across the Atlantic Ocean solo in 1932. To that point, Charles Lindbergh had been the only other person in the world to accomplish this. Earhart was the first female awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross by Congress.

In 1929, Earhart helped form The Ninety-Nines, an international nonprofit organization whose mission was to advance women in aviation. Launched by 99 women pilots at the time, The Ninety-Nines continues to inspire the new generation of women pilots through education, scholarships, mentoring, and general support linked by a passion for flight.

Earhart's fateful flight around the world began on June 1, 1937, out of Oakland, California. She and navigator Fred Noonan left New Guinea on July 2 with 7,000 miles remaining of their journey. However, this would be the last day they'd be seen alive. Their disappearance remains a mystery to this day, although numerous theories have been proposed.



5 Other Mysterious Plane Disappearances

1 - STENDEC - In 1947, a British South American Airways flight en route to Santiago, Chile messaged 'STENDEC' to air-traffic control and then disappeared - over 50 years later, plane wreckage surfaced along with a deciphered World War II code: "Severe Turbulence Encountered, Now Descending, Emergency Crash-landing."

2 - Bermuda Triangle - The Bermuda Triangle is an area in the Atlantic Ocean marked by Florida's Atlantic coast, Bermuda, and the Greater Antilles where more than 50 airplanes and ships are claimed to have mysteriously disappeared.

3 - Glenn Miller's European flight - In 1944, the flight carrying Glenn Miller, a famous American big-band trombonist, disappeared on its short flight from Bedford (U.K.) to Paris.

4 - Star Tiger & Star Ariel - In 1948 and 1949, British South American Airways had two flights disappear with no debris ever recovered from either incident.

5 - Malaysia Airlines MH370 - From more recent memory, Malaysia Airlines' flight MH370 en route to Beijing vanished in 2014 after being tracked by military radar for an hour upon losing communication with air-traffic control.

Amelia Earhart was born in Atchison, Kansas, on 24 July 1897. Earhart spent most of her early life with her maternal grandparents, who lived in an upper-middle-class home. Amelia 'Amy' Otis, Earhart's mother, married a promising young man who could never break free from the shackles of alcoholism.

Edwin Earhart was always looking for ways to advance his profession and provide a stable financial foundation for his family. Amy would take Earhart and her sister Muriel to their grandparents' house when things got ugly. They went exploring the area, climbing trees, searching for rats, and riding on Earhart's sled.

From an early age, Amelia Earhart defied traditional gender roles, was a basketball player who also completed an auto repair course, and attended college for a short time. The Earhart children seemed to have a sense of adventure, as they headed out every day to explore their surroundings.

Earhart spent her childhood days climbing trees, catching rats with a gun, and 'belly-slammings' her sled downhill with her sister Pidge. Despite the fact that many children enjoyed the outdoors and 'rough-and-tumble' play, some biographers have labelled Amelia a tomboy.

Sisters Amelia and Muriel stayed with their grandparents in Atchison when their parents moved to smaller quarters in Des Moines. The Earhart daughters were homeschooled by their mother and governess at the time. Amelia subsequently said she was "exceedingly fond of reading" and spent many hours in the family's big library. The Earhart children were enrolled in public school for the first time in 1909, when the family was finally reunited in Des Moines, and Amelia, 12, entered seventh grade.

a written self-portrait: "On Psychosis" a Novella Vol. I by Louis Gale

In the first volume of Louis Gale's experimental series, readers enter the restless mind of Amstel, a man moving through psychotic breaks, travel, drug experiences and an increasingly unstable sense of reality. He does not understand the forces working on him, but the deeper he goes, the more difficult it becomes to separate insight from distortion. Written in a nonlinear stream of consciousness, a written self-portrait: "On Psychosis" a Novella Vol. I reflects the rhythm of Amstel's thinking through repetition, abrupt shifts and unconventional typography. The result is less a traditional psychological narrative than an attempt to place readers inside the experience itself.

Strange, darkly funny and often unsettling, the novella asks readers to follow Amstel without the usual guideposts. It is an unusual opening to a larger series about the mind, identity and the possibilities that emerge when familiar ways of understanding the self begin to break apart. The second volume of Louis Gale's series takes Amstel's story beyond the limits of the first book and into the worlds his mind creates. Now confined both literally and psychologically, he moves through imagined realms, philosophical speculation and moments in which love still reaches him, even when its meaning is difficult to grasp. a written self-portrait: "On Tragedy" Volume II continues the series' nonlinear, experimental approach while widening its focus to include higher consciousness, human potential and the uneasy overlap between imagination and reality. The book is less concerned with giving readers easy answers than with showing how Amstel tries to make sense of what he experiences.

For those drawn to unconventional fiction and inward journeys, this second installment offers a fuller view of the series' ambitions. It deepens the mystery around Amstel while suggesting that even within confinement, the mind can still create, question and reach for connection. Gale draws on a life that has included a year of silence, homelessness and psychiatric hospitalization. He later earned a master's

Infernal Tramps: Tales of Weird Terror by Alex Grass

A forgotten video game with a terrifying past. A spiked dog collar wields the power to convert an entire city to the worship of a dead dog. A surgical implant promising the perfect shape gives its wealthy owner far more than she bargained for. These are only a few of the horrors lurking in Alex Grass's *Infernal Tramps*, a collection of 17 stories that seems determined to keep one-upping itself in strangeness. Some tales are brief and brutal; others lead deeper into worlds shaped by obsession, grief, vanity, debt and loneliness. Regardless of the topic, the familiar rarely stays familiar for long.

Grass writes with a taste for the elaborate, grotesque and macabre, spiked by dark humor that arrives when you least expect it. Black-and-white images add to the book's disquieting atmosphere. This is horror for readers who like their fiction unapologetically bizarre and their gore grindhouse-style - the sort of collection that may have you laughing on one page and regretting lunch on the next. 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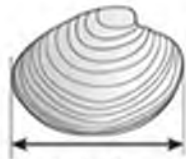

Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/nj-f-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Graveling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-country Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.

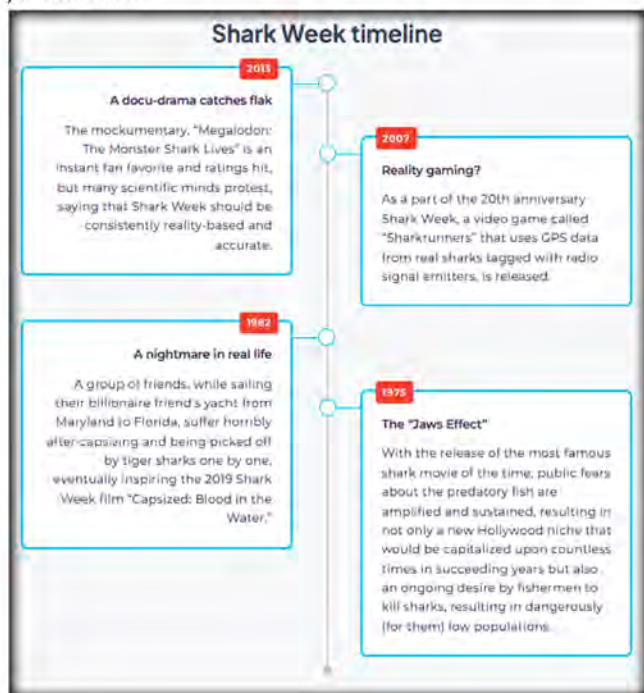
History of Shark Week

In the late 1980s, creator Steve Cheskin and some colleagues were reputedly enjoying a drink and discussing what would be a fun thing to add to the then-young channel's lineup, and somebody said, "You know what would be awesome? Shark Week!" Another member of the group grabbed a pen and wrote the idea down on the closest scrap of paper: the napkin.

Starting in 1988, the idea proved to be a winner, raking in winning ratings for the channel and rekindling America's love affair with the ocean predator, the peak till that point was probably the 1975 movie, "Jaws."

Since that time, Shark Week has gained popularity, adding hosts in 1994 starting with Peter Benchley and eventually household names such as Mike Rowe, Craig Ferguson, and Shaquille O'Neal.

We could go into greater detail, but Shark Week is one of those things you have to experience. Keep your finger on the pulse of cable releases, and don't miss this year's celebration!

FIVE AMAZING FACTS ABOUT GREAT WHITES

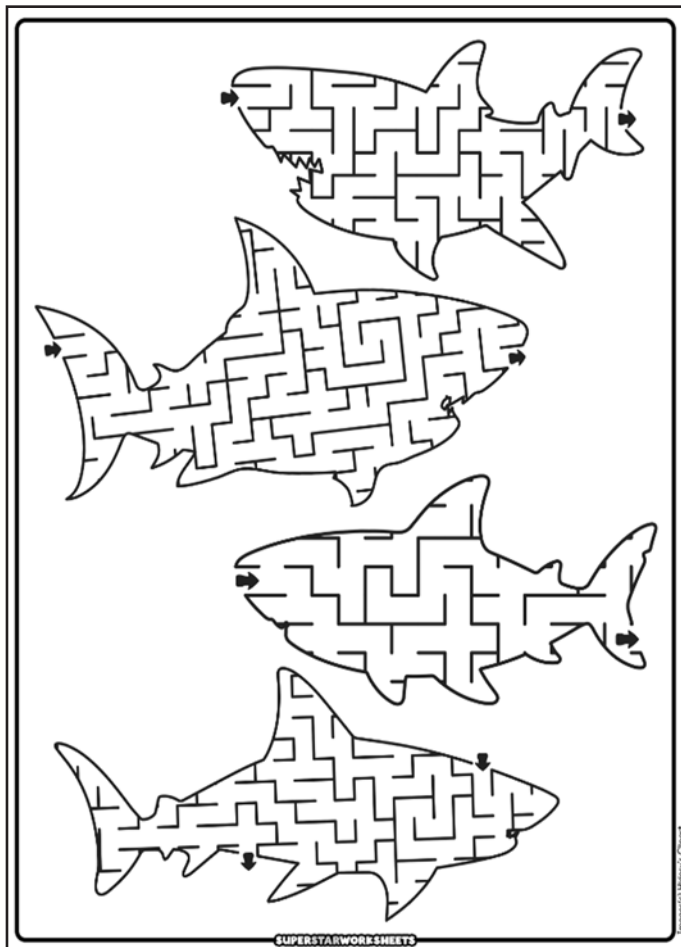
- 1 - Picking and choosing - Once a Great White reaches 2.5 meters (just over 8 feet) long, it will only eat sea mammals, making the switch from a diet of mostly small fish.
- 2 - Sun lovers - Somewhat counterintuitively, the Great White prefers to hunt not at night but in broad daylight, depending upon its eyesight to properly track prey (though the shark does shut its eyes in the moment of the attack).
- 3 - Not calorie counters - To keep up their body temperature (partially by transferring heat from their moving muscles) and to maintain energy levels, Great Whites predominately seek prey with high-fat content, like seals or whales.
- 4 - Big babies - After a gestation period of 18 months, a mother Great White will give birth to four to six "pups," each measuring in length between 1.2 and 1.5 meters (four or five feet)!
- 5 - Not immune to cancer - Contrary to a popular myth that has persisted for decades and resulted in large amounts of shark-fin soup being consumed "medicinally," there is no scientific evidence to support the claim that sharks don't get cancer; they do.

Why We Love Shark Week

- The "Jaws" theme music - Perhaps as a boy or a girl you had an older sibling who would come up behind you in the pool or at the lake, singing the ominous tones from "Jaws," duh-nun, duh-nun, DUH-NUN, before grabbing you like an attacking shark. Hey, what's childhood without inter-sibling trauma? But now, as an adult, you can joke more appropriately with your office cohorts, we presume.
- It's the original "binge-watching" series of programs - Here's a thing: in 1988, the year of Discovery's first Shark Week, MTV still played mostly music videos. You could turn the channel from Michael Jackson's "Dirty Diana" to frightening footage of an Australian Great White decimating a hapless seal. Hmm, which one to choose?
- It's part of Americana - We love it because it's an ingrained part of our culture, like Super Bowl commercials or roadside fast-food joints. To enjoy the heck out of Shark Week is to take your place in the American mythos.

YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK - Staff Pose (Dandasana)

Staff yoga pose is akin to a seated version of Mountain pose (above) in that it offers alignment guidelines for other seated yoga poses. Engage your leg muscles and flex your feet.

Lift your chest and relax your shoulders. You can also allow a gentle bend in your knees so your shoulders can stack over your hips.

Modify by using a block or folded blanket or two if you have trouble sitting straight with your butt flat on the floor. In a typical class, this yoga pose leads to a forward bend.



VITAMIN HIGHLIGHT - Vitamin C

Once you have cold symptoms, drink orange or grapefruit juice to help yourself stay hydrated. Your symptoms may not go away any sooner, but staying hydrated can help you feel better while your symptoms run their course. Your body also needs vitamin C to help your bones, skin, and muscles grow. You'll get enough by including bell peppers, papaya, strawberries, broccoli, cantaloupe, leafy greens, and other fruits and veggies in your diet.

Jersey Corn, Tomato & Blueberry Salad

INGREDIENTS

- 4 ears Jersey sweet corn
- 2 large heirloom tomatoes, chopped
- 1 cup blueberries
- 8 oz burrata
- 4 cups arugula
- Fresh basil
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- Salt & pepper

LEMON HONEY DRESSING:

- ¼ cup olive oil
- 2 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp honey
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- Salt & pepper



DIRECTIONS

Grill corn until lightly charred. Slice kernels from the cob. Whisk together dressing ingredients. Arrange arugula on a platter. Top with corn, tomatoes, blueberries, and torn burrata. Add basil leaves, drizzle with dressing, and season with salt and pepper.

Blueberry Watermelon Basil Lemonade

INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups seedless watermelon, cubed
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- ¾ cup fresh lemon juice (about 5-6 lemons)
- ¼ cup local honey (or to taste)
- 3 cups cold water
- 8-10 fresh basil leaves
- Ice
- Lemon slices and blueberries for garnish



DIRECTIONS

Blend the watermelon and blueberries until smooth. Strain through a fine mesh sieve if desired. Stir in lemon juice, honey, and cold water. Add basil leaves and gently muddle them into the lemonade. Refrigerate for at least 30 minutes before serving. Serve over ice with lemon slices, fresh blueberries, and basil sprigs. Optional Adult Version: Add 1½ ounces of vodka or gin to each glass for a refreshing summer cocktail.

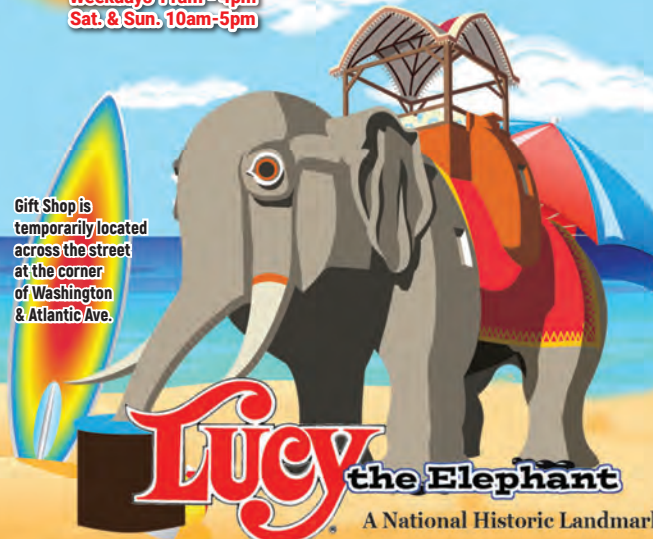

Cardboard Crews Return for the 2nd Annual Mays Landing Regatta Saturday, July 25



If you think you can build a boat out of cardboard and duct tape that can survive a trip across Lake Lenape, now's your chance to prove it.

The 2nd Annual Mays Landing Cardboard Regatta returns to The Cove at Lake Lenape on Saturday, July 25, with races beginning at 10 a.m. After a successful inaugural event, organizers are bringing back one of Mays Landing's most entertaining summer traditions, inviting builders of all ages to put their homemade vessels to the test.

As organizers jokingly put it, "The lake has had a full year to prepare. It is not ready."

Three Ways to Race

Participants can enter one of three divisions based on age:

- Youth Division (Ages 5-13): \$25 per boat
- Adult Division (Ages 14+): \$30 per boat
- All-Ages Division: \$30 per boat

Teams entering the Youth or Adult Division can also race the same boat in the All-Ages Division for an additional entry fee.

Spectating is completely free, making it an easy outing for families, friends and anyone curious to see whether these cardboard creations actually float.



The Rules Are Simple

Every boat must be built using only cardboard and duct tape. Materials such as glue, plastic, resin, screws, staples, clamps, wax, Flex Seal and Flex Tape are prohibited. Boats must be powered by paddles, oars or sails, although those items may be made from any material. Decorations are encouraged, but they can't provide structural support or help keep the boat afloat. All entries must remain family-friendly, and every team is responsible for removing its boat - and any debris - from the water after the race. Boats will also be inspected before launch, and any vessel containing prohibited materials or deemed unsafe will be disqualified.

Winning Isn't Everything

Half the fun is simply seeing what everyone creates.

Some teams spend weeks engineering boats they hope will cruise across the lake. Others focus on elaborate themes, creative costumes and over-the-top decorations. Of course, not every design survives the journey, which is part of what makes the regatta so entertaining. As organizers promise, some will sail, some will sink, but all will look fantastic doing it.



More Than Just a Race

This year's event also includes a food drive benefiting the Main Street Food Pantry, giving participants and spectators an opportunity to support local families while enjoying the day's festivities. Non-perishable food donations are encouraged.

Ready to Build?

Organizers say there's still plenty of time to gather your crew and start building. Whether your goal is taking home a trophy or simply making everyone on shore laugh, the regatta offers a unique challenge that rewards creativity as much as craftsmanship.

Registration remains open, but spots are limited. Or, if you'd rather stay dry, bring a lawn chair and enjoy the action from the shoreline.

The 2nd Annual Mays Landing Cardboard Regatta takes place Saturday, July 25, beginning at 10 a.m. at The Cove at Lake Lenape in Mays Landing. Dignity may be optional, but according to organizers, hilarity is guaranteed.

Ocean City's biggest summer tradition is ready to light up the bay once again as Night in Venice celebrates its 71st anniversary on Saturday, July 25. This year's theme, "Stars, Stripes & Christmas Lights," combines America's 250th anniversary with the fun of Christmas in July, giving participants the opportunity to decorate boats, bayfront homes and businesses with patriotic colors, festive lights and plenty of imagination.

For more than seven decades, Night in Venice has drawn thousands to the bayfront for one of the country's largest boat parades. This year's celebration expands beyond the evening festivities with a charity race, celebrity appearances, family activities and fire-works, making it easy to spend an entire day enjoying one of OC's signature events.

Start the Day with the Night in Venice 5K & 1-Mile Walk

The festivities begin at 8 a.m. with the Night in Venice 5K Run and 1-Mile Walk, benefiting the Ocean City Boys & Girls Cross Country and Track & Field Boosters. The race starts and finishes on Haven Avenue at 19th Street, following an out-and-back course along the Ocean City Bike Path. The 5K begins at 8 a.m., while the untimed 1-Mile Walk starts immediately afterward, making it a great option for families and participants of all ages. Packet pickup will be available from 5 to 8 p.m. Friday, July 24, at the Ocean City Community Center Atrium, 1735 Simpson Avenue. Race-day registration and packet pickup begin at 6:30 a.m. on the basketball courts behind Ocean City Intermediate School. Portable restrooms will be available on site.



Awards will be presented to the overall male and female 5K winners, along with first-, second- and third-place finishers in age groups ranging from 14 and under through 80 and older. The 1-Mile Walk is not timed, and walkers do not need a race bib. Registration is online only, including race-day registration. The entry fee is \$35 and includes a race shirt while supplies last. His appearance at Night in Venice recognizes the enduring connection between baseball and the values that have united Americans for 250 years.

The Parade and Fireworks Take Center Stage

The highlight of the celebration begins at 6:30 p.m., when decorated boats travel from the Ocean City-Longport Bridge to Tennessee Avenue. Free viewing areas will be available at bayfront street ends from Battersea Road through 16th Street, with spectators able to watch the parade from public access points along the route. Spectators can also watch from a ticketed viewing experience at the Bayside Center, 520 Bay Avenue.

Those planning to attend should arrive early, as the most popular viewing areas fill quickly. Free parking and shuttle service begin at 4 p.m., with shuttle lots located at the Ocean City Municipal Airport (25th Street and Bay Avenue), the Tennessee Avenue soccer field off Shelter Road, and the Ocean City Community Center, 1735 Simpson Avenue. Shuttles will transport guests to viewing areas and return them to parking locations after the parade, with service continuing until 10 p.m.

After the final boat passes, fireworks will light up the bay, launching from a barge north of the Ninth Street Bridge and providing a spectacular finale to Ocean City's beloved summer tradition. Whether watching from the shoreline, a waterfront home or aboard one of the many decorated vessels, Night in Venice remains a celebration where creativity, community and hometown pride take center stage.

Jersey Shore Summer Safety: Be Smart in the Water

A day at the Jersey Shore often means swimming, boating, paddling, surfing or letting the kids splash along the water's edge. The ocean, bays and pools are a big part of summer fun, but water can become dangerous quickly when people underestimate currents, depth, weather or fatigue. A few simple precautions can help families enjoy the water more safely.

Swim Where Lifeguards Are Present

The safest place to swim is always near a lifeguard. Lifeguards know the local conditions, including currents, drop-offs and changing surf. Before entering the water, look for posted signs and flags, and follow instructions from beach patrol. If guards are warning swimmers to stay shallow, move away from a certain area or get out of the water, take it seriously.

Children should always be watched closely, even in shallow water. Waves can knock small children down, and crowded beaches can make it easy to lose sight of someone. Designate one adult as the "water watcher" when kids are swimming or playing near the surf.



Know the Risk of Rip Currents

Rip currents are one of the biggest dangers at the beach. They can pull swimmers away from shore quickly, even when the ocean looks manageable. A rip current is not an undertow, and it does not pull people under, but fighting against it can lead to exhaustion.

If you are caught in a rip current, do not panic. Try to stay calm, float if needed and avoid swimming directly against the current. Swim parallel to the shore until you are out of the pull, then angle back toward land. If you cannot get free, wave and call for help.

Boating, Paddling and Personal Watercraft

Life jackets matter. Anyone boating, kayaking, paddleboarding or riding a personal watercraft should wear a properly fitted U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket. Children should wear them at all times around boats and docks.

Before heading out, check the forecast, wind, tide and water conditions. Sudden storms, strong winds and changing tides can make bays and inlets difficult to navigate. Avoid alcohol when operating a boat or personal watercraft, and make sure someone on land knows where you are going and when you expect to return.

Watch the Weather and Your Limits

Water safety is not only about swimming ability. Even strong swimmers can get tired, chilled or caught off guard by waves and currents. Take breaks, drink water and avoid going too far from shore. Never swim alone, never dive into unknown water and avoid swimming during storms or when thunder is heard.

Summer at the Shore is meant to be enjoyed. By choosing guarded beaches, respecting the ocean, using life jackets and staying alert, families can make water safety part of every beach, bay and pool day.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ORGAN MEAT FOR YOUR PETS

Before I begin, I just want to mention the "exciting" rainstorm of Tuesday night. I hope no one sustained any damage because of the winds. We have very happy trees, plants, and lawns this morning, and perhaps it washed to oblivion the overwhelming population of ants.

Some time ago I watched a video by Dr. Marty when he was developing his products of freeze-dried raw dog and cat food. Now his food is advertised on television, which is helpful to acquaint the public with good quality food-if the consumer is not charged to cover the costs of such advertising. The food is already at the high-end cost wise. I used to feed Small Breed to both Zoey and Ebby until I realized that Ebby has a sensitivity to sweet potatoes. I bought freeze-dried raw Turkey (with nothing added) which I add to Ebby's dinner. I also give them each night light cooked frozen food mixed with some Fromm and Honest Kitchen dry. Whatever I am doing seems to be working as their poops are usually perfect. Organ meats are super foods for dogs and cats. I don't like to handle raw, so I stick to a variety of dehydrated protein sources.

LIVER is the most widely used raw because it is so easy to obtain. Some people shy away from liver because it is known as a detoxifier, but the toxins are not stored in the liver which merely filters them out. Analysts have found that there are no more toxins stored in liver than in the kidneys or muscles. The benefits of liver include vitamins A, D, E and K, which are all important fat-soluble vitamins, (they dissolve in fat) and are stored in the liver and fatty tissue until needed elsewhere in the body. They help to keep the heart healthy and for blood to clot. Some food sources with all of us, but only some for pets, are liver, dairy, kale, sweet potato, apricots, tomatoes, carrots, egg yolks, spinach, and cantaloupe.

I feed assorted freeze-dried HEARTS as a treat or sliced thin as a topper. Hearts provide the amino acid Taurine (like sardines) which is vital to a healthy functioning heart, the benefits of which can be destroyed by heat as in cooking or frying. The highest level for cats is from the heart muscle of mice. The very best diet for cats is a healthy mouse. Heart organ meat is the best source of CoQ10, especially from bison, venison, and beef. Eating heart organ (whether in frozen or freeze-dried form) provides iron, zinc, selenium, and B vitamins, essential for "energy balance and prevention of oxidative stress."

STOMACH lining, also called tripe, is sourced from ruminant animals (have four stomach chambers) such as cattle, sheep, goats, or deer and is best fed raw, or raw-frozen. It is also available in cans, and freeze-dried treats. One favorite is green tripe. It is nutritionally dense with digestive enzymes, essential fatty acids, essential amino acids, proteins and packed with vitamins and minerals. Tripe has been common to man and animals for centuries. I will delve into that more in a later issue. Beware, it can be negatively odiferous to us, yet dreamy smelling to our pets.
