

Holiday safety tips for pets from The Humane Society of The United States

Learn how to keep your pets safe during the holiday season.

Pet behavior and holiday guests

 Though the excitement of a party may overwhelm some pets, keep your pets inside during cold weather and provide plenty of toys to keep them busy.

· If needed, provide your cat or dog with a quiet room or crate during holiday parties and/or prepare ahead of time to discourage barking. Inform your visitors ahead of time that you have a pet.

Skip the table scrap snacks: Foods not to feed pets

· Bones: Bones easily splinter and can cause serious health problems (even death) for your pet.

 Candy: Particularly chocolate—which is toxic to dogs, cats and fer-rets—and any candy containing the toxic sweetener Xylitol. Chives

 Citrus and pits: Keep foods containing citric acid away from your pets. Foods such as cherry pits, peach pits and apple seeds contain essential oils that have the ability to cause irritations, blockages and even central nervous system depression if a significant amount is ingested.

Coffee: Grounds, beans and chocolate-covered espresso beans.

- Eggs (raw or undercooked)
- Fish (raw or undercooked)
- Garlic
- Grapes and raisins: These can cause kidney problems.
- Leaves and stems: From vegetables such as tomatoes.
- Meat (raw or undercooked) Nuts
- Onions, as well as onion flakes and powder
- Salt

 Trash: Pets who engage in trash-digging can accidentally eat foods that are potentially poisonous to them. Keep trash in tightly sealed containers or hidden somewhere your pet can't access.

Deck the halls: Holiday decorations and pets

 Christmas trees and holiday greens: Make sure your dogs or cats do not chew on limbs or droppings from the tree. Ingested pine needles could get lodged in the intestinal tract, puncturing the lining or bunching to-gether and causing an intestinal obstruction.

• Water base: The water base of a Christmas tree may contain dangerous

chemicals that could harm your pet. • Christmas lights and tinsel: Position your tree's lights and tinsel away from the bottom of the tree where pets can reach them. Some pets climb up or into trees and can even knock them over.

 Candles: Don't leave candles unattended. Pets may accidentally knock them over and spill wax or start a fire.

• Firestarter logs: Dogs that enjoy chewing should steer clear; these logs contain sawdust and paraffin which can cause an irritated stomach or even intestinal blockage when ingested.

Plants: A number of seasonal plants are poisonous to pets if nibbled or eaten, including ivy, holly, mistletoe and poinsettias.

By sleigh or sea: Holiday travel and pets

 Carefully consider whether to take your pet with you on a trip (air travel can be dangerous).

· If you leave your pets home while you travel, be sure to choose a pet sitter or boarding kennel wisely.

Wherever your pets spend the holidays, dogs and cats should all wear collars and tags with ID that offer a way to reach you.

In case of emergency • Identify your closest 24/7 emergency veterinary clinic before an emergency occurs.

• Write down or store in your phone the number for your veterinarian or pet hospital, as well as the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center: 888-426-4435. Note that a consultation fee may apply.





TOASTED GRUYERE AND CRANBERRY CUPS

Nutty gruyere cheese is the perfect complement to sweet-tart cranberry. Served together in a bite-size phyllo cup, they make the perfect holiday appetizer.



INGREDIENTS:

- One 10-ounce bag frozen or fresh cranberries
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon orange zest plus 1/4 cup orange juice
- 4 ounces cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 cup grated Gruyere cheese
- 48 frozen prebaked phyllo cups or hors d'oeuvre cups
- 2 tablespoons chopped chives

Hint: Try these cheeses in place of Gruyere -Emmental, Jarlsberg, aged Cheddar or Fontina.

- 1. Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment.
- 2. Mix the cranberries, sugar, orange zest and juice in a small saucepan. Place over medium heat and cook until the cranberries soften and start to burst, 8 to 10 minutes. Set aside.
- 3. Combine the cream cheese and Gruyere in a large bowl with a wooden spoon or rubber spatula until smooth.
- 4. Place the phyllo cups on the parchment-lined baking sheet. Spoon about 1 teaspoon of the cranberry sauce into each cup. Spoon about 1 teaspoon of the cheese mixture on top of the cranberry sauce. Bake until the cups are crisp and the cheese is melted and bubbling, 10 to 12 minutes. Sprinkle with chives before serving.



Try Thrifting This Holiday Season

Cape May and Atlantic Counties have many great Thrift Stores. We recently came upon an article on Guideposts by Life Advice Author Roberta Messner to help you guide your way through thrifting this Holiday Season. Stretch your holiday budget with these helpful thrift store tips for gift shopping.

Would you like to stretch your holiday budget and not have those dreaded bills filling your mailbox come January? You can, if you shop the thrift store way. Thrifting is a great way to stretch your family's dollars and to be a good steward of the resources God has entrusted with you.

Gifts. Holiday fashions. Home décor. It's all there just waiting for your discovery. Here's how to make the most of your efforts:

1. Make a list of hoped-for items. You probably won't find an entire outfit for that Christmas party in one shopping trip, but knowing what you need is a first step to actually procuring it.

2. Get to know the thrift stores in your area and how they operate. Each location has its own system for organizing goods (some are color-coded, for instance, while others are offered according to size). Also, many locations have a seniors' discount day or other promotionals. A pair of Miss Me jeans for five dollars for your teen daughter is sweet, but half-price on Wednesday really seals the deal.

3. Study the stores and catalogs, particularly the high-end ones, as these are where the greatest bargains lie. Talbots. Ralph Lauren. Baby Gap. Train your eye to recognize these well-known brands, so you can snap them when they appear on the thrift store rack. It's all there waiting to be searched out by none other than you! Reviewing the catalogs will also help you learn what's in style and what those items originally cost. Years ago, a neurosurgeon I worked with me told me that a nurse only sees symptoms they know to look for. It's the same with thrift store shopping. Know what to look for.

4. Maintain an open mind. You might not be in the market in the middle of August for a holiday frock for your six year old, but if you find one with the store tags intact and the price and size are right, scoop it up for later on. The same goes for that book your favorite nephew has been wanting to read. If you're in doubt, place the object in your shopping cart to reassess before leaving.

5. Make sure you actually need what you are buying. And always try clothing on if possible. Remember, it's not a bargain if you can't put it to use. Be creative. Repurposing is one of the great joys of thrifting. (I call it repurposing with a purpose!) Can that vintage skating skirt be transformed into a Christmas tree skirt? What about that patchwork curtain? Maybe it would make a terrific stocking if you and your sewing machine got reacquainted. And if a jacket looks a little plain, consider replacing the buttons with a bit of bling. Simple strategies such as these can take an object from so-so to splendid.

6. Always check for rips, stains, and other flaws. Hold fabrics up to the light for closer scrutiny. There is so much merchandise out there, I stick to brand new or pristine items. They are usually no more expensive than objects past their prime and give you the greatest bang for your buck.



Festive and elegant, this Cosmo is simple enough to complement a variety of menus.




INGREDIENTS:

- 3 clementines, plus 1 very thinly sliced, for garnish
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup water
- 2/3 cup cranberry juice
- 1/3 cup lime juice
- 1 1/2 cups vanilla flavored vodka (recommend: Grey Goose)

1. Cut the clementines into quarters and squeeze their juice into a saucepan. Add the sugar, water and clementine flesh and bring to a boil over medium heat. Reduce the heat and simmer the mixture for 5 minutes. Pour into a strainer set over a measuring cup, pressing on the solids to remove as much liquid as possible. Discard the solids, cool the liquid to room temperature and pour into a pitcher. Add the cranberry juice, lime juice and vodka and stir well. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Put 6 or 8 martini glasses in the freezer.

2. To serve, pour the mixture into an ice-filled cocktail shaker and shake until very cold. Pour into the chilled martini glasses and garnish each with a clementine slice. Drink up and enjoy!

CINNAMON ROLL BREAD PUDDING

Combine two favorite desserts - cinnamon rolls and bread pudding and make one crowd-pleasing dish.



INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups whole milk
- 3/4 cup heavy cream
- 4 large eggs
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar plus 1 tablespoon for garnish
- 1/3 cup nut-flavored liqueur (recommended: Di Saronno or Frangelico)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 7 cups large dice cinnamon challah (or plain challah or brioche plus 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon) (about 10 ounces challah)
- 1 cup walnuts, toasted and coarsely chopped
- 1. Heat the oven to 350 degrees F and arrange a rack in middle.
- 2. Whisk together milk, cream, eggs, 1/2 cup sugar, liqueur, vanilla, and salt in a medium bowl until egg is broken up and mixture is smooth. Evenly distribute bread and walnuts in a 2 quart baking dish, pour custard mixture over bread, and allow to soak for at least 15 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, bring about 8 cups water to a simmer over medium-high heat.
- 4. Evenly distribute remaining 1 tablespoon sugar over bread pudding. Set the filled baking dish into a larger roasting pan and add enough of the hot water to reach halfway up the sides of the baking dish. Bake until custard is set and top is lightly browned, about 50 to 60 minutes. Remove from water bath and let sit 5 to 10 minutes before serving. Serve warm, at room temperature.




