YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK -Bridge Pose (Setu Bandha Sarvangasana)





Atlantic County High School Football: Cedar Creek Marches to Rutgers as Holy Spirit Turns the Page Toward Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving week arrives with one Atlantic County team still chasing a state championship and one more preparing for one of the longest-running holiday rivalries in New Jersey. Cedar Creek punched its ticket to Rutgers with another explosive postseason performance, while Holy Spirit closed its playoff run at DePaul and now shifts its focus to an annual Thanksgiving tradition that brings the entire community together.

Cedar Creek: Pirates Power Into the State Final

Cedar Creek continued its November magic with a 48–38 win over Holmdel in the Group 3 state semifinal, extending its postseason surge and securing the program's spot in the state championship at Rutgers University.



The Pirates' ground attack overwhelmed the Hornets again, piling up 276 rushing yards - marking their fourth straight game over the 200-yard mark. Aamir Dunbar led the way with 85 bruising yards and a touchdown, while quarterback Frenchmon Bethea delivered one of the most complete performances of the weekend. Bethea not only guided the offense but intercepted two passes on defense, sparking key momentum swings in a high-scoring battle.

Now 11–2, Cedar Creek heads to Piscataway for a Friday night showdown with Old Tappan, a Golden Knights offense that has topped 31 points in six straight games. The Pirates enter Rutgers with power, poise, and arguably the hottest offense in Group 3.



Holy Spirit: Playoff Run Ends at DePaul

Holy Spirit's postseason surge met a tough opponent in Wayne, where DePaul Catholic closed the Spartans' season with a 49–22 win in the Non-Public B semifinal. The loss snapped Holy Spirit's five-game winning streak, but the run that got them there - highlighted by a 91-yard, game-winning drive the week prior - remains one of the county's most dramatic performances of the year. Holy Spirit finishes the playoff portion of its season at 7–4 with momentum that carries well into 2026.

Thanksgiving Spotlight: A Nearly Century-Old Rivalry Returns

While most of South Jersey has moved away from holiday football, one tradition still holds firm in Atlantic County: Holy Spirit at Atlantic City, Thanksgiving morning at 10am. It's the longest-running Thanksgiving Day game in county history and one of the few left anywhere in the state - second in longevity only to the legendary Vineland–Millville rivalry that began in 1871. This one kicked off in 1926, back when Calvin Coolidge was President, and has marched forward for nearly a century without interruption, even surviving the COVID-19 pandemic that disrupted so many other schedules.

This year's matchup arrives with both teams carrying full arcs of their own. Atlantic City enters Thanksgiving at 9–2, having delivered its deepest postseason run in years. Holy Spirit walks in battle-tested after a Non-Public B semifinal appearance. The rosters offer plenty of talent to keep the tradition vibrant: Atlantic City's Marvin Burroughs Jr. has emerged as one of South Jersey's most dynamic young quarterbacks, supported by senior leaders like Sirr Luckey, Tamir Rex, and Kyree Barksdale. Holy Spirit counters with veteran quarterback Ty Costabile, a steady hand who has guided the Spartans through their late-season surge, along with weapons like Taylor Cartwright and a deep upperclass skill group.




But what elevates this game beyond football is its history. Over the decades it has been played everywhere - from the old Bader Field, to the storied Boardwalk Hall where the rivalry once unfolded indoors before thousands, to the present-day home at Dr. Jack Eisenstein Stadium. Generations of families return home for it; alumni pack the stands; parents and grandparents swap memories of the games they played in or cheered from decades ago. The series is tight and fierce - Atlantic City leads 50–38–4 - and layered with crossover loyalties, from coaches who played for one school and led the other, to households split right down the middle.

In a county where Thanksgiving football has largely slipped into the past, this game endures as the last great gathering: part reunion, part rivalry, part reminder of how deeply woven high school sports are into the culture of the Shore. Nearly 100 years after its first kickoff, Atlantic City vs. Holy Spirit remains one of the strongest living links to the region's football story - and one of the most meaningful traditions left on the holiday calendar.

The Wrap

Thanksgiving week brings both celebration and final chapters across the county. Cedar Creek stands one win from a state championship at Rutgers, Holy Spirit closes its postseason and turns toward one of New Jersey's oldest rivalries, and Atlantic City prepares to host a holiday tradition that continues to define November in this part of the Shore. From Egg Harbor City to Atlantic Avenue, it's a season that reminds everyone why football here still hits different when the air gets cold because around here, history, community, and pride don't just shape the games, they elevate them. And on Thanksgiving morning, that spirit is on full display.





Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.


History of Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade

Rowland Hussey Macy was a businessman born in 1822 in Massachusetts. In 1843, Rowland Macy opened four dry goods stores to serve the mill industry. He failed to launch his business and, by 1858, moved to New York City, renaming his store "R.H. Macy Dry Goods". That store saw great success, but Macy didn't live long enough to see his vision actualized. Macy died in 1877 and ownership of the company eventually went to his partners, brothers Isidor and Nathan Straus.

In 1902 came a great business decision when the flagship store was moved to Herald Square. What started as one building expanded through the years to become the world's largest store. In 1978, the building was added to the National Register of Historic Places and became a National Historic Landmark. It welcomes 20 million visitors every year. Macy's hosts many of its events in that location, including the Macy's Flower Show, Macy's Santaland, and Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. Each year the building's windows have elaborate Christmas displays that visitors look forward to seeing.

Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade is its most important and famous event. It has been hosted annually in New York City in Macy's flagship store since 1924. In the first parade, Macy's employees marched in costumes along with floats, a band, and live animals. Now, bands compete months ahead to play in the parade and thousands of people volunteer to help organize the event. The parades have become grander and more elaborate throughout the years. The parade introduced its first giant balloon in 1928. The balloons were initially shaped like various animals but then developed to feature cartoon characters such as Mickey Mouse, Popeye, Superman, and Olaf.

Philly Sports Weekly: Philadelphia's Highs, Lows and Holiday Week Ahead

Philadelphia enters Thanksgiving week with a different kind of energy than last week - less swagger, more urgency. The Eagles collapsed in Dallas after building a three-score lead, the Sixers continue to search for consistency on their homestand, the Flyers unleashed a historic scoring burst but still seek stability, and the Union's Supporters' Shield season came to a sudden postseason end. Winter is setting in, and the city's teams are facing the moment where identity becomes reality.

Eagles: Stunning Collapse in Dallas Raises Big Questions

The Eagles authored one of the strangest games of the NFL season - a 21-0 start that morphed into a 24-21 loss to the Cowboys. Jalen Hurts accounted for three early touchdowns, and the defense came up huge with an end-zone interception by Reed Blankenship that gave Philadelphia a 96% win probability midway through the second quarter. Everything pointed toward a statement road victory.

Instead, the offense froze. Seven straight scoreless drives stretched through the second half, including five punts, a Saquon Barkley fumble, and a missed 56-yard field goal. The run game disappeared entirely - Barkley held to just 22 yards - and the timing on quick-hitting concepts never returned after halftime. The result was a Dallas defense allowed to dictate the fourth quarter.

Penalties proved fatal. Philadelphia's 14 infractions marked its most under Nick Sirianni, derailing drives and gifting Dallas second chances. Meanwhile injuries in the secondary - Blankenship, Adoree' Jackson, Andrew Mukuba - left Vic Fangio's defense scrambling against Dak Prescott, who finished with 354 yards and two touchdowns.

Now at 8-3, still atop the NFC East but no longer unshakable, the Eagles have no time to brood. Chicago arrives Friday night at the Linc. A short week offers little rest but an immediate opportunity to prove the collapse was an aberration - not a warning.

Sixers: Flashes of Greatness, Followed by Growing Pains

The Sixers are living two parallel realities: the one where Tyrese Maxey looks like a full-fledged superstar, and the one where the team cannot string together winning stretches. His 54-point masterpiece in Milwaukee showed how high the ceiling is, but the follow-up 127-117 home loss to Miami revealed the inconsistency they've yet to shake.

Joel Embiid remains day-to-day with knee management, and without him the interior presence suffers. The shooters have oscillated between red-hot and ice-cold, forcing Maxey to shoulder heavy usage nights while the supporting cast tries to find its rhythm. Norman Powell's 32-point outburst for Miami exposed defensive rotations still needing polish.

Still, Philadelphia has a crucial opportunity ahead. A multi-game homestand continues Tuesday and Wednesday, offering rhythm, rest, and a chance to stabilize before December's gauntlet. If any team is built to surge once fully healthy, it's this one.

Flyers: Historic Scoring Burst Highlights Untapped Potential

The Flyers delivered one of the wildest shifts of the NHL season in their 6-3 win over the Devils, erupting for three goals in just 26 seconds - a franchise record. Tyson Foerster buried two of them, Matvei Michkov added another, and Noah Cates tallied a goal with two assists as Dan Vladar anchored the win with 32 saves. It was the kind of offensive explosion that hints at a higher gear.


But sustaining that level remains the challenge. Philadelphia has been streaky: stretches of strong defensive structure followed by lapses, moments of aggressive forecheck followed by long shifts struggling to exit the zone cleanly. Their 11-6-3 record puts them firmly in the wild-card conversation, but Tortorella wants consistency above chaos.

A pair of home games this week - Colorado and Calgary - offers a chance to build real standings cushion before December's schedule tightens. If the Flyers can bottle even half of that New Jersey scoring run, they'll start climbing quickly.

Union: Shield Winners, Playoffs Cut Short

The Union's extraordinary regular season ended in disappointment as NYCFC stunned Philadelphia 1-0 in the Eastern Conference Semifinal at Subaru Park. Maxi Moralez's 27th-minute strike was the difference, sending the Shield winners into an early offseason despite fielding the deepest, most complete roster the club has ever assembled.

Still, the season belongs in the club's upper tier of achievements. Dominant defense, breakout scorers, and a consistent identity carried them through the year - now comes the task of translating that into 2026 momentum.



Looking Ahead: Response Week in Philadelphia

As Thanksgiving arrives, the theme across the city is simple: rebound. The Eagles must restore rhythm on a short week, the Sixers must find footing at home, and the Flyers look to turn sparks into sustained dominance. The Union begin their reset, but the rest of Philadelphia enters a holiday week defined not by comfort - but by the need to respond.
