2025 ATLANTIC COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PREVIEW

The Friday night lights are ready to shine again across Atlantic County, where tradition, grit, and star power define the gridiron each fall. The 2024 season saw playoff thrillers, record-breaking performances, and plenty of reasons to believe 2025 could be even bigger. Here's how each local program stacks up heading into the new campaign.

MAINLAND REGIONAL (10-4, Group 3 South Jersey Champions)

Mainland's season was defined by resilience - and one unforgettable overtime in the Group 4 state semifinals. Trailing Somerville 35-28 in OT, Rocco DeBiaso's 7-yard score brought them within one. Coach Chuck Smith gambled on the two-point try, and John Franchini found Jake Blum for the game-winning conversion in a 36-35 stunner. Blum, who set a school record with 15 receiving touchdowns and totaled 1,294 yards, also had 10 catches for 175 yards in that semifinal. DeBiaso led all CAL rushers with 17 TDs, and kicker Nate Kashey added 64 points. Mainland's defense allowed just 15.4 points per game, with Matt Muits recording nine sacks. The Mustangs fell to Old Tappan in the state final but return a core that makes them immediate contenders again.



ST. AUGUSTINE PREP (7-4, Non-Public A Semifinalist)

The Hermits boasted the CAL's stinglest defense, allowing just 9.9 points per game. Navy-bound RB Julian Turney capped his career with 1,174 yards and 12 TDs, surpassing 3,300 yards in two seasons. Three-year starting lineman Joe Tenaglia cleared the way, while junior Demari Simeon (47 solo tackles) and senior LB Julian Giambuzzi (84 tackles) anchored the defense. Kicker Luke Tanzola tied for the longest FG in the CAL at 45 yards.

ATLANTIC CITY (8-4, Constitution Division Runner-Up)

The Vikings started hot with an eight-game win streak and ended with an 8-4 mark, reaching the Group 5 playoffs. QB Khajuan "Peaky" Roseborough threw for 2,109 yards and 24 TDs while adding 803 yards and seven scores on the ground. WR Sah'nye "Ice Cup" Graffenreidt set the Atlantic County career receiving TD record (37) and had 12 more in 2024. The defense scored three touchdowns, with Jeremiah Williams returning two

CEDAR CREEK (8-3, Group 3 Playoff Qualifier)

The Pirates opened postseason play by beating Triton 39-14 before bowing to Delsea. RB Aamir Dunbar rushed for 1,264 yards and 14 TDs, while QB Reilly Hoffacker passed for 1,506 yards and 16 scores. WR Jahmir Campfield had eight receiving TDs, and LB Justus Peyton made 108 tackles. Cedar Creek's defense allowed just 15.4 points per game.

EGG HARBOR TOWNSHIP (6-4, Memorial Division Co-Runner-Up)

EHT scored 28.8 points per game, third-best in the CAL, and posted key late wins over Vineland and ACIT. Sophomore QB/RB Xavier Cocci threw for 1,582 yards and 11 TDs and rushed for 13 scores. Maximus Cocci made 124 tackles, second in the league, and Joe Lacross had two return TDs.

OAKCREST (6-4, Liberty Division Champions)

The Falcons led the CÁL in fewest passing TDs allowed (5) and scored 31.4 points per game. LB/RB Donovan Linthicum was a force, with 122 tackles, 711 rushing yards, and 10 TDs, plus five sacks. QB Andrew Estrada passed for 1,091 yards and 12 scores.

HOLY SPIRIT (10-2, Non-Public B Finalist, Constitution Division Champions)
Holy Spirit's defense gave up just 13.7 points per game. RB Jahcere Ward ran for 801
yards and 13 TDs, while K/P Mason Forte hit eight field goals (long of 41) and made 34 of
35 PATs. DE Nick Medina led the CAL with 10 sacks.

HAMMONTON (1-9)

It was a rebuilding year for Hammonton, but senior RB Deandre Clemons still eclipsed 1,000 rushing yards and returned two kicks for touchdowns. The Blue Devils notched three return TDs overall.

BUENA (4-7, United Division 4th Place)

The Chiefs ran for 25 TDs as a team. RB Benjamin Cohen had 860 yards and eight scores, and LB Lucas Gellura added 772 rushing yards and 100 tackles. Troy Gregory led the CAL with six two-point conversions.

ABSEGAMI (5-5, Liberty Division 3rd Place)

WR Donald Johnson had 300 yards and five receiving TDs, plus a kick return score. QB Kendall Armstrong threw for 1,148 yards and 12 TDs, and the Braves' defense scored twice.

PLEASANTVILLE (2-8, Continental Division 5th Place)

Sophomore WR Takiesse Barnes posted 407 receiving yards, while RB Nazir Griffin ran for six TDs. The Greyhounds converted 10 two-point tries, most in the CAL.

ST. JOSEPH ACADEMY (2-7, Liberty Division 6th Place)

WR Keaton Doyle caught six TD passes, and RB Hanif Hernandez had 576 yards rushing. The Wildcats fought through a tough schedule in a deep division.

ACIT (2-6, Memorial Division 3rd Place)

Competing in a balanced division, the Red Hawks notched wins over Bridgeton and Deptford but couldn't string together momentum late in the season.

LOOKING AHEAD

With 2024 in the books, Atlantic County's football landscape is primed for another fall of fierce rivalries and Friday night drama. This preseason will give fans their first look at new quarterbacks stepping into big shoes, returning stars trying to repeat breakout years, and young talent hoping to make a name for themselves before the games start to count.

Scrimmages and preseason matchups over the next week will help coaches fine-tune lineups, test schemes, and see which underclassmen are ready for varsity speed. Rosters are settling, captains are emerging, and each team's identity is beginning to take shape.

When the regular season kicks off at the end of August, expect plenty of storylines to follow: Mainland's quest to get back to a state final, Atlantic City's rebuild after losing its record-setting duo, Cedar Creek's push for another playoff run, and the always-tense battles between CAL division rivals.

Next week, we'll dive into the opening slate of games - who's playing where, which matchups could set the tone for the season, and what fans should watch for under those first Friday night lights.

Phillies Stay Hot, Keep Hold of NL East

The Phillies kept rolling from August 12–17, going 4–2 in a stretch that tested them against playoff-caliber opponents. The week opened in Houston, where Ranger Suárez squared off with Framber Valdez on Tuesday, August 12. Suárez looked sharper than in recent outings, giving the Phillies six innings of two-run ball. Trea Turner sparked the offense with a first-inning homer, and Bryson Stott added a clutch RBI double in the seventh. But a late rally by the Astros proved too much, and Philadelphia dropped the opener, 5–3.

Wednesday's matchup belonged to Cristopher Sanchez, who continued his breakout season by scattering four hits over seven shutout innings. He struck out seven and lowered his ERA to 2.61, while Kyle Schwarber's two-run blast provided all the cushion the Phillies needed in a 3–0 win. Taijuan Walker closed the set on Thursday, working five innings in a hard-fought 4–2 loss, as the Phillies couldn't solve Houston's bullpen.

Returning to Citizens Bank Park on Friday, August 15, Philadelphia reset against the Cincinnati Reds. Zack Wheeler was electric in the opener, striking out nine over eight innings and allowing just one run in a 6–1 win. Bryce Harper finally broke through with



a three-hit night, including his 18th home run, while Brandon Marsh and Nick Castellanos each chipped in multi-hit games. The momentum carried into Saturday, when Ranger Suárez redeemed himself with six efficient innings and Turner added three more RBIs in a 7–3 victory.

Sunday's finale turned into a slugfest, with the Reds jumping ahead early behind Elly De La Cruz's two-run shot. The Phillies clawed back behind Stott's two doubles and Harper's game-tying single in the eighth, but Cincinnati held on, 8–7, to avoid a sweep.

For the week, Turner and Harper paced the lineup—Turner driving in nine runs while Harper notched seven hits in 20 at-bats. Marsh stayed steady with five hits and strong defense in center, while Jhoan Duran notched his 25th save on Saturday. Sánchez's dominance stood out once again, solidifying his role as the team's most reliable starter down the stretch.

Looking Ahead: Keys to This Week

The Phillies host the Washington Nationals beginning Monday, August 18, before hitting the road for a crucial weekend series against the division-rival Mets starting Friday, August 22. Washington's young arms have shown flashes, but the Phillies' power bats will look to jump on them early. The Mets series looms large, as Philadelphia holds a 5½-game cushion but will face New York's top arms in a playoff-like atmosphere at Citi Field.

Final Word

With Sánchez and Wheeler anchoring the staff, and Harper beginning to heat up alongside Turner, the Phillies are finding the balance of pitching and timely hitting needed to push into September with confidence. If they can weather the rivalry test in Queens, they'll be in prime position to tighten their hold on the NL East and keep momentum pointed toward October.

Stay Safe in the Surf: A Guide to Water Safety at the Jersey Shore

The Jersey Shore is synonymous with summer fun—sunny beach days, refreshing ocean dips, and thrilling surf. But as inviting as the Atlantic Ocean, bays, and inlets may seem, these waters demand respect. Each year, thousands of visitors flock to Atlantic and Cape May Counties to enjoy the shore, and knowing how to stay safe can mean the difference between a great day and a dangerous one.

Respect the Ocean's Power

The ocean at the Jersey Shore can change quickly, with shifting tides, sudden drop-offs, and powerful currents. Rip currents, in particular, pose a significant hazard. Often invisible from shore, these narrow channels of fast-moving water can pull swimmers out beyond the breaking waves. If caught in one, stay calm—don't try to swim directly back to shore. Instead, swim parallel to the beach until you're free of the current, then angle back toward land.

When possible, swim only at guarded beaches. Lifeguards are trained to spot hazards, assist swimmers in distress, and respond quickly in emergencies. Many Jersey Shore towns, including Ocean City, Wildwood, Cape May, Atlantic City, and Brigantine, staff their beaches with lifeguards daily during peak season, typically from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Know the Conditions

Before heading out, check the day's surf and weather reports. Local news, beach patrol websites, and flag systems provide updates on tide times, rip current risks, jellyfish sightings, and storm advisories. Be especially cautious after storms, when surf conditions can remain rough even if skies are clear.

Additionally, always be aware of boat traffic in bays and inlets, where swimmers, kayakers, and paddleboarders share the water with motorized

vessels. Wearing a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket is essential for boating and recommended for inexperienced swimmers in deeper waters.

Supervise Children Closely

Even on calm days, waves can knock over small children or carry them farther out than expected. Stay within arm's reach of young swimmers, and consider outfitting them with brightly colored swimwear or rash guards for visibility. Teach children to recognize lifeguards and seek help if they feel unsafe.

Smart Shore Habits

- Stay sober while swimming or boating. Alcohol impairs judgment, balance, and reaction times.
- Obey posted signs and lifeguard instructions. Many towns prohibit swimming after hours, when no lifeguards are present.
- Don't overestimate your abilities. The ocean is not a pool. If you're not a strong swimmer, stay in shallower water where you can touch bottom.

Enjoy the Water, Respect the Risks

The Jersey Shore's waters offer unforgettable fun but a safe beach day starts with smart choices. By understanding the ocean's power, heeding local guidance, and watching out for one another, visitors can make the most of their time at the shore keeping memories joyful and worry-free.

CHEF CHIP'S WILD GAME AND SEAFOOD RECIPE

PEACH BBQ SAUCE FOR ALL YOUR WILD GAME & DOMESTIC FOOD

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 Cup Peach Juice
- 1 Fresh New Jersey Peach
- 1 TBS. Granulated Sugar
- 3/4 Cup Ketchup
- 1 TBS. Molasses
- 1 tsp. Raw Honey
- 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 TBS. Apple Cider Vinegar
- 2 TBS. Dark Brown Sugar
- 1/2 tsp Garlic Powder
- 1/2 tsp. Onion Powder
- 1 tsp. Sweet Thai Chili Sauce
- Fresh Cracked Black Pepper To Taste

PREPARATION:

Peel and rough chop the peach into chunks, leaving the skin and seed behind. Pour juice into a sauce pot. Add in sugar and peaches. Cook the liquid down by half with the peaches being soft. Add in the remaining ingredients. Simmer over medium low heat for about 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour sauce into a food processor or blender. Pulse until smooth. Use as needed. Enjoy! Hint: I myself refrigerate this for 24 hours before using. It allows all the flavors to really come together. I use this a lot with pork and wild boar, but it works well with just about anything. If you like peaches and BBQ sauce, wait till you put them together.

National Tooth Fairy Day – August 22, 2025

National Tooth Fairy Day on August 22 celebrates the excitement and wonder of kids losing their teeth! National Tooth Fairy Day is a reminder for kids, young and old, to relive the fun of visits from the Tooth Fairy when a newly lost tooth was exchanged for a fun surprise as they looked under their pillow in the morning!

History of National Tooth Fairy Day


There are three figures that are the pillars of modern mythology for children—Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny, and the Tooth Fairy. While the first two are well documented and discussed, not much is known about our elusive flying friend. But the Tooth Fairy is quite popular because every night children around the world excitedly anticipate the Tooth Fairy's arrival after they have lost a tooth.

The origin of fairies dates back to 13th-century England when they were described for the first time by Gervase of Tilbury. The tradition of a child receiving a gift for a lost tooth can be traced back to medieval Europe. In a collection of writings called the "Eddas" about the Norse and Northern European traditions, there is a reference to a 'tand fe,' which directly translates to 'tooth fee.' As part of this tradition, children would receive a small fee from their parents when they lost their first tooth. This is because teeth were a symbol of good luck and prosperity. Some Viking warriors would even wear a string of teeth as a necklace during battle to protect them.

The closest counterpart of the modern Tooth Fairy came in the form of an 18th-century French fairytale, "La Bonne Petite Souris" ("The Little Good Mouse"). However, the first written American record of a reference to the Tooth Fairy' dates back to a 1908 "Chicago Tribune" article in which the author, Lillian Brown, provided parents with a magical suggestion on how to get their children to have their loose milk teeth pulled. That suggestion was, you guessed it, telling their kids that the Tooth Fairy would leave five cents under their pillow for every tooth they lost. In 1927, an eight-page script for a children's play titled "The Tooth Fairy" was written by Esther Watkins Arnold. The play became widely popular, with schools reenacting it and imaginations being stirred with thoughts of a tooth fairy collecting teeth in exchange for money or presents. Since then, the Tooth Fairy has become a global phenomenon, reportedly paying visits to children in the U.K., Canada, and Australia.

Just like the mystery surrounding the fairy, the origin of the holiday is just as mysterious. Someone somewhere created National Tooth Fairy Day to be celebrated in August but in the lives of children who are losing their baby teeth, the Tooth Fairy is celebrated all year round, as they partake in the enchanting experience of receiving visits and surprises from the Tooth Fairy for every tooth they lose.





Where are you located? We are located at 3600 Atlantic Avenue in Atlantic City.

What are your hours of operation? We are open nightly for dinner at 4pm. We offer Happy Hour daily from 4 to 6pm, and we offer lunch on Fridays from 11:30am to 2:30pm

Parking tips: We offer complimentary valet parking, as well as self-parking. There is also metered street parking.

Tell us a little about yourself: Over the past century, the Knife & Fork Inn has led a long and colorful life, making it one of the oldest and most historically charged establishments in Atlantic City, owned by the Dougherty Family.

What does your venue specialize in? The Arts Garage houses artist studios, galleries, shops, a flexible workshop/classroom, and hosts special events throughout the year. It includes a 1,200 square ft. satellite gallery of The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University and the African American Heritage Museum of Southern New Jersey. At the Arts Garage, you will find individual artists working in their studio/shop spaces. Each artist focuses on a different medium including painting, pastels, photography, illustration, sculpture and more. Visitors are invited to watch the artists at work, ask questions about their creative process, and purchase original artwork. Stroll through the galleries and shops and enjoy convenient parking in the heart of Atlantic City adjacent to Tanger Outlets, the Convention Center, Boardwalk Hall and Dante Hall Theater.









Tell us a little about your history. Over the past century, the Knife & Fork Inn has led a long and colorful life, making it one of the oldest and most historically charged establishments in Atlantic City. Standing where Atlantic, Pacific and Albany Avenues converge, the Knife & Fork was originally established in 1912 by then Atlantic City Mayor William Riddle, the Commodore Louis Kuehnle, and their cronies as an exclusive men's drinking and dining club. The second floor was graced with curtained dining alcoves and a separate "ladies lounge" where women, who were not permitted at the bar, waited to be summoned. Private rooms on the third and fourth floors were used for gambling and, perhaps, other activities.

During Prohibition, rebellious club members defied the laws of an alcohol-free society and continued to openly serve liquor at the bar. The club survived without being raided for some time, perhaps due to the influence of Enoch "Nucky" Johnson, who was a Knife & Fork regular. Eventually, federal agents decided to crack down and, in true roaring twenties style, entered the bar and destroyed all of its contents.

After the raid, the club's membership declined and in 1927 the building was sold to Atlantic City's Latz family, who removed the bar feature, and converted the establishment into a public restaurant. Over the years, the Knife & Fork became a favorite of local politicians, wealthy vacationers, and Hollywood celebrities including Frank Sinatra, Bob Hope and Vic Damone. In a famous scene from the movie "Atlantic City," Burt Lancaster and Susan Sarandon dined in the restaurant's popular porch, now known as the Terrace. After many years of trying to find a buyer, it was finally sold to Frank Dougherty, who then embarked on a journey to refurbishing and restoring the Knife & fork back to its glory; back to the look and feel of its prohibition era look, including rich mahogany millwork, hand-painted ceilings, a sweeping staircase, and lushly appointed dining rooms.









Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.

In the preseason opener, he completed 20 of 25 passes for 252 yards and two passing touchdowns, and added a rushing score with the "Tush Push" - earning praise as a potential trade asset for teams seeking a reliable QB. His ongoing consistency positions him as a cornerstone of the team's depth chart.

Undrafted rookie wide receiver Darius Cooper impressed again, leading the team in preseason receiving with six catches, 82 yards, and a touchdown. His performance, along with others like returning receiver Johnny Wilson, positions him strongly in the battle for the WR spot on the 53-man roster.

On defense, rookie cornerback Cooper DeJean continues to shine. He was recently named the NFL's top slot corner by ESPN for his shutdown coverage last season. His versatility also hints at a possible safety role down the stretch. Meanwhile, Jihaad Campbell, the 2025 first-round pick, is gaining ground with first-team reps as injuries mount among key defenders.

Roster dynamics extend beyond players: the Eagles begin this season under new offensive leadership. Kevin Patullo steps in as offensive coordinator after Kellen Moore's departure to the Saints. The coaching shake-up adds strategic intrigue to this preseason - watch for shifts in play-calling and player usage as the Eagles fine-tune their system.



Future Phillies Road Trip

After the home stretch, the Phillies head north to Queens for a two-game set against the Mets on Monday and Tuesday, August 25–26, both beginning at 7:10 PM. With the division race heating up, these interleague games could carry playoff implications—and give fans a compelling reason to follow from afar or plan a quick road trip. The Phillies and Mets have a long-standing rivalry that often draws large, energetic crowds, making Citi Field an intense environment for visiting teams. Pitching matchups are expected to be a focal point, with both clubs leaning heavily on their aces as they fight for postseason positioning.

BAYFRONT BITES & BEACHFRONT FUN: THE DOWNBEACH SEAFOOD FESTIVAL RETURNS

As summer begins its slow slide toward autumn, the Jersey Shore gets one last big taste of the season - literally. The Downbeach Seafood Festival, returning to Ventnor City's Ski Beach on Saturday and Sunday, September 13–14, 2025, is the kind of event that reminds you why the shore isn't just about sand and surf. It's about the people, the flavors, and the way a bay breeze can turn an ordinary afternoon into something unforgettable.

Ski Beach, perched at Dorset and Burke Avenues, is a gem of a setting for a food festival. The wide grassy areas overlook the Intracoastal Waterway, dotted with kayaks, paddle-boards, and the occasional sailboat. The view alone is worth the trip, but once the tents go up and the grills start sizzling, the air becomes thick with the scent of garlic butter, smoky crab cakes, and fresh-shucked oysters. Vendors from across South Jersey will be dishing up everything from classic lobster rolls and fried shrimp baskets to creative seafood-inspired specials you won't find on a typical menu.

One of the festival's most anticipated highlights is the Chowder Cook-Off, running from noon to 4 p.m. each day. For \$10, you get a wristband and a mission: taste every chowder you can and vote for your favorite. It's a battle of creamy New England versus tangy Manhattan, with plenty of surprises in between. In 2024, festivalgoers' appetite for competition translated into a \$5,000 donation to the Community Food Bank of New Jersey enough to provide about \$100,000 worth of meals to families in need. This year's field promises to be just as spirited, and the bragging rights last far longer than the weekend.



For those who prefer their seafood raw and briny, the Oyster Tour of the Shore is a must. Local aquaculture is on proud display, with Cape May Salts, Sloop Point Oyster Co., McGee's Shellfish, and other purveyors serving up ice-cold beauties straight from the water. It's a crash course in just how much variety New Jersey waters have to offer, with each farm bringing its own flavor profile, texture, and story.

The perfect pairing for oysters? A cold beer, of course. The Great Brews of NJ Tasting Tent brings together a dozen of the state's top breweries for a mini beer festival within the festival. Ten tasting tickets cost \$10, and with pours starting at noon, you can sip your way through a diverse lineup - bright IPAs, smooth lagers, and maybe even a seafood-friendly saison.

If eating is your competitive sport, the Crab Cake Eating Contest, sponsored by Jay's Crab Shack, might be calling your name. This lighthearted showdown is open to non-professionals, with sign-ups happening on site. Space is limited, so those serious about their speed-eating skills should arrive early. Even if you don't compete, it's worth stopping by to cheer on the brave souls who do.



Entertainment runs throughout both days, weaving music, movement, and artistry into the mix. The South Pacific Island Dancers bring a burst of color and energy with authentic Polynesian performances, while local sculptor Matt Deibert - better known as "The Sandman" - crafts intricate sand art live on site, turning a simple pile of sand into a detailed, photo-worthy sculpture before your eyes. Under the eat-in tent, cooking demonstrations give attendees the chance to watch chefs prepare seafood dishes from start to finish, sharing tips you can take home to your own kitchen.

Logistics are as smooth as the oyster shells being passed across the counters. Free parking is available at 4800 Wellington Avenue, with a complimentary shuttle ferrying guests directly to Ski Beach. The site is also accessible by water - non-motorized vessels can use the boat ramp for a truly bayside arrival. The layout makes it easy to wander without missing a thing, and with plenty of space to sit, eat, and soak in the views, it's as family-friendly as it is food-focused.

The Downbeach Seafood Festival isn't just about indulging - it's about celebrating the shore's culinary and cultural identity. Many of the participating restaurants and vendors are small, family-run operations that have weathered storms both literal and economic. For them, the festival is a chance to connect with locals and visitors face-to-face, to put a name and a smile behind the flavors they're proud to serve. For the community, it's a reminder that food can bring people together in a way few things can.

And while it's easy to get lost in the abundance of fried, grilled, steamed, and raw delights, the event offers more than just what's on the plate. It's an end-of-summer tradition for many - an excuse to gather friends, make new ones, and send the season off with a full stomach and happy heart. Whether you're a chowder fanatic, an oyster purist, a craft beer enthusiast, or simply someone who enjoys a good waterfront view, there's something here for you.

So come hungry, come curious, and come ready to linger. The Downbeach Seafood Festival only happens once a year, but the memories - and maybe even the recipes - you take home can last far longer.

Jersey Fresh Grilled Corn & Tomato Confetti Salad

- · 4 ears fresh sweet corn, husked
- 1 large ripe tomato, diced
- 1 small red onion, finely chopped
- 1 orange bell pepper, diced
- 2 tablespoons fresh basil, chopped (or substitute parsley)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil OR melted butter)
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar (optional, for brightness)
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Preheat grill to medium-high. Lightly brush corn with olive oil and grill 8–10 minutes, turning occasionally, until kernels are tender and lightly charred. Let corn cool slightly, then cut kernels from the cobs into a large bowl. Add diced tomato, onion, and bell pepper. Drizzle with remaining olive oil (or melted butter), toss with basil, and add vinegar if using. Season generously with salt and pepper. Toss well and serve warm or chilled. Fresh Tip: For extra flavor, sprinkle with crumbled feta or queso fresco before serving.

Jersey Fresh Peach & Berry Crisp

- 4 ripe Jersey peaches, sliced (about 4 cups)
- 2 cups fresh blueberries (or blackberries)
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- ¼ cup granulated sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch Topping:
- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg



- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- · 6 tablespoons cold butter, cubed

Preheat oven to 375°F. In a large bowl, toss peaches and berries with lemon juice, sugar, and cornstarch. Spread evenly in a greased 9x9-inch baking dish. In another bowl, mix oats, flour, brown sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Cut in the butter with a fork or your fingers until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle topping evenly over fruit. Bake 35-40 minutes, until fruit is bubbling and topping is golden brown. Cool slightly and serve warm, ideally with a scoop of vanilla ice cream or whipped cream. Fresh Tip: Farmers markets are overflowing with stone fruit right now - you can swap in nectarines or plums, or mix in raspberries for a tangy twist.



BEATING THE HEAT: FOUR TIPS TO KEEP YOUR DOG SAFE DURING THE SUMMER!

The Seeing Eye hopes you and your pups are having fun and staying cool in this warm weather.

If you're looking for fun activities to beat the heat, you may consider taking your pups swimming. Some like to swim in the pool or on a leash/line in a lake or the ocean!

But please consider the following four tips when taking your dogs to any of these spots:

- Prolonged exposure to the sun can cause a dog's skin to burn (just like humans!). And hot sand can burn their pads, so avoid long walks on the beach and always provide a shady spot for them to rest.
- Salt, chlorine, and algae can irritate a pup's coat and make them sick if ingested. Please discourage them from drinking the water and monitor for signs of itchiness, Gl upset, and/or disorientation.
- Always rinse off/bathe your pup after it is done swimming. Remember to dry the fur and ears thoroughly. Use an ear cleaner with a drying agent so they don't develop an ear infection. Watch for hot spots or skin irritations that may develop under moist fur.
- Provide the pup with plenty of fresh, clean water and give them time to chill out and observe what's going on around them. It's a great exposure opportunity; think of it like TV for dogs!






