

YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK -Low Lunge

The alignment of your lunge is important. Make a right angle with your front leg so your knee is directly over your ankle and your thigh is parallel to the floor. At the same time, keep your hips level and root into your back leg.

Many don't go deep enough into the front leg and sag in the back. Glance in the mirror to make sure you're getting it right.

To modify this yoga pose, place your hands on blocks or lower your back leg to the mat (with a blanket or towel as needed for cushioning).


















Atlantic County High School Football: Week 8 Roundup

Week 8 delivered clarity and fireworks across Atlantic County. Absegami finally exploded on offense, Atlantic City proved its defense travels, Cedar Creek powered to a seventh straight win, and Holy Spirit unleashed its biggest scoring night of the season. St. Augustine continued to look playoff-ready, St. Joseph survived another nail-biter, and Mainland ran into a buzzsaw as late-October separation set in. With just one regular-season weekend left, the line between postseason locks and hopeful spoilers has never been sharper.

Absegami authored its best night of the year, torching Middle Township 47-14 behind a balanced attack that showed what the Braves have been building toward all month. Dameir Burke broke through for more than 150 rushing yards, while Chris Singleton added a pick-six and a 40-yard punt return that swung momentum early. The win, their first in league play, bumped them to 3-5 overall and provided a welcome home statement for an offense averaging more than 30 points per game since mid-season. They'll host Cumberland Friday at 6 p.m., where production will be tested against one of South Jersey's stingiest defenses.



Atlantic City leaned on defense to stretch its win streak to five, blanking Hammonton 13-0 on the road. Quarterback Marvin Burroughs Jr. found Don'Taye Thompson for the lone offensive touchdown before the defense closed the door with two late red-zone stands. Kyree Barksdale and Ahmad Chambers combined for over 120 return yards, flipping field position all afternoon. The Vikings, now 7-1, have surrendered just nine points per game during their road run and won't play again until Thanksgiving morning against Holy Spirit in the traditional rivalry at the Thorofare, where local bragging rights and playoff seeding could both be in play.

Cedar Creek kept right on rumbling, burying Timber Creek 49-14 for a seventh consecutive victory. Aamir Dunbar stayed automatic with 170 yards and three scores on the ground, bringing his season total to more than 1,300 yards. The Pirates rolled up 276 rushing yards as Justus Peyton and Gyan King each came away with interceptions for the second week in a row, while Malik Hammond added a 62-yard punt return touchdown. At 7-1, they head to Ocean City on Friday, where two top-10 defenses collide in a game that could decide the Cape-Atlantic League's public-school pecking order and first-round home field.

Holy Spirit lit up Ocean City 48-0 in its most complete performance of the season. Tyler Bell ran wild for over 150 yards and two touchdowns, and Noah Sanchez anchored a front that allowed barely a first down per quarter. The passing game also clicked as Derek Healy threw for three scores, including a 45-yard strike to Josh Graves on the opening drive. It was the Spartans' second straight blowout, lifting them to 4-3 and setting up a showdown with St. Augustine Prep in Richland on Oct. 31 that could shape both teams' postseason positioning.



Mainland hit a wall at Winslow Township, falling 41-6 and dropping back to 4-4. The Mustangs' streak of three straight road wins ended as Winslow quarterback Jalen Parker threw for 290 yards and five TDs. Mainland's lone highlight came from Jake Eckman, whose second-quarter interception briefly stopped the bleeding. They return home Friday against Delsea aiming to reset their rhythm before brackets lock and to prove their defense can still dictate pace against power offenses.



St. Augustine stayed surgical in a 28-14 win over Rancocas Valley, flipping last year's loss behind a poised effort from Matt Reed and a defense that again held steady late. Jason Tucker led the charge up front as the Hermits held Rancocas under 50 yards rushing. At 6-1, they'll travel to Millville Friday at 6 p.m. for what could be the regular season's defining power-test in South Non-Public A and a chance to secure a top-three seed.

St. Joseph kept its edge in tight games, escaping Oakcrest 23-20 on Friday after edging ACIT 13-12 the week before. Anthony Salamone hit Cole Brubaker for 86 yards and a touchdown while the Wildcats' defense held off a furious final drive to move to 6-1. Gavin Sutton added two field goals, including the 32-yard game-winner in the final minute. Oakcrest (2-6) travels to Lower Cape May this week looking to finish strong after back-to-back heartbreaks.



Pleasantville's bye came well-timed; the Greyhounds (5-2) reenter play Friday at 6 p.m. against Willingboro with their defense still riding a 12-quarter shutout streak. Keon Jefferson and Khalil Evans will look to sustain the offensive spark that fueled their 42-0 win two weeks ago as Pleasantville eyes a late-season home playoff berth.

Egg Harbor Township dropped its third straight, 27-0 to Triton, and sits 1-7 heading into a rivalry test with ACIT. The RedHawks (2-5) fell 28-0 to Bridgeton and now share the same urgency level—win or fade before seeding day. Buena (1-5) also seeks a spark hosting New Egypt after its idle week, hoping for a repeat of its early-season road form.

Week 8 cemented what's real. Atlantic City and Cedar Creek remain the headline acts, St. Augustine and Holy Spirit are peaking when it matters, and St. Joseph keeps finding ways to close. Absegami's offense finally arrived, Mainland and Oakcrest fight to steady, and Pleasantville's defense is postseason-ready. With one final Friday left before the brackets freeze, every drive now doubles as an audition - because in Atlantic County football, November remembers who finished, not who started.

International Artist Day – October 25, 2025

We celebrate International Artist Day on October 25. Art as a creative human expression encapsulates myriad things. It portrays the beauty of life or a bitter reality. It records history, revolutions, rebellions, and sometimes is a means to escape them. In short, there is no history or culture without art. This day celebrates all forms of art - paintings, sculpture, photography, architecture, music, and more. Through this celebration we show our respect for the passion and creativity in all artists. As art provide you with a medium of speech let us also see the work of those artists who study, research and criticize artists to showcase their art of words, here is a list of top art journalist.

History of International Artist Day

In the summer of 1961 President Kennedy made an effort to settle a salary dispute between the Metropolitan Opera and the American Federation of Musicians. He succeeded. Kennedy's actions signaled his passion for the arts. Congress, in the mid 60s, designated the National Cultural Center, launched in 1958, as a "living memorial" to President Kennedy and authorized \$23 million to begin construction. It's now simply known as the Kennedy Center.

The following year President Johnson signed the National Foundation on the Arts & the Humanities Act, which created the National Endowment for the Arts.

By 1970 focus on the arts increasingly spread to television and cinema. Mobil Oil committed more than \$1 million to the Corporation for Public Broadcasting for presentation of Masterpiece Theatre on PBS - and for 5 million copies of new Sesame Street magazine to be given free to preschool children in low-income neighborhoods. This was the largest gift to CPB from the business community to date.

A decade later President Reagan, himself a former actor appointed a Presidential Task Force on the Arts & Humanities to review the purposes of the National Endowments; broaden private support; engage more non-government professionals, private groups & individuals; & recommend ways to strengthen the overall structure of both agencies.

Still another president would show his support as well. Bill Clinton, in his 1997 State of the Union Address, asked Congress to maintain support for the arts - and urged citizens to make the year 2000 a national celebration "so that we can remain the world's beacon not only of liberty but of creativity, long after the fireworks have faded."

Recently the Museum of Modern Art in New York City reopened after a \$400 million renovation - adding over 40,000 square feet for galleries (including two at the street-level) - inside the new West 53rd St. tower. They are free to the public.



Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.





DOG ACID KNOWN AS GERD OR GASTROESOPHAGEAL REFLUX DISEASE

A customer contacted me at home about her dog's reflux problem. I decided to do further research to enhance the small amount of advice I was able to offer. This morning while I was out in the garden, I noticed the dogs searching for a particular grass that they eat when their stomachs are upset, which is one of the indicators of GERD-but if done in excess. Other indicators would be vomiting bile-usually a yellowish fluid as opposed to white foam. (vomiting is usually more frequent after a meal), licking the floor, or gulping at night which are loud noises like lip smacking, opening, and closing the mouth repetitively, which may mean that the dog is feeling distressed. I have GERD, so I can relate. Other indicators are regurgitation of small amounts of food, especially when using the stairs, getting up or down, or being picked up. It is usually food that has not been sufficiently swallowed. Sour or bad breath is caused by the acid in the stomach.

Nausea may cause a dog to be reluctant to eat anything, especially first thing in the morning. Ebby always gobbles up her treats in the morning, but Zoey is often not interested. I tell Bob to let her be for another hour or so and then see if she has an appetite. Sometimes dogs will start panting or become restless, especially after a meal. I make dinner (their only main meal) for the dogs at around 8 p.m. and sometimes they will finish it within 30 minutes. Sometimes Zoey won't touch her bowl until I put it with her in my bed and force a piece of topper into her mouth. Sometimes she spits it right out and then eats it. Sometimes she swallows it at once. Then she appears to think "Oh, that was pretty good. I think I'll eat some more." I go into the bathroom and get ready for bed, and by that time she has finished it, and will woof at me that she now is ready for her bedtime dental chew. Ebby gets her dental treat after she eats all her dinner, given when Zoey gets hers.

Dogs may get GERD from several causes. *Inefficient digestion which builds up stomach acid. *Dietary inadequacies like too much fat which slows down movement, or difficult to digest ingredients like corn. *Sensitivity to certain foods. Keep a journal of everything you feed your dog each day. That will help key in on the problematic ones. I get reflux especially from spicy foods, and mostly if eaten along with wine and chocolate! Intestinal *Dysbiosis is an imbalance of gut digestion which may be my problem too. I am going to consult a nutritionist. *Also, IBD or inflammatory bowel disease, or other gastrointestinal disorders can contribute to the problem of reflux. *More serious contributors may be cancer, liver, or kidney disease. At bedtime, try giving your dog an easily digestible treat, so the dog is not going to bed on an empty stomach, like a little goat milk which has a soothing effect. Check these out on the internet: Soothing Digestive Relief by ASK ARIEL, Their LypoZyme Digestive Enzymes for small and sensitive dogs, and a product called Gastro ULC Acid Reducer which has been proven to help soothe and repair the stomach lining.



Philly Sports Weekly: Philadelphia's Momentum, But With Edges to Sharpen

Philadelphia's sports calendar is shifting with the season itself. The Eagles regained their footing with a statement win, the Phillies have officially turned the page to the offseason, the Union are polishing for playoff form, the Sixers are piecing together their new rhythm abroad, and the Flyers have hit the ice running with all the energy of a team eager to surprise. October in Philadelphia never slows down - it just changes jerseys.

Eagles: Resilience Restored

The Eagles' 28–22 victory over Minnesota looked and felt like a reset. After the frustrations of early October, the offense exploded back to life, powered by Jalen Hurts's best outing of the season: 326 yards, three touchdowns, and a perfect passer rating. A.J. Brown and DeVonta Smith tore through the Vikings' secondary for over 300 combined yards, restoring the vertical spark that had been missing during the team's brief slump.

Defensively, the tone was sharper from the first series. The front four regained control of the line, collapsing pockets and forcing hurried throws, while the secondary - anchored by standout rookie Quinyon Mitchell - played with poise and patience. Fangio's pressure looks finally hit home again, producing the kind of late-down stops that change outcomes. The run defense still leaked a few chunk plays, but the overall rhythm was restored.

Depth continues to define this roster. Kelee Ringo's emergence as a steady outside corner has given the Eagles flexibility they lacked in September, and Nakobe Dean's return from injury steadied the second level. Fangio's rotation leaned on youth, and it paid off - proof that the bench isn't just filling gaps, it's earning trust.

The schedule won't ease up. A Thursday-night trip to the Giants offers a short turnaround and a quick test of focus. Philadelphia's record still shines, but now comes the stretch that decides whether this team's identity is resilience or reaction.

Phillies: Season Ends, Work Begins

The Phillies' season closed last week in a four-game NLDS loss to the Dodgers a quiet ending to what had been a loud summer. One late defensive miscue and a string of missed chances sealed their fate, and the offseason begins with more questions than regrets. Rob Thomson will return, but the bullpen blueprint and contact-hitting strategy will dominate winter conversations. The core remains strong; the challenge now is evolution, not overhaul.

Union: Calm Before the Bracket

With a postseason berth long secured, the Union continue to use these final weeks for sharpening rather than scrambling. The club's compact midfield, led by veterans who know how to manage tempo, has been its backbone all season. Bruno Damiani remains clinical in front of goal, and Andrew Rick's consistency between the posts gives the team confidence in tight matches.

The focus now turns to execution details - set-piece timing, substitution management, and how to stretch play on the right flank without exposing counter lanes. It's the quiet kind of preparation that wins knockout games. Subaru Park will be ready; the only question is how fine-tuned the Union can become before the bracket begins.

Sixers: Structure Over Speculation

The Sixers' preseason trip to Abu Dhabi offered something more valuable than rest: clarity. Nick Nurse used the back-to-back games against the Knicks to test closing combinations and integrate pace into the half-court offense without sacrificing defensive cohesion. Early results suggest a smoother balance - Joel Embiid anchoring inside while Tyrese Maxey orchestrates rhythm from the perimeter.


Jared McCain's steady recovery continues to influence the guard rotation, opening the door for expanded pace and spacing once he's fully cleared. Nurse's emphasis on decision speed rather than raw tempo has been a visible difference; ball movement feels purposeful instead of rushed. It's still early, but the foundation looks firmer than it did a year ago.

Back in Philadelphia, camp energy remains high but measured. After last season's turmoil, this team feels less interested in proving headlines and more focused on building habits. The real tests will come soon, but the structure is finally showing through the noise.

Flyers: Youth Movement Takes Flight

The Flyers' return to the Wells Fargo Center felt electric, even if the results have already covered the emotional spectrum. A 5–2 opening win over Florida had the building buzzing - Sean Couturier racked up four points, Trevor Zegras flashed highlight creativity, and Dan Vladar held strong in net. But the momentum cooled just as quickly with a 5–2 loss to Winnipeg, where defensive miscommunication and neutral-zone turnovers turned the game.

Still, there's something different about this group. The speed is undeniable, the transition play is more fluid, and the young core seems unshaken by early adversity. Sanheim and York have stabilized the blue line, and the Zegras-Couturier connection has shown legitimate chemistry. There will be growing pains, but also nights that remind fans why this rebuild could be the start of something real.



Looking Ahead: City in Motion

The Eagles are back to looking like themselves, the Phillies are looking inward, the Union are tightening their edges, the Sixers are building structure, and the Flyers are turning promise into proof. It's that rare overlap when every Philadelphia team is active at once, every storyline pulling in a different direction - but all pointing to the same truth: this city doesn't just play, it endures.


