Atlantic County High School Football: Week 7 Roundup

Week 8 rolls in with rhythm and rising stakes. Atlantic City looks to extend its streak against a reeling Hammonton, Cedar Creek carries the county's longest win run into Timber Creek, and St. Augustine's defense faces another test at home. Mainland and Pleasantville both ride blowout momentum into tougher matchups, while St. Joseph, Holy Spirit, and Absegami try to keep their playoff climbs alive as October tilts toward seeding time.

Atlantic City continued its climb with a 26-7 win over Eastern, moving to 6-1 and proving it can grind as well as glide. Sophomore quarterback Marvin Burroughs Jr. again led the way, connecting with Don'Taye Thompson and Kyree Barksdale for scores while a fast, disciplined defense kept Eastern in check. The Vikings hit the road Saturday at 11 a.m. for Hammonton, where the Blue Devils (1-6) have dropped six straight but still play hard behind quarterback Mason Brown and tailback Troy Gibson.



Cedar Creek stayed scorching, flattening Lower Cape May 42-0 as Aamir Dunbar hit 170 yards and three touchdowns on 22 carries. The Pirates' defense, with Justus Peyton and Gyan King both intercepting passes, secured their third shutout and sixth straight win. Now 6-1, Cedar Creek heads to Timber Creek Friday at 6 p.m., where a balanced Chargers attack will test whether the Pirates' punishing ground game and takeaway-driven defense travel as well as they dominate at home.

Mainland erupted for its highest total of the season, hammering Egg Harbor Township 54-6 to climb to 4-3. Quarterback John Franchini tossed three touchdowns, and Luke McCaffrey led another stingy defensive night. The Mustangs step into a real measuring stick Friday at 6 p.m. at Winslow Township (5-2), whose 50-0 rout of Eastside underscored elite speed and depth. It's a playoff-caliber test between a team finding its stride and one already there.

Holy Spirit returned to form with a 45-7 win over Delsea that evened its record at 3-3. Tyler Bell powered the ground game and Noah Sanchez anchored a defense that forced turnovers in bunches. The Spartans stay home Friday at 6 p.m. to host Ocean City (4-3), fresh off a 48-0 domination of Middle Township. It's a crucial swing game—win, and Spirit reenters the South Non-Public B mix with momentum.





St. Augustine just keeps shutting people down. The Hermits blanked Lenape 27-0 for their third shutout of the year and have allowed only 5.6 points per game across five straight road wins. At 5-1, they finally return to Richland for a Saturday noon kickoff against Rancocas Valley (4-3), a team capable of stretching the field but vulnerable against disciplined fronts. Expect another trench war with postseason implications.

Pleasantville's defense has become appointment viewing, posting its third straight shutout in a 42-0 rout of Oakcrest. The Greyhounds, now 5-2, bring that dominance home Friday at 6 p.m. against a Willingboro team that loves to push tempo and stretch defenses vertically. If Keon Jefferson and Khalil Evans keep generating explosive plays while the defense keeps points off the board, Pleasantville could punch its playoff ticket early.



Oakcrest, shut out for the first time since August, dropped to 2-5 but can still change its story Friday at 6 p.m. at St. Joseph (5-1). The Wildcats barely escaped ACIT 13-12 thanks to late composure from Anthony Salamone and a special-teams stop, and they'll look to clean up execution before closing their regular season at home next week.

Absegami fell 35-21 at Bridgeton despite a solid offensive showing from Dameir Burke, extending a road slide but proving the Braves can score in bunches. They return home Friday at 6 p.m. against winless Middle Township, a chance to reassert the run game and control pace before late-season rivalry week.

Egg Harbor Township (1-6) tries to regroup after the Mainland loss when it hosts Triton Friday at 6 p.m., while Buena (1-5) eyes a rebound night at home versus New Egypt, hoping to rediscover its early-season balance.

Week 8 is where contenders confirm who they are. Atlantic City and Cedar Creek look built for November, St. Augustine's defense remains the model, and Pleasantville's blend of swagger and stinginess might be the most dangerous thing brewing in the county. Mainland steps into the spotlight, Holy Spirit gets its litmus test, and St. Joseph will have to grind through one more week of tightrope football. As the air cools and the lights sharpen, every play from here counts double.

In my to-go bags (yes, there were more than one), was the French Onion Burger (Provolone Topped House Bun, Beef, Swiss Cheese, Grilled Onions, Roasted Garlic Aioli, and Served with a side of Au Jus), The Crispy Texas (House Bun, Beef, Sharp Yellow Cheddar, Fried Onion Strings, Bacon, and BBQ Sauce), The Big Shmakk (House Bun, Beef, American Cheese, Lettuce, Pickles, and Shmacc Sauce) which was WAY better than the inspiration (rhymes with Shmic Shmonalds), a Hot Dog (because why not?), The Jalapeno Popper (House Bun, Beef, Sharp Cheddar Cheese, Jalapeno, Bacon Jam, Scallion & Jalapeno Cream Cheese), and of course a slew of sides including but not limited to Mac and Cheese, Wings and naturally, the Shmacc Fries.



Everything was beyond delicious. Everything was indulgent and hit the proverbial "spot". While I am still in burn-out territory (17 weddings down, 6 more to go) I have, still, one month later, an easier gait. I am sad that I didn't get to try their milkshakes. They have such a great drink menu! It just didn't make sense because I live 40 minutes away. I have my eyes on their Strawberry Shortcake and their Banana Cream Pie milkshakes though. Another time. If you have not visited a Tony Beef location yet, you MUST. And it's hard not to love them, not just for their insanely delicious food, but because they're just downright good people. They are all about community and a good cause, and they're always open to discussing a fundraiser. 10% of sales will be donated directly to your cause from 4-8pm, Mondays-Thursdays. They partner with a slew of local organizations including schools, colleges and universities, youth sports leagues, and nonprofits. See? Good people.

So, the next time you're craving a good burger give Tony Beef a try. You won't regret it. Your waistband might, but you definitely won't.

The restaurant's bright, inviting atmosphere and consistent quality have made it a favorite for date nights, family meals, and celebrations of every kind.

From family taverns to seaside trattorias, pasta in Atlantic County is more than a menu item - it's a tradition built on time, taste, and the shared joy of a perfect plate.



Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.



The HEROTINI® Challenge is shaking up South Jersey this fall, bringing together restaurants, bartenders, and entire communities in a spirited competition where creativity meets a cause. Gourmet Italian Cuisine in Galloway continues to hold a narrow lead with \$3,186 raised, trailed closely by Josie Kelly's Public House in Somers Point at \$3,052. Caesars Atlantic City remains within striking distance with \$1,716, while Gregory's Bar, Harpoons on the Bay, Sunrise Tequila Bar, Borgata, The Crab Trap, and 279 Social Kitchen are all charging up the leaderboard in the final stretch. With just days to go before the annual HERO Walk in Ocean City, the race for this year's mocktail crown is far from settled - and every dollar raised brings the Campaign closer to its goal of ending drunk driving for good.

The drinks themselves are the highlight of the season - colorful, inventive, and as flavorful as they are meaningful. Josie Kelly's "HERO Fizz" shines with cherry syrup, fresh lime, mint, ginger ale, and lemon soda, a sparkling nod to the campaign's message that fun and responsibility can absolutely coexist. At 279 Social Kitchen, the "Peaches 'N Cream Marg-No-Rita" blends lime juice, passion fruit purée, agave, peach syrup, and a splash of cream for a silky tropical finish that's been winning hearts (and votes) across the county. Flip Flopz Beach Bar & Grill in North Wildwood has earned beachside acclaim with its vibrant "Ocean Breeze Cooler," a refreshing mix that captures the easygoing Shore spirit. Each recipe adds a burst of personality to the competition - and each sip is a reminder that being a HERO can taste just as good as it feels.



The HEROTINI® Challenge first launched in 2016 as a creative spin on traditional fundraising, inviting local bartenders to design alcohol-free cocktails that promote safe, celebratory fun. Early competitions crowned crowd favorites like Borgata's "Tropical Storm," Gregory's "Cucumber Lime Spritzer," and Gourmet Italian's "Coco-Loco Cooler." Over the years, the contest has grown into a South Jersey staple, blending artistry and advocacy with every pour. This season's entries continue to impress, from Caesars Atlantic City's golden-hued pineapple-mango "Golden Hour" to The Crab Trap's citrusy "Safe Harbor Cooler" and Sunrise Tequila Bar's "Paloma de la Paz," a grapefruit-and-lime refresher served with a salted rim. Many establishments have gone the extra mile, crafting custom glassware, mocktail flights, and tasting events that draw crowds while driving home the Campaign's message of safety and connection.

That same spirit of unity and purpose will take center stage this weekend as the John R. Elliott HERO Walk and 1-Mile Fun Run returns to the Ocean City Boardwalk on Sunday, October 19. Registration begins at 9:00 a.m. at the Sports & Civic Center on Sixth Street, followed by the Fun Run at 10:00, an awards ceremony at 10:30, and the walk at 11:00. Participants can register online or in person that morning, and the first 400 to sign up will receive commemorative HERO Walk T-shirts. Each year, the event attracts thousands of walkers - families pushing strollers, high school teams in matching shirts, first responders marching in formation, and individuals walking in honor of loved ones lost. It's an unfor-

gettable morning of music, reflection, and shared purpose, with the boardwalk transformed into a sea of blue as the HERO banners ripple against the ocean breeze.

First held in 2011, the HERO Walk has become one of the organization's most powerful traditions, and this year's event promises to be among its biggest yet. The morning opens with a stirring presentation of flags and tributes from families whose lives have been changed by drunk driving. Survivor stories and words from the Elliott family remind participants why the mission remains urgent, while live music, food vendors, and team photo stations keep the day's energy hopeful and uplifting. Beyond the symbolism, the walk serves as a major source of funding and awareness for the HERO Campaign, helping expand designated driver pledges and education efforts across the country. By day's end, the crowd disperses not just with medals and memories, but with a renewed sense of commitment - to drive sober, to look out for one another, and to honor the lives behind the cause.



The HERO Campaign itself began in 2000, founded by Bill and Muriel Elliott after the death of their son, Navy Ensign John R. Elliott, who was killed by a drunk driver just two months after graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy. Rather than let tragedy define their lives, the Elliotts transformed their grief into action, launching a movement that now stretches far beyond South Jersey. Their motto - "Be a HERO. Be a Designated Driver®" - has been adopted by professional sports teams, colleges, and communities nationwide, saving countless lives along the way. In stadiums from Citizens Bank Park to Churchill Downs, HERO booths and banners remind fans that every safe ride home is an act of heroism in itself.

This weekend promises to capture the full meaning of that mission. Between the Porsche Boardwalk Reunion on Saturday, the Clean Ocean Action Beach Sweep that morning, and the thousands expected to take part in Sunday's HERO Walk, Ocean City will be buzzing with energy and purpose. From the mocktails being mixed across the Shore to the steps taken in John Elliott's memory, the message remains clear: celebration and safety can go hand in hand. Every sip, every dollar, and every stride taken this weekend keeps the HERO legacy alive - and every participant helps make the road ahead brighter, safer, and filled with hope.

'JERSEY FRESH' JAZZ@THEPOINT FESTIVAL BRINGS HOMEGROWN TALENT TO SOMERS POINT

The South Jersey Jazz Society will celebrate homegrown talent this month with the 26th annual Jazz@ThePoint Festival, running Thursday through Saturday, October 16–18, in Somers Point. This year's theme, "Jersey Fresh," is dedicated entirely to artists who live in or hail from the Garden State. The three-day event will feature performances at Gregory's Restaurant & Bar and the Gateway Playhouse, headlined by Grammy Award-winning guitarist and vocalist John Pizzarelli.

Pizzarelli, born in Paterson, has earned international acclaim for his smooth vocals, impeccable phrasing, and inventive guitar style. With 20 solo albums and appearances on more than 40 recordings, he has been celebrated for "reinvigorating the Great American Songbook and re-popularizing jazz," as noted by the Boston Globe. His repertoire now spans far beyond the classics, with tributes to Paul McCartney, Joni Mitchell, Neil Young, Tom Waits, Antônio Carlos Jobim, and the Beatles. Cappy, a Berlin native, is a trumpeter, composer, and arranger who has toured with Jill Scott, John Legend, The Roots, and Patti LaBelle. Known for blending traditional jazz with soul and R&B influences, Cappy brings the kind of high-energy performance that bridges generations of jazz fans.


TALES FROM THE SEEING EYE







The Hamilton Historical Society's beloved Ghost Walk celebrates its 25th anniversary this year with an all-new route, new ghostly characters, and a guided storytelling experience through historic downtown Mays Landing. Set for Saturday, October 18, 2025, this annual tradition invites families, history buffs, and thrill-seekers alike to step back in time along the west side of Main Street – where the past comes alive at every corner.

Led by a costumed Storyteller Guide, each tour group will meet a cast of "spirited" historic characters who share tales from their lives and the events that shaped the town's early days. From long-forgotten residents to local legends, the ghostly encounters offer a fun and educational journey through Hamilton Township's storied past. This year's revamped route introduces new stops and new stories, ensuring a fresh experience even for returning guests.

Tours will begin at 5:00 p.m. and depart every ten minutes, continuing until the final 8:00 p.m. departure. Each tour covers roughly one mile and lasts between 60 and 90 minutes. In such cases, payments will serve as donations to the nonprofit, and guests may request a \$5 coupon toward next year's walk. Free parking is available in the municipal lot on 2nd Street, located behind the courthouse.



are only available at the starting location, so plan accordingly. Because tours operate on a tight schedule, late arrivals cannot be accommodated or refunded - each walk must begin promptly to maintain the flow of the evening.

Philly Sports Weekly: Philadelphia's Momentum, But With Edges to Sharpen

Philadelphia's postseason tension joined the regular-season grind this week. The Eagles hit their first bump in the road, the Phillies saw their October dreams collapse in heartbreaking fashion, the Union continue to prepare while managing effort, the Sixers inch toward clarity in camp, and the Flyers finally return to the fray - offering a fresh chapter in Philadelphia's athletic tapestry.

Eagles: Cracks in the Shield

In a turn that feels more instructive than punishing, the Eagles' 4–0 start ended with a 21–17 home loss to Denver. What looked like a tight contest revealed deeper inconsistencies: slow starts, stalled drives, and occasional breakdowns in protection all crept in. Jalen Hurts flashed his usual instincts, but the margin for error is thinner now, and pressures that earlier were absorbed now left scars.

Defensively, the corners stood tall - rookie Quinyon Mitchell claimed his first NFC Defensive Player of the Week nod for locking down his matchup - but the front seven couldn't always anchor the line. Short gains became big plays, and Denver nudged forward momentum just enough in critical moments. Meanwhile, depth was strained. Kelee Ringo remains in rotation even with Adoree' Jackson nearing full health, and Nakobe Dean's return looms as a necessary reinforcement.

The next test comes fast: a Thursday night trip to the Giants offers both a chance for reset and a reminder that the schedule is relentless. The Eagles need to recenter quickly, clean up penalties, and rediscover the identity that carried them through September. This was not fatal, but it demands urgency.

Phillies: Dreams Deferred

The Phillies' season ended in gut-punch fashion. After dropping Game 4 of the NLDS to the Dodgers in an 11th-inning walk-off misplay by reliever Orion Kerkering, Philadelphia's October ambitions fluttered out in heartbreak and disbelief. Their run ended 3–1 in the Division Series, another postseason loss that will sting.

It's a cruel script: a season built on surges and momentum, a division wrapped early, and a team rolling into October with swagger - only to have everything hinge on one swing, one throw. Schwarber, Harper, Turner - they all carried lights-out runs all year, and Suárez gave them pitch depth. But in a playoff where every margin is razor-thin, the pressure didn't just amplify, it exposed.

Now comes the damage control: framing the narrative, evaluating extensions, and rebuilding confidence without exiting on a downward spiral. The departure of October raises more questions than answers, and when offseason begins, every corner of this roster will face scrutiny.

Union: Polishing, Not Pacing

The Union enter this quiet stretch with every reason to refine rather than panic. Their berth is safe, and their late-season pulse already aligned with what matters in October: discipline, structure, and the sharpened margins that define knockout outcomes. Bruno Damiani's composure in attack and Andrew Rick's steadiness in goal remain touchstones for how this team must perform when the lights tighten.

But the work is now in the minutiae: set-piece accuracy under 90 seconds, sub timing when legs bleed, and flank spacing when opponents squeeze width.

These are not glamorous fixes, but the small edges that swing tight series. The bracket looms, and Subaru Park could be a fortress - if Philly enters it sharpened, not frayed.

Sixers: Quiet, But Not Idle


Camp is in motion, and the Sixers' offseason chatter has somewhat receded into cadence: roles will reveal themselves. Jared McCain's recovery is a storyline, not just a footnote - his health could unlock guard dynamics the club's lacked. Nick Nurse will press lineups hard in Abu Dhabi, pushing closing groups, spacing tests, and defensive rotations before his margin window narrows at home.

The overhang remains: who anchors the close, how they balance Embiid's usage, and whether wings can shift between speed and size without bleeding glass. The preseason is no longer optional theater - it's the proving ground. And the vibe around the facility suggests they're ready for that gravity.

Flyers: Return of the Orange & Black

The Flyers picked their return moment well: at home they handed the Panthers their first loss of the season with a 5–2 win. Sean Couturier led the charge with two goals and two assists, Trevor Zegras carved a highlight assist behind the net, and Travis Sanheim orchestrated plays from the backend. In net, Dan Vladar made 24 saves, buying time for those moments to land. It was a statement: this team still has fight.

They now reset toward the road, heading into a stretch where momentum will count as much as matchups. The new season's early pace will test chemistry more than stamina, and Philadelphia's next few games are likely to define whether this squad catches fire or drifts in the margins.



Looking Ahead: Reset, Rebuild, Realign

The Eagles have felt the first sting - but survival means recovery. The Phillies' October ended too soon, but their core remains battle-tested. The Union can afford to refine with a berth already in hand. The Sixers are inching toward definition in every rep. And the Flyers are back in play, reminding the city that hockey can still shift the mood. In a week where narratives will snap, Philadelphia's storylines are all unfinished.
