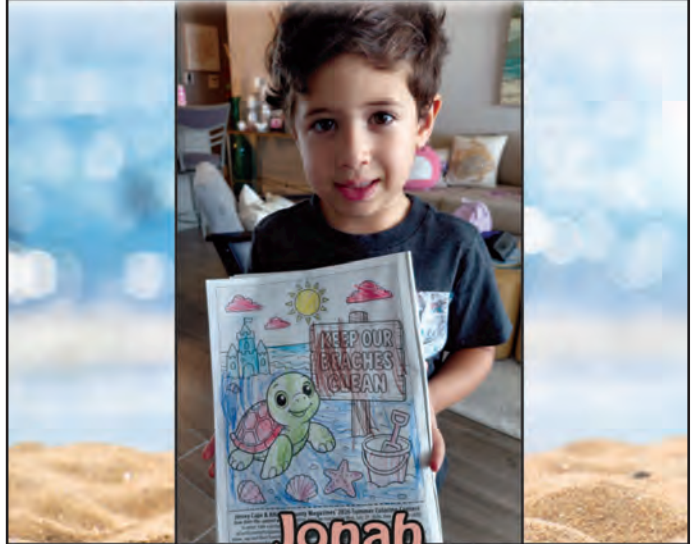

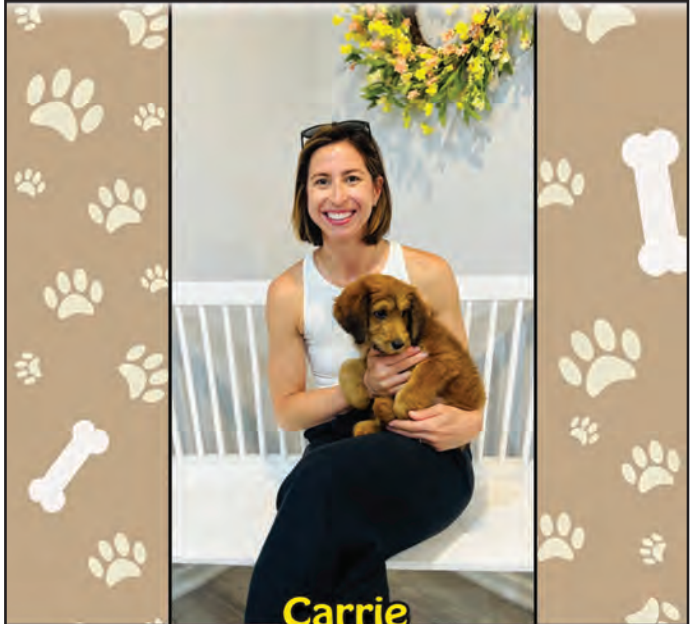

Redemption Initiative: The Good Samaritan by C.L. Morrissey
Prison ended Desi Delgado's sentence. It didn't end the debt he believes he still owes. After eight years behind bars for a life of addiction and violent crime, Desi spends decades trying to become a different man. He builds a legitimate business, helps run a halfway house and proves, at least outwardly, that change is possible. But his past still haunts him at night.

When violence again threatens his Los Angeles community, Desi's guilt hardens into a plan. Redemption Initiative is a covert program that uses immersive technology to make offenders confront the full reality of the harm they've caused. Remorse can't be faked. Accountability can't be avoided. The system is designed not simply to punish criminals, but to force a reckoning real enough to change them. The novel's provocative central question is this: What if criminals could fully grasp the lasting consequences of their actions? In this vision of justice, redemption isn't granted by the courts. It has to be earned.

The Minority Report by Philip K. Dick
In this future, murder isn't investigated. It is interrupted. Philip K. Dick's classic science fiction novelette imagines a society where the Precrime division arrests people before they can kill, relying on the visions of psychic "precogs" to identify future murderers before blood is spilled. The system seems flawless until the head of Precrime is predicted to commit murder himself. Suddenly, a society built on certainty has to confront an impossible question: If a crime hasn't happened yet, can justice already be served?

Decades after its publication, *The Minority Report* still feels unnervingly current in its treatment of surveillance, prediction and personal freedom. Its justice system doesn't try to redeem offenders or punish the guilty after the fact. It tries to erase crime from the future, even if doing so means treating possibility or probability as proof.

Chain-Gang All-Stars by Nana Kwame Adjei-Brenyah
Here, prison has become prime-time entertainment. In Nana Kwame Adjei-Brenyah's near-future America, convicted prisoners fight in televised gladiatorial death matches, with freedom dangled as the prize for those who survive long enough.

5 Works of Crime Fiction That Reinvent Justice

The spectacle is brutal, but the novel's real target is not only the arena. Through its celebrated competitors and the machinery surrounding them, *Chain-Gang All-Stars* exposes a carceral system that has turned punishment, profit and public appetite into one seamless industry. Many justice stories ask whether punishment can be made more humane. This one asks what happens when a country stops pretending humanity is the point. Its reinvention of justice is the nightmare version: incarceration converted into entertainment, and suffering sold back to the public as sport.

LaRose by Louise Erdrich
One family loses a child. The other gives one away. After Landreaux Iron accidentally kills his neighbor's young son while hunting, he and his wife offer their own son, LaRose, to the grieving family in an act of penance meant to restore balance between the households.

There is a crime here, but the novel's center of gravity is not a trial or a sentence. Louise Erdrich turns instead toward grief, kinship, forgiveness and communal responsibility. The question is not simply who is guilty, but how families continue living after harm has been done. That makes *LaRose* our list's clearest restorative-justice entry. Its goal isn't to punish the guilty so much as to heal everyone left in the tragedy's wake.

Sympathy Tower Tokyo by Rie Qudan (Translated by Jesse Kirkwood)
What if prison became the nicest building in the city? In Rie Qudan's speculative novel, an architect is commissioned to design *Sympathy Tower Tokyo*, a high-rise prison built around comfort and compassion rather than deprivation.

The premise feels almost humane at first glance. But as the project develops, the novel probes the uneasiness beneath a society that recasts lawbreakers as people deserving sympathy. How much empathy is owed to those who harm others? At what point does compassion begin to erase accountability?

Winner of Japan's prestigious Akutagawa Prize, *Sympathy Tower Tokyo* is a sharp contemporary social critique. After books that imagine rehabilitation, prevention, vigilantism, spectacle and restoration, Qudan's novel asks whether justice can be reinvented so gently that it loses its edge entirely.

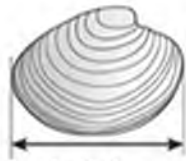

Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Graveling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Offered daily from 4:00 PM – 6:00 PM, in the bar area, and on a first come first server basis, Dock's Oyster House, offers half-priced appetizers and great raw bar specials like fried oysters and fresh clams. Get there early, as a line often forms outside before the doors open.



Tennessee Avenue Beer Hall offers Happy Hour Tuesday through Thursday from 11:30 AM – 1:30 PM & 4:30 PM – 6:30 PM, plus an early Friday block from 11:30 AM – 1:30 PM. Located in the trendy Orange Loop, they serve up \$6 well drinks, \$7 house wines, and special pricing on their extensive craft beer draft list. The outdoor patio and fire pits make it a great casual hangout.



There are also a couple places to note that full advantage of Atlantic City's bays and inlets, offering great views without the resort crowds. First, Back Bay Ale House serves Happy Hour Monday through Friday from 3:00 PM – 5:00 PM (plus an all-day happy hour on Sundays). Located in Historic Gardner's Basin, this local staple is famous for serving drinks in mason jars. They offer rotating taco specials and discounted drafts, completely detached from casino property. 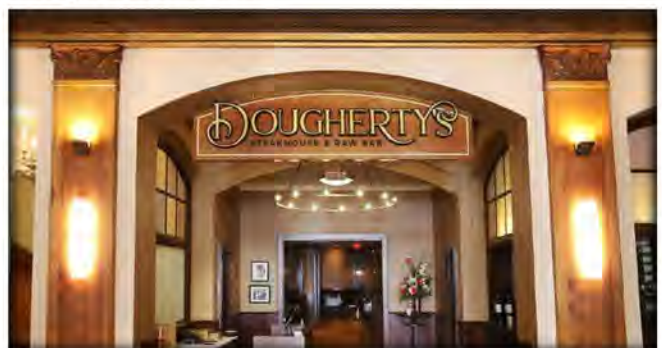

Tour de France Route, Structure & How to Follow

The Tour de France begins on July 4 in Barcelona and concludes on July 26 in Paris, continuing its tradition as a three-week stage race that blends endurance, tactics, and terrain into a single cumulative competition. The 2026 edition marks the 27th Grand Départ held outside France and only the third in Spain, before the route shifts back into France and moves through seven regions and 29 departments on its way to Paris.

Across 21 stages, the race is structured to test every type of rider: 7 flat stages, 4 hilly stages, 8 mountain stages (including 5 summit finishes), 1 team time trial, and 1 individual time trial, with two rest days placed between key blocks of racing. The field consists of 23 teams of 8 riders each (184 total starters), each built around a designated general classification leader supported by a full team structure.

Route and Race Structure - The race opens with a notable change in format: a 19 km team time trial in Barcelona, an event that places immediate emphasis on coordination and team strength rather than individual performance. Later in the race, a 26 km individual time trial between Évian-les-Bains and Thonon-les-Bains provides a more traditional solo test that often reshapes the general classification.

Out of 37 stage towns and sites, 10 are new to the Tour route, including Gavarnie-Gèdre, Plateau de Solaison, and the Circuit Nevers Magny-Cours, adding uncertainty for teams relying on historical racing data and reconnaissance.

Mountains and Defining Terrain - The mountain profile is one of the most demanding in recent editions, crossing the Pyrenees, Massif Central, Vosges, Jura, and Alps. There are eight mountain stages, including five summit finishes at Gavarnie-Gèdre, Plateau de Solaison, Orcières-Merlette, and Alpe d'Huez (twice).

Key climbs include new or returning ascents such as the Col de Sarenne (south-eastern flank) and the Col du Galibier (2,642m), which stands as the highest point of the race. Total elevation gain reaches approximately 54,450 meters, underscoring how the Tour is decided as much by accumulated fatigue as by individual moments of attack.

How the Race is Decided - The Tour is fundamentally a race on cumulative time. The rider with the lowest total time across all 21 stages wears the yellow jersey, with the overall classification updated after each stage finish.

Time bonuses - 10, 6, and 4 seconds for the top three finishers - add a secondary layer of strategy, especially in sprint finishes and reduced group stages where seconds can matter in the final standings.

Alongside the general classification are three additional competitions:

- Green jersey (points classification for sprint consistency)
- Polka dot jersey (best climber across categorized ascents)
- White jersey (best young rider under 26 on GC)

Strategy and Team Dynamics - Although only one rider wins overall, success is built on collective execution. Each team revolves around a general classification leader, supported by domestiques who control pace, protect position in the peloton, and respond to tactical attacks. The structure allows teams to manage wind exposure, control breakaways, and position their leader for decisive climbs or time trials.

The race typically evolves in phases: early flat stages establish sprint opportunities and early standings, mid-race terrain introduces breakaways and minor time gaps, and the final mountain stages determine the general classification.

How to Watch and Follow - In the United States, the Tour is primarily broadcast and streamed through Peacock (NBC Sports), which carries live coverage of every stage.

Stages typically air in the morning Eastern Time and vary in length:

- Flat stages: long broadcasts often ending in sprint finishes
- Mountain stages: extended coverage with decisive climbs late in the day
- Time trials: shorter, concentrated broadcasts focused on individual efforts

Most viewers do not watch every minute. Instead, the race is commonly followed in three ways:

- Live coverage of final hours where decisive attacks occur
- Full-stage viewing for major mountain days
- Daily highlight recaps that condense results and key moments into short segments

This structure makes the Tour accessible both as a full live sporting event and as a daily unfolding narrative, where standings shift incrementally rather than all at once.

Community Impact Along Atlantic Avenue - The work on view at Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University also places a strong focus on the people behind the storefronts, not just the empty streets left behind during shutdowns. Along Atlantic Avenue, small businesses function as more than retail spaces - they serve as neighborhood anchors, long-running family operations, and entry points for visitors moving between the boardwalk and inland districts. The photography and oral histories together show how quickly daily life shifted, but also how business owners adapted through takeout service, reduced hours, shared resources, and community support networks that formed almost immediately during the early months of the pandemic.

What emerges from the collection is a layered portrait of resilience rather than a single narrative of loss. Some businesses captured in the exhibition never reopened, while others rebuilt in phases, reopening with changed staffing models, updated interiors, or entirely new concepts. The corridor itself reflects that uneven recovery, with gaps still visible alongside renewed activity - making Atlantic Avenue a living timeline of the pandemic's economic and cultural impact.

Exhibition Details and Visitor Information - The exhibition is presented in collaboration with Stockton University, extending the university's ongoing work in community-based arts and documentation projects across Atlantic County. Visitors attending the opening reception on Saturday, July 11, 2026, from 1-3 p.m. will have the opportunity to meet contributing artists and learn more about how the project was assembled, including the process of collecting oral histories and pairing them with visual documentation.

Following the reception, the exhibition will remain on display through September 24, 2026, offering an extended viewing window for residents, students, and visitors to engage with the material. The installation is designed for reflective viewing, encouraging audiences to move through the space at their own pace and consider how a single commercial corridor can reflect broader themes of disruption, endurance, and recovery across Atlantic City.

Summer Panzanella

INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups ripe heirloom tomatoes, chopped
- 1 large cucumber, sliced and lightly salted
- 2 cups crusty bread (day-old works best), torn into bite-size pieces
- 1/4 cup red onion, thinly sliced
- Fresh basil, torn
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp red wine vinegar
- Salt + black pepper
- *Optional: fresh mozzarella or feta*



DIRECTIONS

Toss tomatoes, cucumbers, and onion in a large bowl with olive oil, vinegar, salt, and pepper. Add the bread and gently mix so it absorbs the juices without getting mushy. Fold in basil and cheese if using. Let it sit 10–15 minutes before serving so everything softens and blends. It's bright, juicy, and basically tastes like peak summer in a bowl.

Blueberry Basil Refresher

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 6-8 basil leaves
- 1-2 Tbsp honey or simple syrup (to taste)
- Juice of 1 lemon
- Sparkling water (or club soda)
- Ice




DIRECTIONS

Muddle blueberries, basil, and honey in a glass or pitcher until juicy and fragrant. Add lemon juice and stir. Fill glasses with ice, pour mixture halfway, then top with sparkling water. Lightly stir and garnish with extra blueberries or a basil leaf. It's refreshing without being sugary, and the basil gives it a subtle twist that feels a little more elevated than your standard berry spritzer.

The Fourth of July unites Americans every July 4 to commemorate the nation's birth and Independence Day. This federal holiday is a time for backyard barbecues, community parades, and spectacular fireworks displays. Gather your loved ones, fly the flag, and immerse yourself in the spirit of freedom and unity.

History of Fourth of July

Although most of us already had this history lesson in school, we probably weren't really paying attention as the clock ticked closer to recess or the end of the day. But we can't fully appreciate our freedoms if we don't know how we got them - and, more importantly, how close we came to losing them. The story of America's independence is truly fascinating with more historical twists and turns than we can possibly get into here. But at least we can get you started with the basics.

In the 1700s, America wasn't really a nation of 'united states.' Instead, there were 13 colonies with distinct personalities. From 1763 to 1773, Britain's King George III increasingly placed pressure on the colonies as he and the British Parliament enacted a succession of draconian taxes and laws on them. Excessive taxes on British luxury goods like tea and sugar were designed to benefit the British crown without any regard for the hardships of the colonists. By 1764, the phrase "Taxation without representation is tyranny" spread throughout the colonies as the rallying cry of outrage.

The more the colonists rebelled, the more King George doubled down with force. Imagine if enemy soldiers not only had the right to enter your home but the soldiers could demand that you feed and house them. The Quartering Act of 1765 allowed British soldiers to do just that.

But the Stamp Act of 1765 became the straw that broke the colonists' backs. Passed by Parliament in March, this act taxed any piece of printed paper, including newspapers, legal documents, ships' papers - and even playing cards! As the colonial grumbling got louder and bolder, in the fall of 1768, British ships arrived in Boston Harbor as a show of force. Remember, the British Navy dominated the seas all over the world due to the far-reaching presence of the British Empire.

Tensions boiled over on March 5, 1770, in Boston Harbor during a street fight between a group of colonists and British soldiers. The soldiers fired shots that killed 47-year-old Crispus Attucks, the first American and Black man to die along with three other colonists in the Boston Massacre.

In 1773, the Boston Tea Party (from which today's Tea Party Republicans get their name) erupted when colonists disguised as Mohican Indians raided a British ship, dumping all the tea overboard to avoid paying the taxes. Continued pressure led to resistance and the start of the Revolutionary War in the towns of Lexington and Concord when a militia of patriots battled British soldiers on April 19, 1775. Conditions were ripe for American independence.

When the first battles in the Revolutionary War broke out in April 1775, only a handful of colonists wished for total independence from Great Britain, and those who did were considered extremists.

However, halfway through the following year, many more colonists had come to lean more toward independence, as a result of growing hostility towards Britain and the spread of revolutionary views like those conveyed in the bestselling pamphlet published in early 1776 by Thomas Paine — "Common Sense."

On June 7, 1776, the Continental Congress met at the Pennsylvania State House (later Independence Hall) in Philadelphia and Richard Henry Lee, the Virginia delegate, introduced a motion calling for the independence of the colonies. Amid heated debate, Congress rescheduled the vote on Lee's resolution but appointed a five-man committee - including Thomas Jefferson of Virginia, John Adams of Massachusetts, Roger Sherman of Connecticut, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania, and Robert R. Livingston of New York - to draft a formal statement justifying the defect from Great Britain.

On July 2, 1776, in a virtually unanimous vote, the Continental Congress voted in favor of Lee's resolution for independence, and on July 4th, it formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Jefferson. Ultimately, the drafting of the Declaration of Independence was a contentious process. After much debate over what to include and what to leave out, Thomas Jefferson, tasked with pulling the document together, envisioned a nation where "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of happiness" crystallized the very meaning of being an American. The document proclaimed the 13 American colonies' liberation from Britain and reaffirmed their rights as free men - declaring that they were no longer subject (and subordinate) to the monarch of Britain, King George III, and were now united, free, and independent states.

John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail that July 2 "will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival" and that the celebration should include "Pomp and Parade... Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other."

By an extraordinary coincidence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, the only two signatories of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as presidents of the United States, both died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signatory of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as president, also died on July 4, 1831, making him the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. The only U.S. president to have been born on Independence Day was Calvin Coolidge, who was born on July 4, 1872.

5 Fascinating Facts About The Declaration Of Independence

- 1 - John Adams refused July 4 - Because the actual vote for independence took place on July 2, 1776, John Adams refused to recognize celebrations for July 4.
- 2 - Technically... The Declaration of Independence was finalized on July 4, but most of the signers actually signed the document on August 2, 1776.
- 3 - Edits and revisions - There were a total of 86 edits made to the original draft written by Thomas Jefferson.
- 4 - Independence wasn't the only reason - The Declaration of Independence was penned down formally so that colonies seeking foreign allies could legally declare themselves free from the British.
- 5 - It's not a map, but... There isn't a treasure map as shown in the movie "National Treasure," but there is actually something written on the back of the Declaration of Independence - "Original Declaration of Independence dates 4th July 1776."

Why We Love Fourth of July

- It's the most delicious day of the summer - There are few days of the year that offer as much food variety as the Fourth of July. Steak? Check. Chicken wings? Yep. Fresh strawberry pie? Absolutely. Macaroni and cheese? You got it. No matter what you're craving, it's sure to be available on Independence Day.
- We're all in this together - Admit it, the Fourth of July makes you feel giddy. Maybe it's the parades, the BBQs, or, most likely, the fireworks. This is the one night of the year you can watch the sky light up, while surrounded by children laughing, dogs barking, and patriotic music playing.
- You can wear whatever you want - as long as it's red, white, and blue - That bandana you never get to wear? That decades-old T-shirt with an American flag on it? Those are all fair game on Independence Day - as long as they're red, white, and blue.

America Turns 250: The Shore's Revolutionary Story

A Coastal Front Line

At the time of the Revolution, the map looked different than it does today. Atlantic County did not yet exist as its own county and was still part of Old Gloucester County. But the geography of the region mattered greatly. Its rivers, bays, inlets and barrier beaches created a coastal front line where American privateers could strike British ships, hide supplies and move goods toward the Continental Army.

Privateering became one of the Shore's most important wartime contributions. These were civilian-owned vessels authorized by government-issued Letters of Marque to capture enemy ships. To the Patriots, privateers were a valuable tool in the war effort. To the British, they were a major threat. Southern New Jersey's maze of waterways helped these vessels slip in and out, disrupting British supply lines and bringing captured goods into local ports.

Cape May became known for its sea captains and privateering activity. Despite its small colonial population, the area produced an impressive number of privateers, captains and crews. British frustration grew as ships and cargoes were taken along the coast, turning the southern Shore into a thorn in the side of the British war effort.

Turtle Gut: A Shoreline Victory

One of the earliest and most dramatic local stories happened just days before the Declaration of Independence was adopted. On June 29, 1776, the American brigantine Nancy was carrying desperately needed gunpowder from the Caribbean toward Philadelphia when British warships cornered it near Turtle Gut Inlet, off what is now Wildwood Crest. Local sailors and American vessels came to help, running the Nancy aground and unloading the valuable gunpowder under heavy fire.

The mission succeeded, but not without sacrifice. Lt. Richard Wickes was killed, becoming the first American casualty of the war in New Jersey. Before the British could claim the vessel, the Nancy was set ablaze and exploded, denying the enemy its prize. The Battle of Turtle Gut Inlet remains the only Revolutionary War battle fought on Cape May soil and an important early victory for American naval forces.



Chestnut Neck and Little Egg Harbor

Farther up the coast, Chestnut Neck became another key Revolutionary site. Located along the Mullica River near present-day Port Republic, Chestnut Neck was a haven for privateers and a place where captured British goods could be brought ashore. From there, supplies could move inland by boat and wagon, helping support American forces, including Washington's army.

That activity made Chestnut Neck a target. On October 6, 1778, British forces under Captain Patrick Ferguson raided the settlement in an effort to shut down the privateering base. Local militia and residents, outnumbered and warned of the attack, evacuated much of the town. The British stripped and burned buildings, destroyed supplies and tried to break the network that had been frustrating British shipping.

The danger did not end there. Days later, British and Loyalist forces launched a surprise night attack against troops from General Casimir Pulaski's Legion near Little Egg Harbor. The assault became known as the Little Egg Harbor Massacre. Many Patriot soldiers were killed as they slept, a brutal reminder that the Revolution in South Jersey was not just a matter of ships and supplies, but of lives lost close to home.

Supplies, Saltworks and the Pine Barrens

The waterways were only part of the story. The Pine Barrens offered cover for supplies and movement. Local farms helped feed families and troops. Saltworks along the coast produced a crucial resource used to preserve meat and support the army. Batsto Iron Works, located deep in the Pinelands, manufactured items such as munitions, cannonballs and camp equipment for the American cause. British forces wanted to destroy Batsto, but shallow waters, difficult terrain and Patriot defense made that goal nearly impossible.

These stories show how important the Shore was during the Revolution. The fight for independence was not only taking place in famous locations like Trenton, Princeton or Valley Forge. It was also unfolding along tidal rivers, hidden inlets, salt marshes, pine forests and small coastal villages where ordinary people helped keep the Patriot cause alive.

More Than Fireworks

The Fourth of July has always been about celebration, but the 250th anniversary invites families to look a little deeper. Fireworks, parades, cookouts, concerts and red-white-and-blue traditions are still part of the fun. They are also reminders of something larger: a country built over generations by people whose stories were courageous, complicated, imperfect and still unfolding.

For children, America's 250th is a chance to connect history to real places. A parade down a familiar street, a flag ceremony at a local park, a museum visit, a lighthouse climb, a historic marker or a conversation with an older relative can make the past feel less distant. History is not only something in a textbook. It is in the towns we live in, the roads we travel, the water we cross and the traditions families keep alive.

Celebrating Close to Home

Across the Shore, communities are marking America's 250th in their own ways. Some towns are planning parades, fireworks, concerts, bike parades and family festivals. Others are offering museum programs, history talks, patriotic ceremonies, exhibits, children's activities, veteran and first responder recognition, food trucks, music and community gatherings.

Rather than one single celebration, the 250th is becoming a full summer of local pride. From barrier islands to mainland towns, residents and visitors will have plenty of ways to take part. Check with your municipality, local chamber, historical society, library, museum or event calendar to see what is happening near you.

The important thing is to participate in a way that feels meaningful. Bring the kids to a local event. Visit a historical site. Read the Declaration of Independence. Ask a grandparent about the Fourth of July traditions they remember. Thank someone who serves the community. Fly the flag. Support a local celebration. Spend the day with neighbors.

Two hundred and fifty years after the Declaration of Independence, America's story is still being written. This summer, from the Mullica River to Cape May Point and every Shore town in between, the celebration is about more than one day of fireworks. It is about remembering where we started, honoring the generations who carried the country forward and enjoying the freedoms that make a summer at the Shore feel so meaningful.

America is turning 250, and here in South Jersey, there are countless ways to celebrate - with history, with family, with community and, of course, with a little sand between your toes.

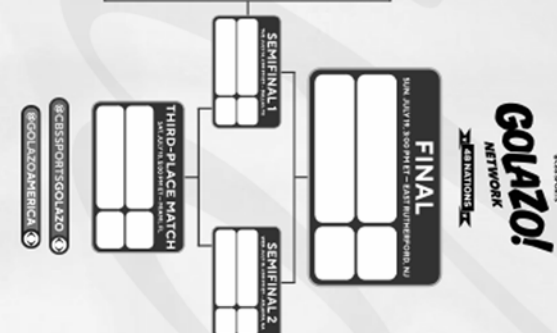
