YOGA POSE OF THE WEEK -Cobra Pose (Bhujangasana)

In flow yoga, Cobra is done multiple times per class as part of the vinyasa sequence of yoga poses. While a full cobra with straight arms offers a deeper backbend, you'll build more back strength by doing low Cobras in which you lift your chest without pressing into your hands.

Root into your feet, lengthen through the crown of the head and broaden through the collar-bones as you lift the sternum. It's also key to anchor your pelvis to the floor before you lift.

National Brownie Day – December 8, 2025



National Brownie Day is on December 8. Every year brownie lovers come from far and wide to celebrate National Brownie Day. Warm, chewy, and rich, a nice chocolate (or blondie) brownie is the perfect dessert to end your night with. Indulge in gooey goodness and let the real world melt away with you for a delectable moment.

History of National Brownie Day

Legend has it that the creation of brownies hales from the Palmer House Hotel in 1893. Bertha Palmer, a prominent Chicago socialite whose husband owed the hotel, asked a pastry chef for a dessert suitable for ladies attending the Chicago World's Columbian Exposition. She requested a cake-like delicacy small enough to be included in boxed lunches. The result was the Palmer House Brownie with walnuts and an apricot glaze. The modern Palmer House Hotel serves a dessert to patrons made from the same recipe. The name was given to the dessert sometime after 1893, but was not used by cook books or journals at the time.

By 1907 the brownie was well established in a recognizable form, appearing in Lowney's Cook Book by Maria Willet Howard as an adaptation of the Boston Cooking School recipe for a "Bangor Brownie". It added an extra egg and an additional square of chocolate, creating a richer dessert. The name "Bangor Brownie" derives from the town of Bangor, Maine, which legend states was the hometown of a housewife who created the original brownie recipe. Maine food educator and columnist Mildred Brown Schrumpf was the predominant proponent of the theory that brownies were invented in Bangor. While "The Oxford Companion to American Food and Drink" refuted Schrumpf's premise that "Bangor housewives" created the brownie, "The Oxford Encyclopedia of Food and Drink in America" said it had discovered evidence to support Schrumpf's claim, in the form of several 1904 cookbooks that included a recipe for "Bangor Brownies."

Local Spin: Shore Bakers Go All-In for National Brownie Day

December 8 is National Brownie Day, and Atlantic County is ready to celebrate the right way: rich, gooey, and zero apologies.

Locals already know the move: grab the dark chocolate chip brownie with Oreo cookie baked on top from Sasscer's Cheesecakes in Ventnor City (307 N Dorset Ave, \$4 each), or swing by Christine's Italian Pastry Shoppe in Northfield (330 Tilton Road) and order a custom gluten-free brownie tray that's every bit as fudgy as the classic version (just call 48 hours ahead).

Want to switch it up at home? Try one of these three easy twists:


Brownie Hot Chocolate Float - Pour 8–10 oz steaming hot chocolate into a tall mug or heat-proof glass. Add one scoop of vanilla ice cream. Spear a warm brownie square on a long skewer or sturdy toothpick and balance it across the rim or stand it upright in the ice cream. Top with chocolate sauce. Serve with a spoon and straw.

Frozen Brownie Bites - Cut cooled brownies into 1-inch cubes and insert a tooth-pick into each piece. Place on a parchment-lined tray and freeze 30 minutes. Dip each cube halfway into melted dark chocolate, sprinkle with sea salt or crushed peppermint while still wet, then return to the freezer for another 15–20 minutes until firm.

One-Minute Espresso Brownie in a Mug - In a large microwave-safe mug (at least 12 oz), combine 4 Tbsp all-purpose flour, 4 Tbsp granulated sugar, 2 Tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder, and a pinch of salt. Whisk with a fork until no lumps remain. Add 2 Tbsp milk, 2 Tbsp neutral oil, ¼ tsp vanilla extract, and 1–2 Tbsp strong brewed coffee or espresso. Stir until completely smooth. Microwave 60–75 seconds (70 seconds in a 1000W microwave is usually perfect). Let cool 30 seconds, then top with whipped cream or a scoop of ice cream and eat straight from the mug.

However you slice it (or sip it, or freeze it), National Brownie Day is Atlantic County's unofficial start to holiday indulgence season. Go get your chocolate fix. You've earned it.



Fishing in Atlantic County

Any angler 16 and older must have a valid license to fish the fresh waters of New Jersey. This includes privately owned lakes and other waters. For more information visit the NJ DEP Division of Fish and Wildlife Fishing License Information website at dep.nj.gov/njf-w/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/. Remember that all saltwater anglers 16 and older must register with the state. Go to NJ Saltwater Recreational Registry Program for registration information at dep.nj.gov/saltwaterregistry/.

SALTWATER FISHING

Atlantic City - Gardner's Basin Marina, North New Hampshire Avenue and the bay, is home to charter boats, sightseeing and fishing cruises. For more information call (609) 348-2880. Fishing is permitted on the beaches, outside of guarded areas, and from the jetties. The seawall along Sunset Avenue is a popular area for crabbing or fishing from land in the back bay. A municipal boat launch (fee required) is located at Albany Avenue and Boulevard Avenue.



Ventnor/Ventnor Heights - The Ventnor City Fishing Pier is located at Cornwall Avenue and the Boardwalk. The fishing pier offers seasonal rates for fishing or sightseeing. For additional information, call the piermaster at (609) 823-7944. Along the back bay, a seawall the length of Winchester Avenue is perfect for the family to fish or crab from land. A free boat ramp is located on the bay on Dorset Avenue, where there is plenty of free parking. For more information call (609) 823-7900.

Margate - Amherst Avenue, between Decatur and Monroe avenues, is home to several marinas and bait and tackle shops, including small boat rentals. Within the marinas are dozens of charter boats available on a daily basis throughout the summer and shoulder seasons. For more information on charters call Capt. Andy's at (609) 822-0916, or for a family outing on a pontoon rental boat call Ray Scott's Dock at (609) 822-6819. Surf fishing is permitted during non-guarded hours.

Somers Point - John F. Kennedy Park, located on Broadway, offers a boat ramp (fee required) granting access to Great Egg Harbor Bay. Another ramp (fee required) is located at Smith's Marina, 910 Bay Ave. Along the Bay Front Historic District on Bay Avenue there are several marinas which are home to many party and charter boats. There is also a crabbing and fishing pier located on the bay off New Jersey Avenue. Restrooms are located nearby.

Brigantine - Surf fishing is permitted on non-guarded beaches and at the seawall, Seventh Street north to 14th Street. The old Brigantine Bridge, across Absecon Inlet from Harrah's Marina, is used as a fishing pier. A public boat ramp (fee required) is located at Sixth and Bayshore avenues on the bay. For more information, call (609) 266-1122.

Leeds Point - Seasonal fishing and crabbing are permitted in designated areas of both the Brigantine and Barnegat Divisions of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. These areas include saltwater fishing (from land) at the following locations: Gravelling Point, Little Beach (with permit), Parkertown Dock Road, Cedar Run Dock Road, and Stafford Avenue. Boats may be launched at the Brigantine Division's Scotts Landing boat ramp, located at the end of Scotts Landing Road, off Moss Mill Road at Leeds Point. Freshwater fishing is permitted on Lily Lake in Oceanville. For more information call (609) 652-1665.

FRESHWATER FISHING

Lake Lenape Park - Lake Lenape Park East and Lake Lenape Park West are located in Hamilton Township and together encompass nearly 2,000 acres of land. Each park offers a variety of activities and facilities for residents and visitors to enjoy with its own entrance and access points. Boating is allowed on the lake with proper permits as required. All boaters must comply with state regulations and laws. No personal watercraft are permitted. For information on obtaining a boating permit and the associated fees contact the Lake Lenape Park office at (609) 625-8219.

Lake Lenape Park East - 753 Park Road, Mays Landing. This park is located on the eastern side of Lake Lenape and offers the most scenic views of the lake. Recently completed renovations include a new fishing pier, pickle ball courts, additional pavilions, landscaping enhancements and ADA accessibility improvements. The refurbished catering hall, Lakeside Manor, is a unique and picturesque lakefront venue that is available for special events and weddings for more than 250 guests. Lake Lenape Amenities: Fishing, Softball, Pickle Ball, Playground, Picnic Tables, Pavilions, Catering Hall, Historic Lighthouse, Restrooms, Convenient Parking.

Lake Lenape Park West - This park is located on the western side of Lake Lenape (note that some land on the eastern side and the entire lake surface is controlled by the county). The park entrance is located at 6303 Harding Highway in Mays Landing and encompasses nearly two-thousand acres of land, all the way up to the Black Horse Pike (Route 322). Things to Do at Lake Lenape West: Mountain Biking, Boathouse, Boating Access, Boat Ramp, Camping, Kayak/Canoe Access, Cross-county Skiing, Fishing, Gazebo (reservations required and may be made online or in person), Hiking, Unimproved Trails, Hunting, Nature Trails, Playground, Picnic Tables, Scenic Views, Playground. Call the reservation office at 609-625-8219 for more information.





Atlantic County High School Football: Post-Thanksgiving Glow: County Claims a State Crown, Rivalry Endures in Defeat

As the holiday leftovers settle, Atlantic County high school football savors a historic triumph and a cherished tradition's bittersweet close. Cedar Creek stormed MetLife Stadium to hoist the program's first Group 3 state championship trophy, capping a dream run that turned underdogs into kings. Holy Spirit, meanwhile, fell in the 97th edition of the Thanksgiving Day classic against Atlantic City, closing a resilient season on a note of pride amid the rivalry's unbreakable pull.

Cedar Creek: Pirates Plunder a State Title in Dominant Fashion

Cedar Creek's fairy-tale postseason reached its pinnacle with a resounding 34-7 demolition of previously unbeaten Old Tappan in the Group 3 state final at MetLife Stadium on November 28, etching the Pirates' name into New Jersey football lore for the first time.



The ground game - Cedar Creek's signature weapon - erupted for explosive gains, with sophomore Aamir Dunbar bulldozing 117 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries, while junior Jamir Campfield ignited the third quarter with a 52-yard scoring burst. Quarterback Frenchmon Bethea orchestrated the rout with poise, adding 47 rushing yards and a touchdown on the ground, 55 passing yards through the air, and a pick-six on defense to seal the early momentum. A momentum-seizing 84-yard kickoff return touchdown by Gyan King off the opening second-half kickoff ballooned the lead to 20-0, leaving the Golden Knights' vaunted 18-game win streak in ruins after three interceptions from QB Zach Miceli.

Finishing at 12-1, Cedar Creek's championship haul - complete with 313 total yards and 16 first downs - marks the program's deepest playoff dive since a 2021 regional crown. From Egg Harbor City to the Shore, the Pirates' blue-collar grit and explosive November surge (four straight wins by double digits) have galvanized a community, proving that South Jersey heart can topple North Jersey dynasties.











Thanksgiving Spotlight: 97 Years Strong and Still Electric

While most of New Jersey has let go of Thanksgiving football, Atlantic County refuses. The oldest holiday rivalry in the county - dating to 1926 - delivered its 97th chapter at 10 a.m. on Thanksgiving at Dr. Jack Eisenstein Stadium, and the Shore showed up in full force.

Atlantic City (10-2) rode sophomore quarterback Marvin Burroughs Jr. to a 37-14 victory that gave the Vikings double-digit wins for only the second time in program history and a share of the West Jersey Football League Constitution Division title with Cedar Creek. Burroughs was electric, going 9-of-13 for 219 yards and three touchdowns: a 54-yard laser to junior Vish Turner, a 30-yard strike to sophomore Don'Taye Thompson, and a 99-yard bomb to senior Jalen Day - one of the longest plays in the rivalry's near-century history. Seniors Sirr Luckey, Tamir Rex, and Kyree Barksdale locked down the line, while Ah'mad Chambers added two two-point conversions. Burroughs' performance earned him the inaugural Frank Campo MVP Award, honoring the late Atlantic City AD.

Holy Spirit (7-5) answered every time the Vikings pulled away. Senior quarterback Ty Costabile went 12-of-30 for 216 yards and hit Taylor Cartwright on a deep touchdown that briefly cut the gap. The Spartans' upperclass skill group - led by Cartwright, Jahmir Smith, and a relentless defensive front - kept the game competitive well into the third quarter, forcing two early punts and stuffing Atlantic City on a fourth-and-short deep in their own territory. The 37-14 final snapped Holy Spirit's seven-game Thanksgiving winning streak and tilted the all-time series to 53-40-4, but the fight reminded everyone why the rivalry still packs the stands.

The morning had everything the tradition promises: packed bleachers filled with generations of alumni, split-family loyalties, tailgates stretching down Atlantic Avenue, and stories swapped about games once played at Bader Field and inside Boardwalk Hall. Win or lose, the 97th chapter belonged to the county - a living postcard of why this game, one of the last of its kind in New Jersey, still matters so much.

The Wrap

Post-Thanksgiving, Atlantic County exhales with a state banner waving high and a rivalry's fire banked but unquenched. Cedar Creek's MetLife magic crowns a season of surges, Atlantic City's holiday heroics vault them toward WJFL co-champs with the Pirates, and the timeless clash proves defeat can't dim determination. From championship parades in Egg Harbor City to quiet gym reflections in Absecon, this week's echoes remind why Shore football lingers in the soulbecause here, triumphs are collective, traditions timeless, and the cold air carries the weight of what it means to play for more than just the win. As December dawns, the county's gridiron glow proves: history doesn't just happen - it rallies everyone home.

Spreading Holiday Magic: 40+ Years of Joy with Atlantic County Toys for Kids Program

For over four decades, the Atlantic County Toys for Kids Program (ACTFK) has been a beacon of holiday cheer, turning community generosity into smiles for thousands of children, seniors, and families facing hardship. Founded in the 1980s by a local sergeant to support injured officers and their loved ones during the holidays, the all-volunteer initiative has evolved into a year-round force for good, partnering with first responders, businesses, and municipalities to ensure no kid in Atlantic County wakes up without a gift. As December unfolds, ACTFK ramps up its signature efforts, blending logistics, logistics, and heart to deliver on its promise: Toys collected here stay here, spreading joy without borders.

The program's magic shines brightest in the holidays, but its impact ripples through the calendar. Volunteers like 30-year veteran Michelle Riordan orchestrate everything from toy sorting by age and interest to safe Santa escorts by local police departments. Last season, they distributed over 14,000 new, unwrapped toys - visiting hospitals, nursing homes, and homes to light up faces amid tough times. "Watching a child's eyes sparkle when Santa arrives is the best part," Riordan says. First responders play a pivotal role, identifying families in need and providing secure deliveries, while year-round events like trunk-or-treats, National Night Out, Shop with a Cop, and summer Shore cruises keep the spirit alive. Partnerships with groups like the Hispanic Alliance for Three Kings Celebrations, Gilda's Club, and the Atlantic City Rescue Mission extend support beyond December, fostering community ties from tree lightings to wildlife outings.

This December, ACTFK's calendar pulses with giving opportunities, culminating in their marquee events that blend fundraising, fun, and direct impact. Kicking off the month is the O'Donnell Park Tree Lighting on Friday, December 5, in Atlantic City - a free family affair with carols, hot cocoa, and a toy drop-off station to kickstart collections. Follow it with the Noyes Holiday Market and Gingerbread Village on Sunday, December 7, at the Noyes Arts Garage in Atlantic City (10 a.m.–4 p.m.), where shoppers can browse crafts, vote on gingerbread houses, and donate toys for a free parking voucher at the Wave Garage - perfect for stocking up on holiday magic while supporting the cause.

Mid-month heats up with the MBCA Mixer and Toy Drive on Monday, December 15, at the Byrdcage in Atlantic City (time TBD; check the website for updates), a networking happy hour hosted by the Margate Business Community Association that doubles as a casual collection point for new toys. It's a low-key way to mingle with locals, sip a drink, and contribute - expect raffles and holiday tunes to keep the vibe festive.



The party's peak arrives with the Annual Beef & Beer Fundraiser on Friday, December 19, at Maynard's Café (9306 Amherst Ave, Margate; 6–9 p.m.). Sponsored by Nacheen A. Khan of Garden State Fuel Deli & Mini Mart and Sysco Philadelphia, tickets are \$40 per person (including beef, beer, wine, soda, cash bar, and live music) - a savory night out that directly funds toy buys and logistics. Last year it packed the house; call Greg at 609-226-1560 or visit toysforkidsprogram.org to snag spots before they vanish.



The grand finale? Santa's Annual Toy Run on Saturday, December 21 - the program's crown jewel and a countywide spectacle that embodies its mission. Starting at 8 a.m. with a rally at the Atlantic County Justice Facility in Mays Landing, Santa hops aboard a fire truck-turned-sleigh, escorted by squad cars from every police department in the county. The convoy snakes through 200+miles, hitting key stops like Shore Medical Center in Somers Point (around 10 a.m., with Frosty and elves delivering bedside gifts to pediatric patients), AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center in Atlantic City (noon), and pop-up distributions in Egg Harbor City, Pleasantville, and beyond. Families preregister via the website's Toy Request Form (now closed for 2025, as November's deadline has passed - next cycle starts fall 2026), sharing kids' ages and wishes for a confidential match. On the day, thousands of toys get handed out on-site, with sirens signaling arrival like a holiday parade on wheels. It's not just deliveries; it's pure wonder - illness pauses for no one, and neither does joy.



While toy requests are wrapped for this season, donations keep flowing: Drop new, unwrapped gifts at over 50 bins countywide, from Absecon Police Department and Atlantic City PD to Ocean Casino Resort, Hard Rock Hotel & Casino, and everyday spots like Ace Hardware in Northfield or Tilton Market. Full list at toysforkidsprogram.org - Wawa stores and firehouses are hotspots too. Volunteers are still sought for wrapping parties (December 15–18 at the Northfield warehouse) and elf shifts; email actfkvolunteers@gmail.com to join.

In Atlantic County, where holidays can weigh heavy, ACTFK lifts the load with unyielding kindness. As Riordan notes, "It's about belief - that someone's got your back." With a goal of 15,000 toys for 2025, the invitation stands: Donate a toy, attend an event, or wave from your driveway. Visit toysforkidsprogram.org - because here, holiday spirit isn't seasonal; it's unbreakable.

Philly Sports Weekly: Eagles Reel, Sixers Heal, Flyers Roll

Philadelphia enters the first December week with a fragile grip on contention—wins feel fleeting, losses linger too long. The Eagles stumbled again on Black Friday, dropping two straight and fueling doubts about their NFC East hold. The Sixers clawed back with a gritty home win but still chase rhythm without full health. The Flyers kept rolling with back-to-back triumphs, yet the Metropolitan grind tests their depth. The Union, after a valiant playoff push, bow out early once more, leaving Subaru Park to dream of next spring. As winter bites, Philly's squads confront a simple truth: potential only pays if you protect it.

Eagles: Back-to-Back Losses Expose Cracks in the Armor

The Eagles' mini-bye couldn't come soon enough after a 24-15 Black Friday thud to the Bears at home, their second straight defeat that drops them to 8-4 and tightens the NFC East race. Jalen Hurts managed 198 passing yards and a rushing score, but the offense sputtered without Saquon Barkley's usual pop (just 52 yards on 14 carries), and the line allowed three sacks that stalled third downs. AJ. Brown hauled in seven catches for 104 yards, yet the unit punted five times and settled for a missed 48-yarder from Jake Elliott.

Defensively, Vic Fangio's crew bent under Caleb Williams, who carved up 245 yards and two touchdowns before a late interception sealed the damage. Penalties - nine for 85 yards - compounded the chaos, echoing Dallas woes and prompting questions about discipline under Nick Sirianni. Injuries linger too: Reed Blankenship's status clouds the secondary ahead of Monday Night Football.

Now clinging to a one-game division lead, Philadelphia flies west for a pivotal clash with the Chargers on December 8. A win in L.A. could reset the narrative; anything less invites the Giants and Cowboys to pounce. This road test isn't just about points - it's about proving the skid is survivable.

Sixers: Maxey Keeps Them Afloat, But Big Three Still Searching

The Sixers went 2-1 over a demanding three-game stretch, closing November with a gritty 115-103 road win in Brooklyn behind Tyrese Maxey's 22 points and seven assists, Jared McCain's 20 off the bench, and Quentin Grimes' 18 with stifling defense. Sunday's 142-134 double-overtime collapse against Atlanta stung (Maxey's career-high 44 wasted when Embiid fouled out and the defense surrendered 68 paint points), but Tuesday's 121-102 demolition of the Wizards - Maxey dropping 35, Drummond cleaning the glass with a quick double-double - pushed them to 11-9 and bought some breathing room.

The same story persists: Embiid is still load-managed and limited to 30-ish minutes, Paul George remains rusty (16 points on 6-of-15 in the Hawks loss), and the defense sits 18th league-wide. Maxey is carrying the offense on his back, but the turnovers and second-chance points that killed them Sunday highlight how thin the margin is when the stars aren't fully synced.

Now 8th in the East, the Sixers head into a crucial homestand - Golden State Thursday, Milwaukee Friday - where Embiid and George need to string together healthy, productive minutes. Win both and the early-season turbulence starts to feel like a distant memory. Split or worse, and the "when healthy" excuses will echo louder than ever.

Flyers: Momentum Builds, But Depth Will Decide

The Flyers extended their hot streak to three wins with a 5-3 Saturday rout of the Devils, vaulting to 14-7-3 and third in the Metro, but John Tortorella preaches caution amid the early-season fireworks. Owen Tippett's two

goals and assist paced the attack, his wrister from the slot tying a game the Flyers seized with a three-goal second period. Travis Konecny chipped in a tally and helper, while Matvei Michkov dazzled with a no-look feed that set up Noah Cates' redirect - Philly's power play clicking at 28% for the month. Samuel Ersson stopped 28 of 31 in net, his rebound control key in a chippy rivalry tilt.

Still, the backend creaks: three goals against exposed zone exits, and the penalty kill dipped to 82% after killing just four of six. At 7th in the East, Philadelphia's 2.1 goals-per-game average flatters a blue line missing grit without Jamie Drysdale's full return. The forecheck hums, but sustaining it against speed teams remains the riddle.


Home cooking continues with Buffalo on Wednesday and Colorado Sunday - winnable spots to pad the wild-card buffer before a brutal December road swing. Bottle this energy, and the Flyers contend; leak it, and the pack closes fast.

Union: Playoff Heartbreak, But Foundation Stands Firm

The Union's dream 2025 dissolved in penalty-kick agony, falling 1-0 to New York City FC in the Eastern Conference Semifinal after a 2-0 series sweep in Round One - capping a Supporters' Shield triumph with another postseason thud that sends them to an early offseason at 20-6-8. Tai Baribo's brace carried them through the quarters against Chicago, his header off a Daniel Gazdag corner forcing extras, but NYCFC's lone strike in the semis shattered Subaru Park's hopes. The defense, MLS-best at 0.9 goals conceded per game, held firm until extra-time fatigue bit.

For a club that topped the East by 10 points, the run - deepest since 2022-leaves silver linings: Baribo's 18 goals, Andre Blake's wall-like form, and a midfield trio that dictated 58% possession. Yet converting dominance to silverware eludes them, with three straight conference semifinal exits fueling whispers of mentality tweaks under Jim Curtin.

Offseason looms with extension talks for key pieces and eyes on January signings. The Shield's prestige endures, but Philly craves a Cup - 2026's reset starts now, with lessons etched in blue-line scars.



Looking Ahead: December's Defining Turn

Philly sports crests into December on a knife's edge - Eagles chasing redemption on prime time, Sixers hunting health at home, Flyers forging fire in familiar confines. The Union reflect and reload, but the city's pulse quickens with every tip-off and snap. No more grace periods: This week tests resolve, where urgency forges champions or exposes the also-rans. The faithful fill the stands, but the scoreboard doesn't forgive.
